Describe the purpose of the organization: The African American Cultural Society, Inc. was established in 1991 to preserve and perpetuate the cultural heritage of the African Diaspora through educational, artistic, intellectual and social activities and services deemed to be in the best interest of the entire community. In doing so, the African American Cultural Society has often been recognized for its contributions in serving the community through its programs and events that perpetuate and embellish its mission.

Describe the purpose of the program being considered for funding: The "AACS Annual Cultural Arts Series" consists of programs that educate, enlighten, enrich and entertain the City of Palm Coast Community on the unique arts and history of the African American community and African Diaspora. The following programs are included and require Grant assistance: (Continued on separate attachment)

If awarded, describe how the City of Palm Coast's financial assistance will be used: The Grant will be spread across the three (3) programs in the following manner: Kwanzaa Program: Cost of materials, promotional materials and performer/facilitator fees. Youth Reality Program: Cost of materials (e.g. Stage Props, Costumes, Reference Sources, etc.), promotional materials and the Juneteenth Celebration: Cost of materials, facilitator fees, promotional materials. Explain why funding requested from the City is essential for development of the program: The AACS Operational Budget is not sufficient to provide full funding for the stated program requirements. Although we encourage donations and contributions, they fall short of enabling the AACS to sometimes present a full program of the event and at times we may have to defer the program for that year.

#### "CULTURAL ARTS SERIES" DESCRIPTION - 20013/2014

KWANZAA PROGRAM — offers the general public an opportunity to be informed on the history and cultural significance of this African American Holiday Season that celebrates family, community and culture. It is celebrated from December 26 thru January 1 and it takes its name from the first harvest celebrations of Africa. The seven days are highlighted by ceremonies depicting seven communitarian African values, commonly referred to as the "Seven Principles." Namely, <a href="Umoja">Umoja</a> (Unity), <a href="Kujichagulia">Kujichagulia</a> (Self-Determination), <a href="Ujima">Ujima</a> (Collective Work and Responsibility), <a href="Ujamaa">Ujamaa</a> (Cooperative Economics), <a href="Nia">Nia</a> (Purpose), <a href="Kuumba">Kuumba</a> (Creativity), and <a href="Imani">Imani</a> (Faith). Our program generally encompasses 2 days but includes the celebration of each of the seven principles. This takes place with the tenants of each principle being explained by speakers (in-house and guest performers) supplemented with appropriate props and exhibits. All of the events take place at the AACS Center on US#1, Palm Coast. (Public attendance is expected to be 150-175.) Planning is now underway to format this year's program. Budget requirements are attached.

YOUTH BLACK HISTORY REALITY PROGRAM — enables the youth of our community to study and reenact significant prominent African Americans and their contributions to American history in a theatrical program format. They dress in costume and use various props to highlight their presentation of that person. A lot of rehearsing and the time of AACS volunteers are required to prepare for this event. A guest performer may also be engaged to further enhance the program. This program is offered to the general public at the AACS Center, US#1, Palm Coast. It is generally held the third Sunday in February (Black History Month) from 4pm to 7pm and the program generally exceeds "capacity turnout" from the community (over 250). To see our youth extolling the virtues of various African American heroes they have been taught to know or being exposed to for the first time is very memorable to everyone. The youth are recruited from our schools, churches, clubs and AACS member families. Because of the size of the audience, a light fare is offered at the end for fellowship and cordiality. Budget requirements are attached.


JUNETEENTH PROGRAM – is an indoor/outdoor program at the AACS Center set in a festival style format to commemorate the ending of slavery in the United States. On June 19, 1865, the Union soldiers landed at Galveston, Texas with news that the war had ended and all slaves were now free, even though this was two and a half years after President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation. Our program includes interactive children activities as well as informational speakers on the occasion, music performances, exhibits, artifacts, artwork, books, and light food sales. The program is held over two days and attracts a sizable following from community patrons and members. (Public attendance is expected to be 150-200) "Juneteenth" has gained in popularity nationwide and is a program that must be featured as a National African American Historical event. Budget requirements are attached.

The Cultural Arts Programs held at the AACS Center are always open to the general public with no admission charge. Grant monies and donations, not operating funds, generally support these programs. It is also important to note that most of the African American and African Diaspora Cultural Programs presented by the AACS are the only venue in the Flagler County area to offer these presentations to the community.



To build our own businesses, control the economics of our own community and share in all its work and wealth."


Inherent in Ujamaa is the stress and obligation of generosity especially to the poor and vulnerable. In the Book of Ani, we are taught that generosity is its own reciprocal reward. "Small gifts return greater and what is replaced brings abundance". And in the Book of Ptah-Hotep we are taught "Be generous as long as you live. What goes into the storehouse should come out. For bread is made to be shared."

Moreover, Ptah-Hotep informs us. "Generosity is a memorial for those who show it. long after they have departed". This, of course, is the ancient African ethic of care and responsibility which informs the concepts of generosity and shared social wealth. Such an ethic is expressed in one of its earliest forms in the Book of Coming Forth By Day which defines the righteous on one level as one who has "given bread to the hungry, water to the thirsty, clothes to the naked and a boat to those without one"

Throughout the sacred teachings of ancient Egypt and Africa in general, the ethic of care and responsibility is expressed in the concept of shared social wealth and service to the most disadvantaged. This struggle is not simply to be generous to the poor and vulnerable but ultimately to end their poverty and vulnerability. For only in such a context will they be able to pursue the truly human without the limitation imposed by poverty, deprivation or the debilitating struggle for just life's basic necessities. To share wealth and work, then, is to share concern, care and responsibility for a new, more human and fulfilling future.





Funds raised at the show will go toward post-secondary education scholarships for students who have been involved in the show, which will be given in June.







# 'Juneteenth' commemorates end of slavery in United States

CORRESPONDENT

PALM COAST- In an era before smart phones and instant messaging, news traveled at its own pace. But that did not diminish the impact of a simple order, read to the people of Galveston, Texas, on June 16, 1865.

"The people are informed that, in accordance with a proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free. This involves an absolute equality of personal rights and rights of property, between former masters and slaves, and the connection heretofore existing between them, becomes that between employer and hired labor."

Thus began General Order 3, the official notification to the people of Galveston, by Major-General Gordon Granger about the abolition of slavery, more than two-and-a-half years after President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation on Jan. 1, 1863.

The day commemorating that event became known as Juneteenth and was first celebrated the following year.







#### African American Cultural Society Palm Coast, Florida

A visionary group of African-Americans founded and incorporated the African American Cultural Society (AACS) in October of 1991. AACS is one of the first community organizations in Flagler County established to preserve and perpetuate the cultural heritage and history of African-Americans and the African Diaspora through social, educational, artistic and intellectual activities.

#### **Accomplishments**

### African American Cultural Society Center Building

 Completion of the Center after 10 years of the AACS' existence. The purchase of five acres of land and the subsequent construction of the African American Cultural Society Center is an example of the utilization of the Seven Principles of Kwanzaa: Unity, Self-Determination, Collective Work and Responsibility, Cooperative Economics, Purpose, Creativity and Faith.

### **African Studies Group**

The goal of the African Studies Group is to emphasize and teach participants the importance of understanding African and African-American history. The group began in 1990, and their meetings are twice a month. Participants read books and discuss Africans in the Diaspora and African-American history. The discussions and study have contributed to the community's ever-growing wealth of information about Africans and the Diaspora. "Until the lions have their historians' tales of hunting, hunting will always glorify the hunter!"

- Provides lecturers for the Black Studies program at Bethune-Cookman University.
- Provides speakers and spearheads programs yearly for 20 years to celebrate Black History Month, Juneteenth, and Kwanzaa.
- Toured Kemet (Egypt) with Dr. Yosef ben Jochannan, a world-renowned African historian.
- Toured Brazil with a Brooklyn, New York, study group.
- · Toured Cuba with Dr. Alberto Jones.
- Toured Kingsley Plantation on Fort George Island and Atlantic Beach in Jacksonville.
- Attended the Gullah Festival at St. Helena Island in Georgia.
- Toured Alabama Civil Rights Museum Trail including the Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church, Birmingham Civil Rights Institute and walked over the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma, Alabama,

- Toured Washington, D.C. with an emphasis about the African influence on the establishment of the Nation's Capitol.
- Toured Princeville, NC, one of the oldest towns incorporated by Blacks in the U.S.
- Toured the Kingdom of Oyotunji African Village in Sheldon, South Carolina.
- Established an AACS research library with books, manuscripts, DVDs, and VCR tapes that are about, for, and by Africans and Africans in the Diaspora that are not generally available in bookstores.
- Viewed and discussed over 250 films for and about Black people, and of special interest to all people; the films are available in the AACS library.
- Collected museum-quality arts and artifacts from Africa and the African Diaspora.

### **The Ebony Society**

AACS launched the Ebony Society in 1991 at Flagler Palm Coast High School to encourage students of color to continue their education and to go to college. In addition, Black and civil rights history is taught.

- Established the Third-Eye Program to tutor students and provide educational development for children. The Third-Eye Program evolved into the Ebony Society.
- Sponsored 250 students who have completed the Ebony Society Program.
- The program operates at Flagler Palm Coast and Matanzas High Schools throughout the school year.
- Sponsor visits to local colleges, Florida colleges, Morehouse and Spelman Universities and South Carolina colleges.
- Instruct students on how to dress for various occasions, etiquette, and how to plan and run organizations.

#### The Educational Committee

The goal of the Educational Committee is to educate the community utilizing presentations, lectures, and group discussions about African and African-American contributions to world civilizations and our nation.

- Formed a partnership with the Flagler County School Board to present educational lectures, presentations, and discussions about African and African-American history to teachers and highschool and middle-school students.
- Formed partnerships with Daytona State College and Bethune-Cookman University to inform education majors about African and African-American history.
- Instrumental in the establishment of an African and African-American course of study at Flagler Palm Coast and Matanzas High Schools. The course was taught by members of the AACS for two years.
- Presented PowerPoint presentations to the public, teachers and students at the middle and high schools in Palm Coast about the contributions of Africans to world civilization.
- Produced a DVD titled "Project Griot
  "Memories of Segregation in Flagler
  County" in conjunction with the Flagler
  Palm Coast High School students and
  teachers, AACS and the Flagler County
  School Board. The DVD is available to
  high schools, the AACS, the Flagler
  County Public Library and the Flagler
  County Historical Society.

#### Describe the Purpose of the Organization

The Choral Arts Society was founded by, and is still directed by Cheryl Robinson. The Choral Arts Society has been in existence since 1999. We are a community organization open to all qualified musicians. The members are dedicated musicians who participate because of their love of choral music. They purchase their own music, and pay annual membership dues.

All concerts are held in St. Thomas Episcopal Church, and are open to the public, without charge (however a free will donation is requested). Donations, dues from members of the chorus, together with the Grant from the City of Palm Coast, are the organizations sole sources of revenue to keep the organization operating.

Our purpose is two-fold: 1) to enrich the cultural life of our residents, by bringing the best choral music to Palm Coast and the Flagler County area, and 2) to encourage the pursuit of music in our young people through annual scholarship. The Choral Arts Society provides \$500 annual scholarship to a college bound student to study music performance and/or education. At the present time we are providing one such scholarship to a Flagler County recipient.

#### Describe the purpose of the Program being considered for funding

The Choral Arts Society performs three concerts during the year, in May, July, and December. The concerts for fiscal 2013-2014 will be held on December 6 and December 8, 2013; an early May date (a Friday evening and Sunday afternoon); and July 4, 2014. The November concert ushers in the Christmas season; the May concert is a selection of Broadway stage pieces; and the July concert celebrates the holiday with patriotic favorites. As indicated, there are two performances of each concert, with the exception of the one performance on July 4<sup>th</sup>.

## If awarded, describe how the City of Palm Coast's Financial Assistance will be used:

The funds from the grant will be used to offset the cost of printing newsletters, programs, postage, advertising and promotion, and creation, enhancement, and maintenance of our web-site.

## Explain why funding requested from the City is essential for development of the program.

The financial assistance will help us to continue the necessary promotion of our group. The grant from the City of Palm Coast is a vital and integral element in helping us meet our expenses to continue to offer these wonderful cultural events for the City. It is even more vital now, as our free-will donations received (our only other significant source of revenue) has been negatively impacted by the economic slowdown.

The Mission of the Community Chorus of Palm Coast is to build a tradition of community pride through choral excellence, by providing performances that enrich, educate, and entertain audiences and singers.

The chorus (CCPC) sings a variety of musical styles, including Broadway, pop, folk, sacred, gospel and classical music. Founded in 2010, the Chorus currently has over 50 members from Palm Coast and the surrounding area. CCPC added Friday night performances to its schedule to attract a wider audience while alleviating parking problems. CCPC is beginning its fourth season with the first rehearsal October 1, 2013. Concert dates this year are Winter Concert, Friday, January 24 and Sunday, January 26 and Spring Concert, Friday, May 2 and Sunday, May 4, 2014. Approximately 1,000 people attended the performances last year. The concerts are offered free to the public. CCPC hopes to be able to continue this practice so anyone interested in attending will be able to do so. The audience is given the opportunity to make a donation to the chorus to support us if they wish. The concerts will be held at Trinity Presbyterian Church, Palm Coast.

The Musical Director, Linda Hodges, has an extensive background in music, with a degree in music education from Jacksonville University, and as a choral director, instrumentalist and piano and voice teacher for more than 25 years. The accompanist, Linda Oertel, received a degree in church music from Texas Christian University, Ft. Worth, Texas. After graduation, through a Fullbright Scholarship, she studied pipe organ in Copenhagen, Denmark. Linda Oertel worked as a pianist and organist for many years in addition to teaching both instruments.

The Chorus markets concerts in a variety of media to reach a wide range of people. Local newspaper advertisements, press releases, web sites, flyers, emails and direct mail are used to promote concerts. Several ads for each performance are placed in local newspapers and community weeklies. Public service announcements also are made on some local radio stations. Marketing staff send short articles about the concerts and brief listings for community events calendars to newspapers, community weeklies, TV stations, and local churches. Concert information also appears in eleven on-line calendars of events, such as the ones for the Chamber of Commerce, local communities, the county, newspapers and radio stations. #### Purpose of the Organization

The Flagler County Art League (FCAL) is dedicated to promoting a better understanding of the arts and to furthering the appreciation of the visual arts in Flagler County.

We are a 501(c)(3) non-profit arts organization that has been in existence since 1978 and has a long history of providing arts opportunities and education to the community through workshops, weekly classes, lectures, demonstrations, shows and exhibits and festivals.

#### **Program Description and Purpose**

#### A Celebration of the Arts in Palm Coast

This program was initiated in 2012 to make the Arts, both the actual artistic process and the general understanding and appreciation of the process and the works available to more people in the City of Palm Coast. This year, Spring 2014 (late March, April, and May) we propose a three part celebration:

- Addressing general understanding and appreciation would be two lectures by nationally known speakers free of charge to the general public. We propose holding them in public venues such as the Matanzas High school auditorium again this year and anticipate attendance of 200+.
- Addressing the actual artistic process we propose two different programs:
  - 1. A 'Hands On' workshop for children. This will be comprised of two different sessions defined by age group and limited to a maximum of 20 children per session. The program will be free and all supplies will be provided

2. A 'Hands On' opportunity to explore specific mediums and produce a 'work of art' for adults. The creative process is intimidating to many. We are proposing to break some boundaries, wipe away fear and expose those interested to the joy of making art. We are planning on two sessions which will be free with all supplies provided and limited to 50 adults.

The program is important to Palm Coast because the arts foster a sense of community, a sense of well being and the atmosphere conducive to a good and balanced life. A city where the arts flourish is appealing to business development, increased affluence and population growth. It is important that residents and visitors to Palm Coast appreciate that the city offers amenities found in larger metropolitan areas while avoiding the problems of those areas if the city is to continue to grow and develop.

#### Use of Financial Assistance, if Awarded

If the City of Palm Coast agrees with our vision for the community and awards the Flagler County Art League financial assistance for this program the funds will be used to (1) advertise and promote Palm Coast's Celebration of the Arts in a manner to reach the largest number of citizens possible, (2) Pay speakers and instructors and (3) provide session materials and supplies for quality presentations which are free to the general public.

#### City Funds are Essential for the Development of this Program

The Art League recognizes the need for free high quality programs for the community in general but is not yet in a financial position to provide them. The City garners appreciation and respect by supporting this type of program. It is our hope that as the Celebration grows from year to year, and people come to look forward to it, that it will generate sponsorships beyond the City's grant. We also hope that regardless of sponsorships, popularity and growth, the City will continue to be our long term partner in this venture providing access to the ARTS to all our citizens and enhancing Palm Coast's reputation as one of the best places to live.

This is in response to your letter and attachments dated December 15, 2002. We have updated our records accordingly.

Our records indicate that a determination letter issued in June 1993, granted your organization exemption from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. That latter is still in effect.

Based on information subsequently submitted, we classified your organization as one that is not a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because it is an organization described in section 509(a)(2).

This classification was based on the assumption that your organization's operations would continue as stated in the application. If your organization's sources of support, or its character, method of operations, or purposes have changed, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change on the exempt status and foundation status of your organization.

Your organization is required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, only if its gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000. If a return is required, it must be filed by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of the organization's annual accounting period. The law imposes a penalty of \$20 a day, up to a maximum of \$10,000, when a return is filed late, unless there is reasonable cause for the delay.

All exempt organizations (unless specifically excluded) are liable for taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) on remuneration of \$100 or more paid to each employee during a calendar year. Your organization is not liable for the tax imposed under the Federal Unemployment Tex Act (FUTA).

Organizations that are not private foundations are not subject to the excise taxes under Chapter 42 of the Code. However, these organizations are not automatically exempt from other federal excise taxes.

Donors may deduct contributions to your organization as provided in section 170 of the Code. 
The show opened with a performance by blues and jazz artist Linda Cole, and local restaurants and retailers sold their As Wharton played, the audience clapped and danced.


Anastasio describes his style as an exploration of both spirituality and the hu-

# 10 Reasons to Support the Arts

1. **True prosperity** . . . The arts are fundamental to our humanity. They ennoble and inspire us—fostering creativity, goodness, and beauty. They help us express our values, build bridges between cultures, and bring us together regardless of ethnicity, religion, or age. When times are tough, the arts are salve for the ache.

2. **Improved academic performance** . . Students with an education rich in the arts have higher GPAs and standardized test scores, lower drop-out rates, and even better attitudes about community service— benefits reaped by students regardless of socio-economic status. Students with four years of arts or music in high school average 100 points better

on their SAT scores than students with one-half year or less.

3. **Arts are an Industry** ... Arts organizations are responsible businesses, employers, and consumers. Nonprofit arts organizations generate \$166 billion in economic activity annually, supporting 5.7 million jobs and generating nearly \$30 billion in government revenue. Investment in the arts supports jobs, generates tax revenues, and advances our creativity-based economy.

- 4. **Arts are good for local merchants** . . . The typical arts attendee spends \$27.79 per person, per event, not including the cost of admission on items such as meals, parking, and babysitters. Non-local arts audiences (who live outside the county) spend nearly twice as much as local arts attendees (\$40.19 vs. \$19.53)— valuable revenue for local businesses and the community.
- 5. **Arts are the cornerstone of tourism.** Arts travelers are ideal tourists—they stay longer and spend more. The U.S. Department of Commerce reports that the percentage of international travelers including museum visits on their trip has grown annually since 2003 (17 to 24 percent), while the share attending concerts and theater performances increased five of the past seven years (13 to 17 percent since 2003).
- 6. **Arts are an export industry** . . . U.S. exports of arts goods (e.g., movies, paintings, jewelry) grew to \$64 billion in 2010. With U.S. imports at just \$23 billion, the arts achieved a \$41 billion trade surplus in 2010.
- 7. **Building the 21st Century workforce** . . .Reports by the Conference Board show creativity is among the top 5 applied skills sought by business leaders with 72 percent saying creativity is of high importance when hiring. The biggest creativity indicator? A college arts degree. Their Ready to Innovate report concludes, "...the arts music, creative writing, drawing, dance provide skills sought by employers of the 3rd millennium."
- 8. **Healthcare** . . . Nearly one half of the nation's healthcare institutions provide arts programming for patients, families, and even staff. 78 percent deliver these programs because of their healing benefits to patients shorter hospital stays, better pain management, and less medication.
- 9. **Stronger communities** . . . University of Pennsylvania researchers have demonstrated that a high concentration of the arts in a city leads to higher civic engagement, more social cohesion, higher child welfare, and lower poverty rates. A vibrant arts community ensures that young people are not left to be raised solely in a pop culture and tabloid marketplace.
- 10. **Creative Industries**. The Creative Industries are arts businesses that range from non- profit museums, symphonies, and theaters to for profit film, architecture, and advertising companies. An analysis of Dun & Bradstreet data counts 904,581 businesses in the U.S. involved in the creation or distribution of the arts that employ 3.3 million people representing 4.25 percent of all businesses and 2.15 percent of all employees, respectively.


### Where is PCAF?





We have further determined that you and the affiliated religious organizations you operate, supervise, or control, and which are covered by your notification to us, are not private foundations within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code, because you and your affiliated religious organizations are organizations described in sections 170(b)(1)(A)(i) and 509(a)(1) of the Code.

Organizations that are not private foundations are not subject to the excise taxes under Chapter 42 of the Code. However, they are not automatically exempt from other Federal excise taxes.
