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## Florida's August Employment Figures Released

**TALLAHASSEE** – Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for August 2010 is 11.7 percent. This represents 1,084,000 jobless out of a labor force of 9,229,000. The unemployment rate is 0.2 percentage point higher than the July rate of 11.5 percent.

Florida's total nonagricultural employment in August 2010 is 7,227,900, representing a decline of 16,000 jobs (-0.2 percent) over the month. However, Florida's annual job growth rate is up 0.4 percent, representing an increase of 29,800 jobs from August 2009. It is the second consecutive month the state is showing positive over-the-year job growth after losing jobs for three years. Nationally, the number of jobs is up 0.2 percent over the year.

"Although Florida's unemployment rate has slightly increased, there are still positive indicators of recovery. This is the second consecutive month with an increase in the number of jobs from the previous year," said AWI Director Cynthia R. Lorenzo. "Historically, mixed signals from economic indicators during the bottom of a recession are common until the economy recovers. Fluctuations in rates of unemployment and job growth are typical examples. We stand ready to assist all job seekers with a wide array of job placement and job matching services available through the state's 92 One-Stop Career Centers and online at [www.employflorida.com](http://www.employflorida.com)."


### **EB and EUC Programs**

Actions by Governor Crist and the federal government in July extended two unemployment compensation programs that had expired earlier in the year – the Extended Benefits (EB) program and the Emergency Unemployment Compensation (EUC) program. For Florida businesses, these extensions are 100 percent federally funded and do not impact the state's Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund or the state business tax. Since the legislation's enactment, AWI has paid \$550 million in EUC to approximately 232,500 beneficiaries and \$143.9 million in EB to approximately 42,600 beneficiaries.

### Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida is 7,227,900 in August 2010, up by 29,800 jobs compared to a year ago. This is the second annual increase in jobs since June 2007. The industry gaining the most jobs is private education and health services (+33,500 jobs, +3.2 percent).
- Other industries gaining jobs include: trade, transportation, and utilities (+18,900 +1.3 percent); professional and business services (+11,000 jobs, +1.1 percent); leisure and hospitality (+9,300 jobs, +1.0 percent); and other services (+5,500 jobs, +1.8 percent).
- These industry job gains are partially due to increases in ambulatory health care services; clothing and accessory stores; computer systems design; accommodation; and membership associations and organizations.
- The industries losing jobs over the year include: construction (-17,800 jobs, -4.7 percent); financial activities (-15,100 jobs, -3.2 percent); information (-8,000 jobs, -5.7 percent); manufacturing (-6,000 jobs, -1.9 percent); and total government (-1,400 jobs, -0.1 percent).
- These industry job losses are partially due to weakness in construction of buildings; credit intermediation; telecommunications; fabricated metal product manufacturing; and local government.

### Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In August 2010, Liberty County has the state's lowest unemployment rate (7.5 percent); followed by Walton County (7.8 percent); Okaloosa County (8.0 percent); Lafayette County (8.4 percent); and Monroe County (8.5 percent). Most of the counties with the lowest unemployment rates are

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those with relatively high proportions of government employment. Others have seasonal increases in tourism.

- Hendry County (20.6 percent) has the highest unemployment rate in Florida in August 2010, followed by Flagler County (16.4 percent); Indian River County (16.2 percent); St. Lucie County (15.6 percent); and Hernando County (15.0 percent). Many of the counties with the highest unemployment rates in the state have seasonal declines in agriculture and related industries. There are 51 Florida counties with double-digit unemployment rates in August, up from 49 the previous month.

### **Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)**

- Eight metro areas in the state have over-the-year job gains: Gainesville (+1,100 jobs, +0.9 percent); North Port-Bradenton-Sarasota (+1,100 jobs, +0.4 percent) and Pensacola-Ferry Pass-Brent and Tallahassee (+800 jobs, +0.5 percent each); Panama City-Lynn Haven-Panama City Beach (+500 jobs, +0.7 percent); Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+400 jobs, less than one tenth of a percent); Port St. Lucie (+300 jobs, +0.3 percent); and Naples-Marco Island (+200 jobs, +0.2 percent).
- Of the metro areas with job losses, Miami-Ft. Lauderdale-Pompano Beach (-6,200 jobs, -0.3 percent) is losing the most, followed by Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (-4,300 jobs, -0.4 percent); Palm Bay-Melbourne-Titusville (-2,500 jobs, -1.3 percent) and Ocala (-1,200 jobs, -1.3 percent).

**Note:** These unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Agency for Workforce Innovation.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the US Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Unemployment Compensation tax records and other data.
