

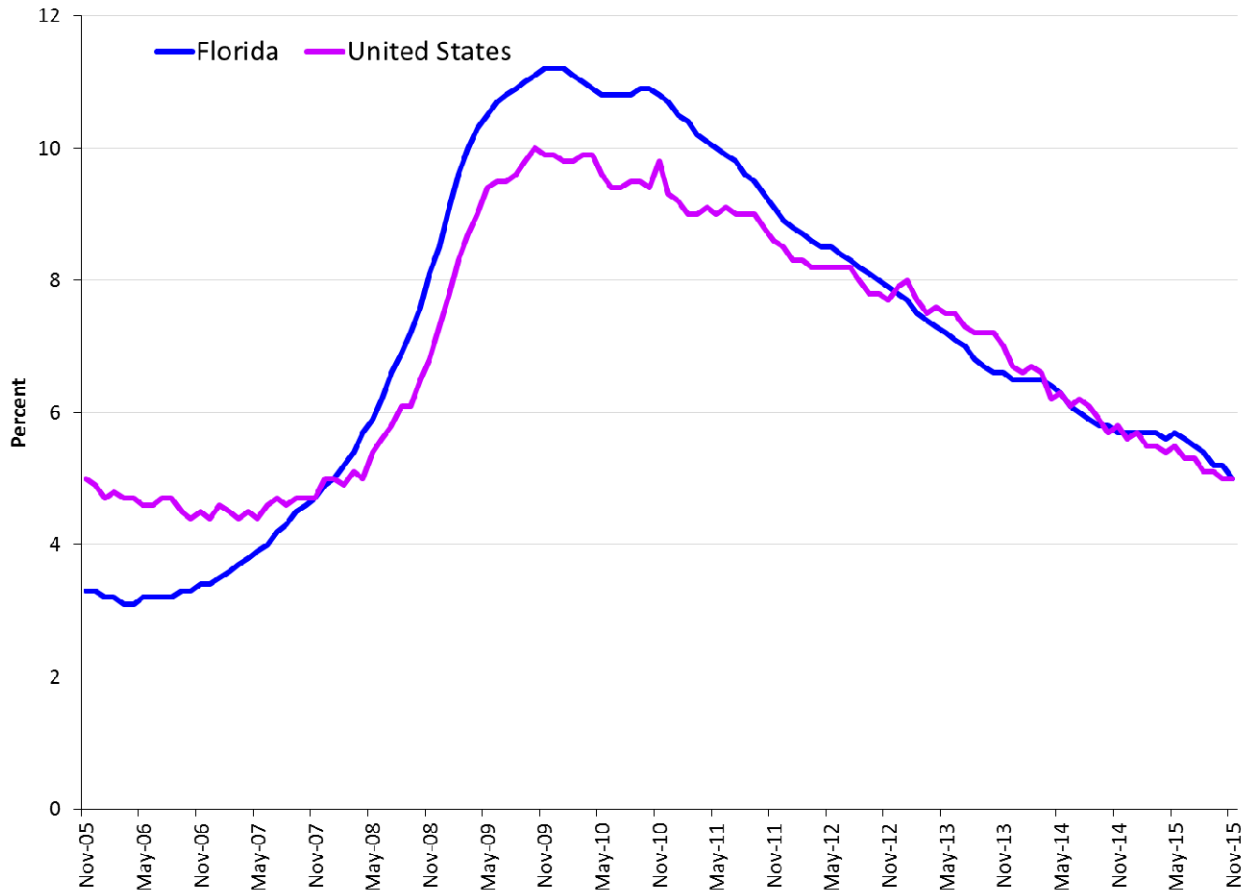

### Florida's November Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.0 percent in November 2015, down 0.2 percentage point from the revised October 2015 rate of 5.2 percent, and down 0.7 percentage point from 5.7 percent a year ago. There were 486,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 9,628,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 5.0 percent in November. This is the first time since January 2015 that Florida's unemployment rate has not been higher than the nation. Florida's unemployment rate has been less than or equal to the national rate for 24 of the last 36 months.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,184,800 in November 2015, an increase of 35,200 jobs (+0.4 percent) over the month. Compared to November a year ago, the number of jobs in the state was up by 239,600, an increase of 3.0 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs was up 1.9 percent over the year. Florida's annual job growth rate has exceeded the nation's rate since April 2012.

## Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,184,800 in November 2015, up 239,600 jobs compared to a year ago. November 2015 was the 64<sup>th</sup> consecutive month with positive annual job growth after the state lost jobs for over three years. The industry gaining the most jobs was professional and business services (+48,000 jobs, +4.0 percent).
- Other industries gaining jobs included education and health services (+46,900 jobs, +4.0 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+45,600 jobs, +2.8 percent); leisure and hospitality (+42,300 jobs, +3.8 percent); construction (+29,300 jobs, +7.2 percent); other services (+13,200 jobs, +4.0 percent); financial activities (+12,500 jobs, +2.3 percent); and manufacturing (+7,700 jobs, +2.3 percent).
- The industries that lost jobs over the year were information (-400 jobs, -0.3 percent) and government (-5,300 jobs, -0.5 percent).

## Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In November 2015, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.3 percent), followed by St. Johns County (3.5 percent) and Alachua and Okaloosa counties (4.1 percent each).
- Hendry County had the highest unemployment rate (8.3 percent) in Florida in November 2015, followed by Hardee County (7.0 percent) and Citrus and Highlands counties (6.6 percent each). No county had a double-digit unemployment rate for November.

## Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- Twenty-two metro areas in the state had over-the-year job gains in November 2015. The areas with the largest gains were Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+40,500 jobs, +3.3 percent), Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+39,900 jobs, +3.5 percent), and Ft. Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (+27,000 jobs, +3.4 percent).

**Note:** The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
