WEATHER SYNOPSIS:

- FLOOD WATCH IN EFFECT THROUGH NOON ON SATURDAY
- HEAVY RAINFALL AMOUNTS OF 3 TO 6 INCHES IMPACTED SOUTHEAST ST JOHNS AND NORTHEAST FLAGLER COUNTIES TODAY...WITH SOME OF THE HEAVIEST AMOUNTS BETWEEN SAINT AUGUSTINE SHORES SOUTHWARD TOWARD PALM COAST
- ONSHORE FLOW WILL CONTINUE TO BRING WAVES OF LOCALLY HEAVY RAINFALL ACROSS COASTAL ST JOHNS AND FLAGLER COUNTIES TONIGHT AND SATURDAY MORNING. ADDITIONAL RAINFALL AMOUNTS OF 2 TO 4 INCHES WILL BE POSSIBLE...WHICH WILL CAUSE FLOODING OR EXACERBATE ONGOING FLOODING PROBLEMS ON ALREADY SATURATED GROUNDS.
- A FLOOD WATCH MEANS THERE IS A POTENTIAL FOR FLOODING BASED ON CURRENT FORECASTS.
 YOU SHOULD MONITOR LATER FORECASTS AND BE ALERT FOR POSSIBLE FLOOD WARNINGS. THOSE
 LIVING IN AREAS PRONE TO FLOODING SHOULD BE PREPARED TO TAKE ACTION SHOULD FLOODING
 DEVELOP

Hazards: - LOCALIZED FLOODING

- DO NOT DRIVE YOUR VEHICLE INTO AREAS WHERE THE WATER COVERS THE ROADWAY. THE WATER DEPTH MAY BE TOO GREAT TO ALLOW YOUR CAR TO CROSS SAFELY. MOVE TO HIGHER GROUND. REMEMBER...TURN AROUND DONT DROWN
- UNIMPROVED ROADS WILL BE SLIPPERY AND MAY CONTAIN WASHOUTS.

- Emergency Sand Bag Operation; residents may pick up and bag their own sand bags at 1 Wellfield Grade, Palm Coast, Florida.
- Palm Coast Fire Department assessing the affected areas.
- Palm Coast Fire Police assisting with traffic control as needed
- Palm Coast Public Works is monitoring water control structures
- Palm Coast Utilities dealing with infiltration into the sewer system and are monitoring the lift stations in the affected areas.
- Flagler County Sheriff's Office is assisting with traffic control
- Flagler County Emergency Operations Center is monitoring this weather event.

Road Closures:

- Woodward Lane, Woodside Drive, Woodshire Lane and the north end of Wood Haven Drive are closed.
- Dirt roads in western Flagler County are mostly passable but can change quickly. Please be careful of slippery conditions and washouts.
 - Washouts Hickory and Walnut, Walnut and Fir
