


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Florida's January Employment Figures Released

NOTE TO EDITORS: Every March, the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity release January employment and unemployment estimates as well as revised historical data. Today's report is the result of that annual process, which is known as "benchmarking." Benchmark revisions are a standard part of the estimation process and take place at this time every year in each state nationwide. As a result of this annual benchmarking process, the release of January and February 2019 employment data is scheduled for March 11 and March 22, respectively.

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.4 percent in January 2019, a 0.1 percentage point increase from the December 2018 rate, and down 0.5 percentage point from a year ago. There were 352,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,320,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 4.0 percent in January.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,900,300 in January 2019, an increase of 8,300 jobs (+0.1 percent) over the month. The state gained 209,500 jobs over the year, an increase of 2.4 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.9 percent over the year. With the exception of September 2017, Florida's over-the-year job growth rate has exceeded the nation's rate since April 2012.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,900,300 in January 2019, up 209,500 jobs compared to a year ago. The industry gaining the most jobs was professional and business services (+54,000 jobs, +4.0 percent).
- Other industries gaining jobs over the year included education and health services (+35,900 jobs, +2.8 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+29,400 jobs, +1.7 percent); construction (+26,600 jobs, +5.1 percent); leisure and hospitality (+25,600 jobs, +2.1 percent); financial activities (+16,700 jobs, +2.9 percent); manufacturing (+9,600 jobs, +2.6 percent); other services (+7,900 jobs, +2.2 percent); information (+2,200 jobs, +1.6 percent); and government (+2,200 jobs, +0.2 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In January 2019, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.8 percent); followed by St. Johns County and Okaloosa County (3.4 percent each); and Orange County and Seminole County (3.5 percent each).
- Gulf County had the highest unemployment rate (7.4 percent) in Florida in January 2019, followed by Bay County (6.0 percent), Citrus County (5.9 percent), and Hendry County (5.8 percent). In January 2019, Panhandle County unemployment rates reflect the continued impacts from Hurricane Michael.

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In January 2019, 22 out of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+49,900 jobs, +3.9 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+30,000 jobs, +2.5 percent), and Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+19,300 jobs, +1.4 percent).
- Panama City was the only metro area to experience an over-the-year job loss in January 2019 (-800 jobs, -1.0 percent). Sebring was unchanged over-the-year.

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
