Dear Ms. Fulford:

I have received your letter concerning the above mentioned case. I would like to bring to the attention of the commission two allegations of fact that I feel were not fully investigated. Number one, the allegation concerning a boat trip to the Bahamas by Ms. Revels and Mr. Paige prior to her vote was not addressed. Secondly, the fact that her outstanding loan amount with Intracoastal Bank was increased by nearly one hundred thousand dollars some time prior to her vote does not appear to have been adequately investigated. When questioned the investigator assigned the case revealed that no inquire with any Federal Banking Regulatory Agencies was made. Specifically, to determine if any Federal Regulations implemented in 2008, were violated concerning her Loan to Income Ratio. If any such improprieties occurred might it be an indication of special treatment for Ms.Revels? I believe, the totality of the circumstances rises to the level of reasonable suspicion that a Quid pro quo may exist in connection with Ms. Revels' affirmative vote on the matter.

In conclusion, I submit that further investigation into allegation number three is warranted, to either, absolve Ms. Revels of any wrong doing in repect to allegation three, or to take same to a higher level.
