- The FCSO is the largest and only full - service law enforcement agency in Flagler County.
- We provide all police services for the City of Palm Coast, Town of Beverly Beach, Town of Marineland, as well as the unincorporated areas. We support Flagler Beach and Bunnell's Police Departments.
- We provide all court and detention services in Flagler County and our jail is the Sheriff Perry Hall Inmate Detention Facility (AKA: The Green Roof Inn) with a capacity of 404 inmates.
- We also run the 911 center in Flagler County which answers and dispatches all 911 calls for police, fire, and medical services.
- There are more than 300 members of the Sheriff's Office serving you!

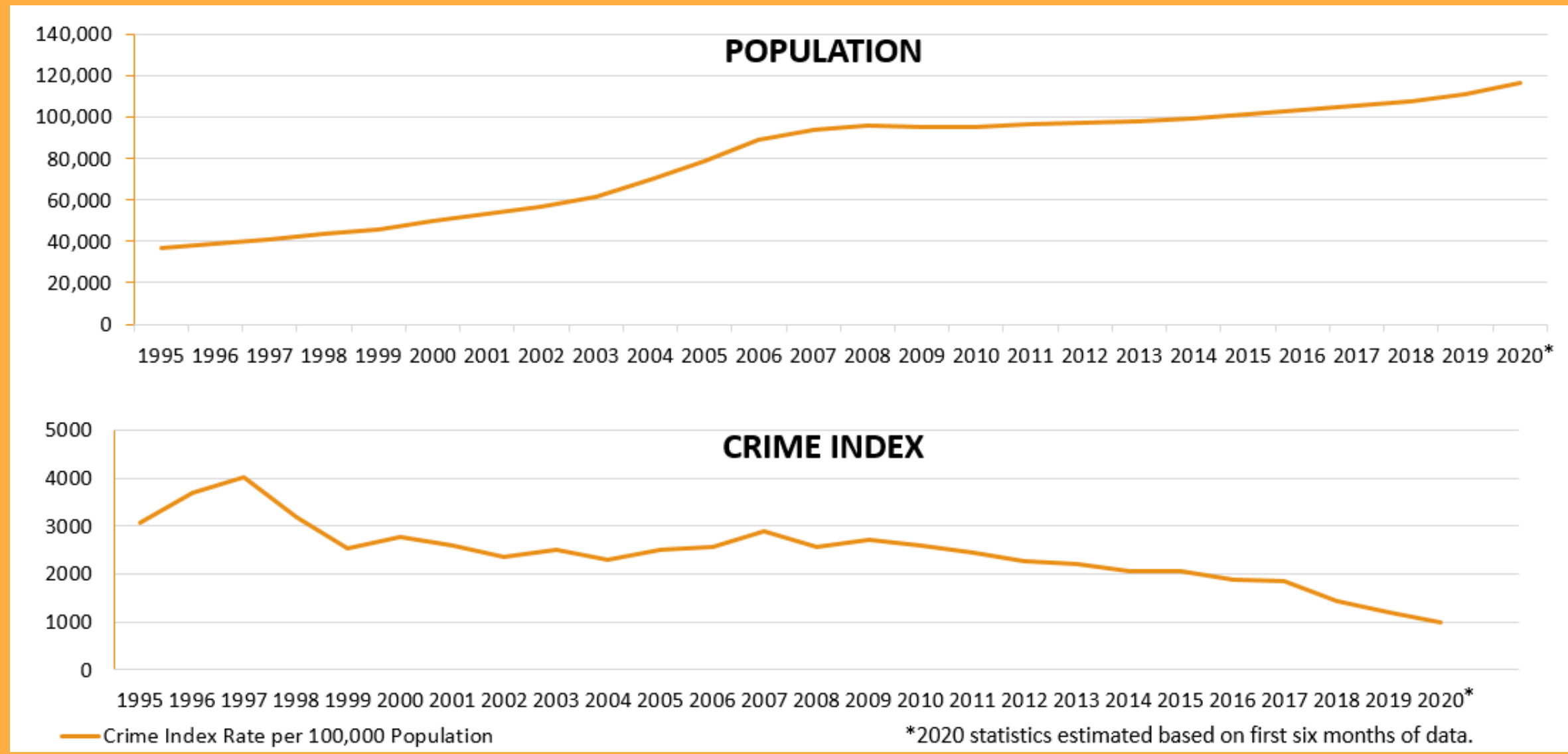

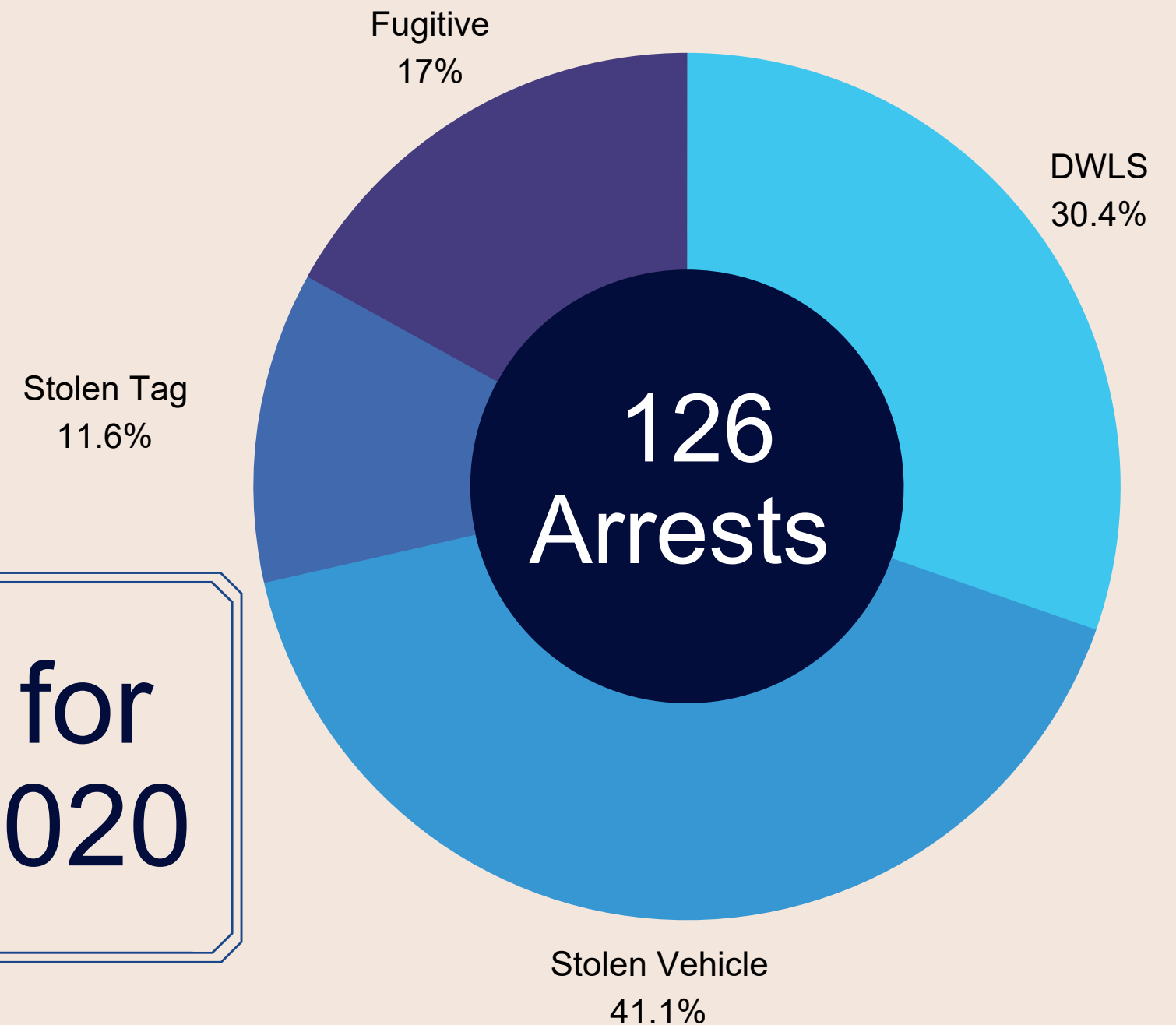

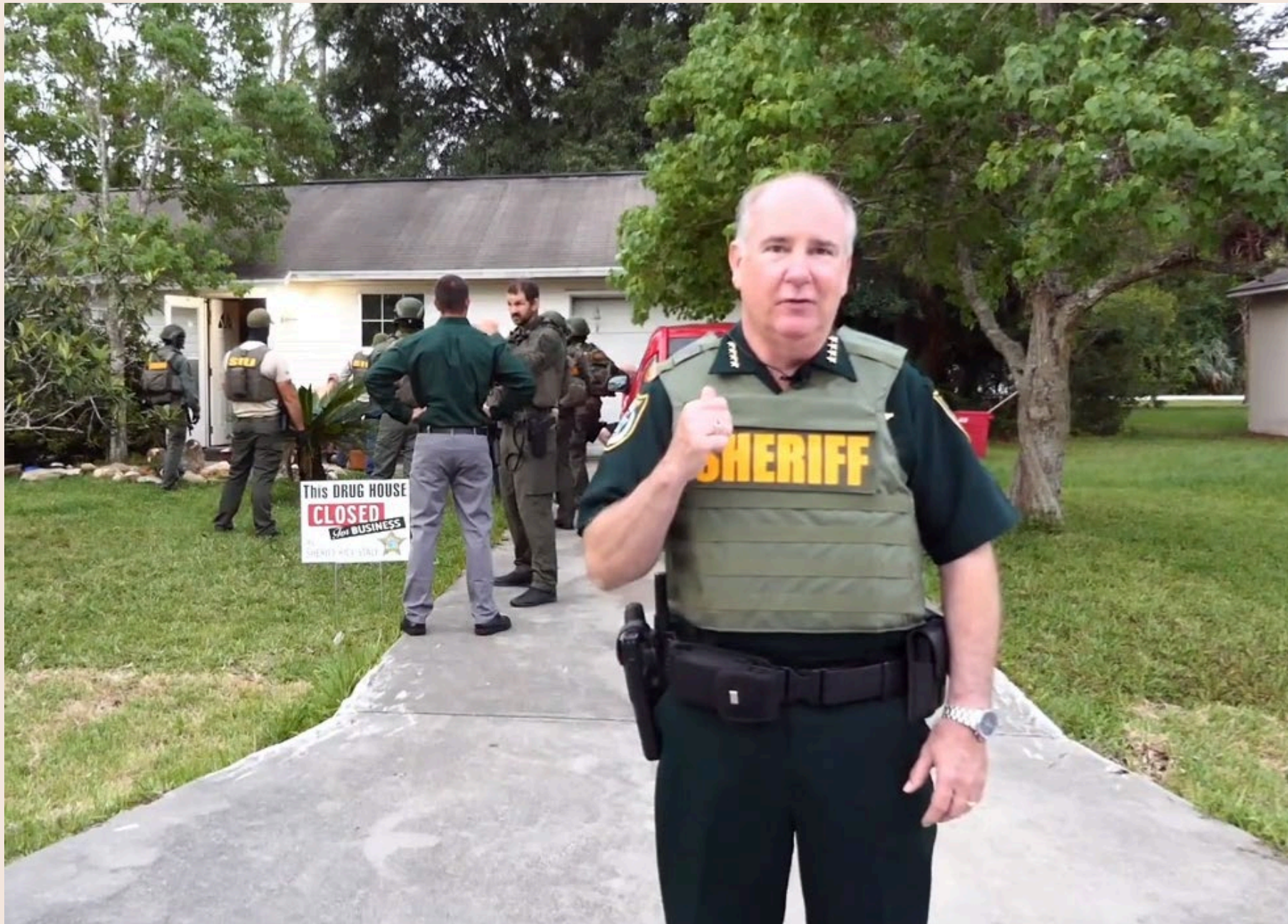

SHERIFF'S HIGH INTEREST TARGET LIST



Drug houses in Flagler County that generate numerous complaints from community members may be added to the Sheriff's High Interest Target list.

Once enough evidence is collected to obtain a search warrant, deputies and detectives, often with Sheriff Staly as well, serve the search warrant and shut down the drug house.



SAFE TRAK

TARGET GRANT PROVIDES TRACKING BRACELET FOR QUICK RECOVERY OF MISSING ENDANGERED PERSONS



Upon receipt of the bracelet and transmitter, the caregiver is trained on how to properly work and maintain the device. Should someone in his or her care wander off, the caregiver will then call 9-1-1 and FCSO will immediately begin to search in the area the bracelet was last tracked.

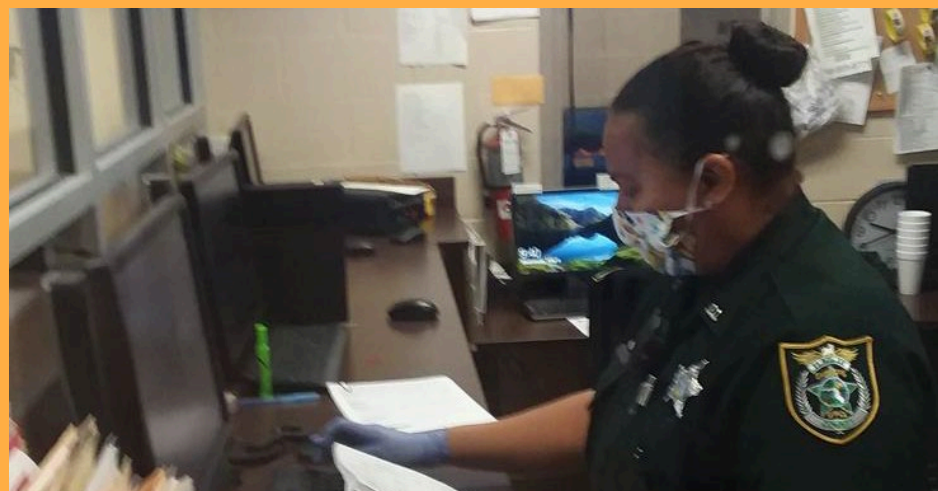

CHANGES AT THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE

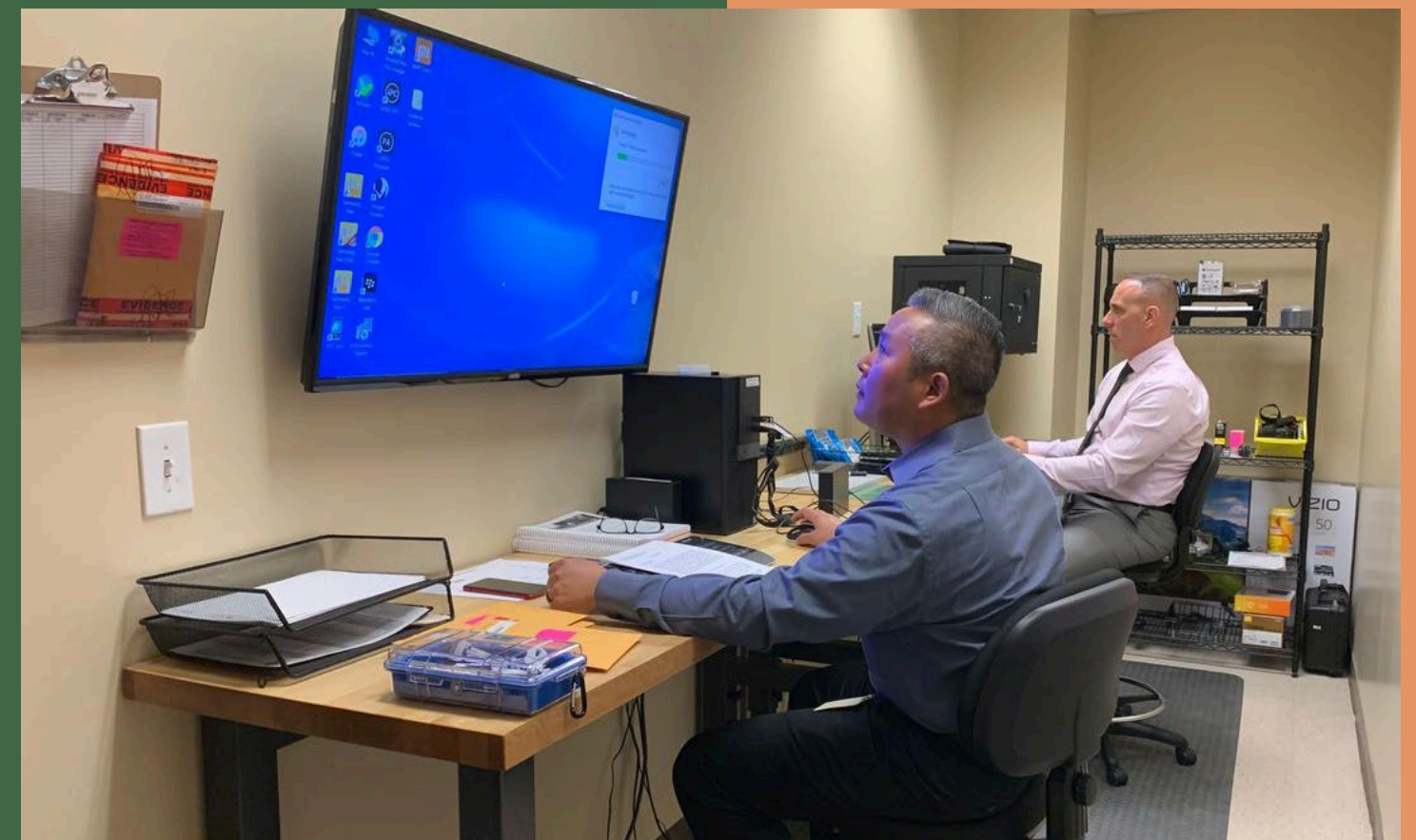
- Dispatch asks a set of screening questions on all 911 - 1-1 calls to determine if anyone involved is showing signs of the virus or has been in contact with someone who has tested positive.
- Deputies may wear face masks and gloves on calls for service or stand at a distance when possible.
- All new arrestees are asked the same COVID - 19 screening questions that dispatch asks, and additionally they get their temperature checked upon arrival at the jail.

WHILE MASK MANDATES ARE NOT ENFORCEABLE, THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE RECOMMENDS THAT INDIVIDUALS FOLLOW CDC GUIDELINES.

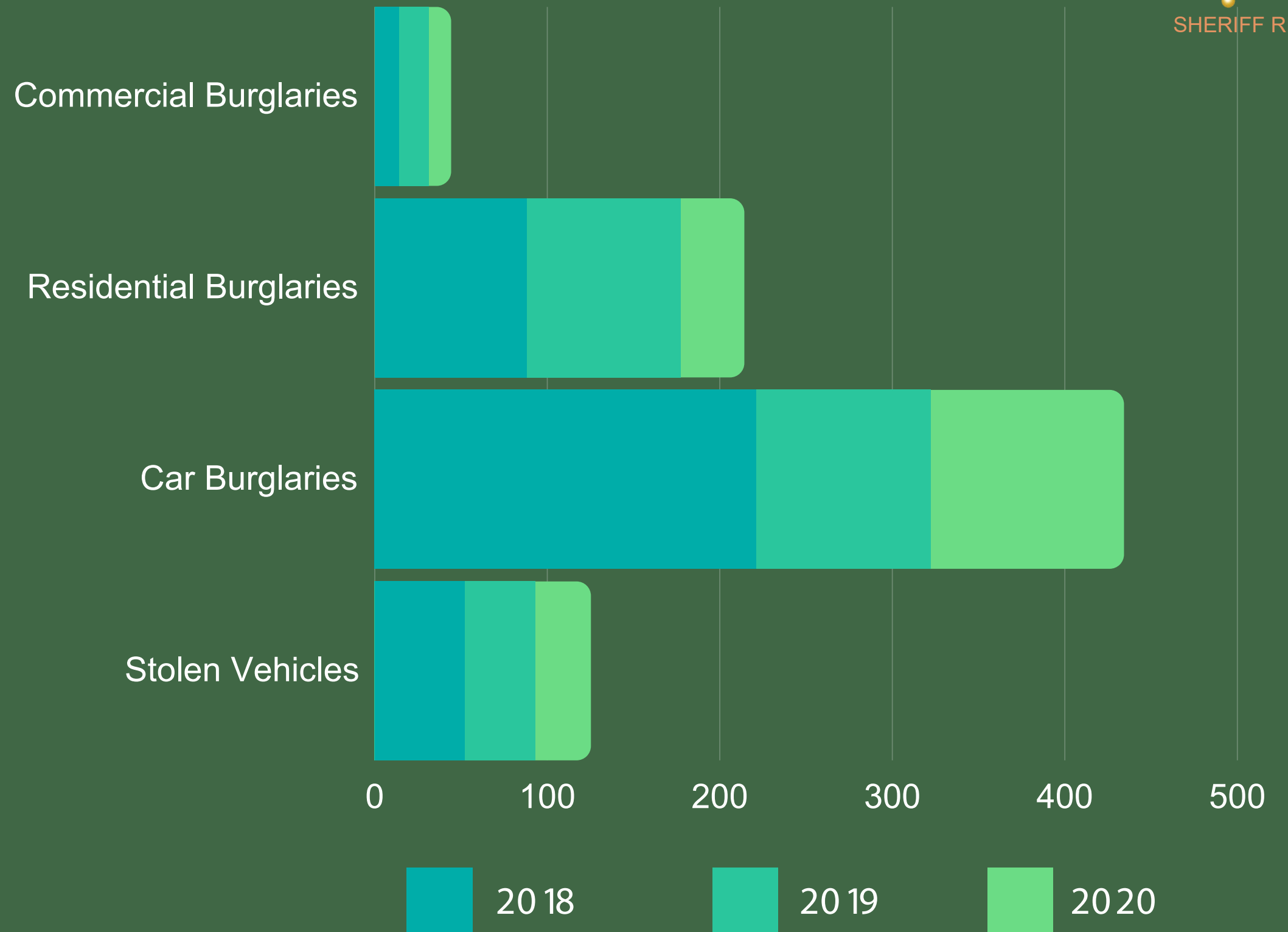

Aggravated Assault

The first eight - months of 2020 showed a slight increase in Aggravated Assault cases in Flagler County.

An analysis of the cases by the FCSO Crime Analytics Unit showed

an increase in domestic violence and road rage incidents. Firearms were used in 38% of the cases compared to 16% in 2019.

Domestic Violence

The analysis showed that a weapon was introduced into the argument before law enforcement was called or arrived. A child was the offender in 23% of the cases in 2020 compared to 7% in 2019.

Road Rage

The analysis showed that drivers took their anger out on another driver by pointing a firearm at the other vehicle often resulting in multiple victims.

DON'T ENGAGE IN ROAD RAGE

A new traffic safety campaign was launched to combat aggressive driving behavior. The Sheriff's Office released a Public Service Announcement to encourage patience and safety while behind the wheel. Children mimic the behavior of their parents.

Violent and aggressive driving is extremely dangerous and drivers must take the necessary measures to ensure that they are not a danger on the road.



Domestic Violence

COMMUNITY DRIVEN SOLUTION

In 2017, Sheriff Staly created a task force to combat the growing problem of domestic violence through a community - driven solution. Since then, local leaders in judicial, mental health, law enforcement, education and faith - based groups routinely come together to develop strategies and programs to tackle the problem of domestic violence.

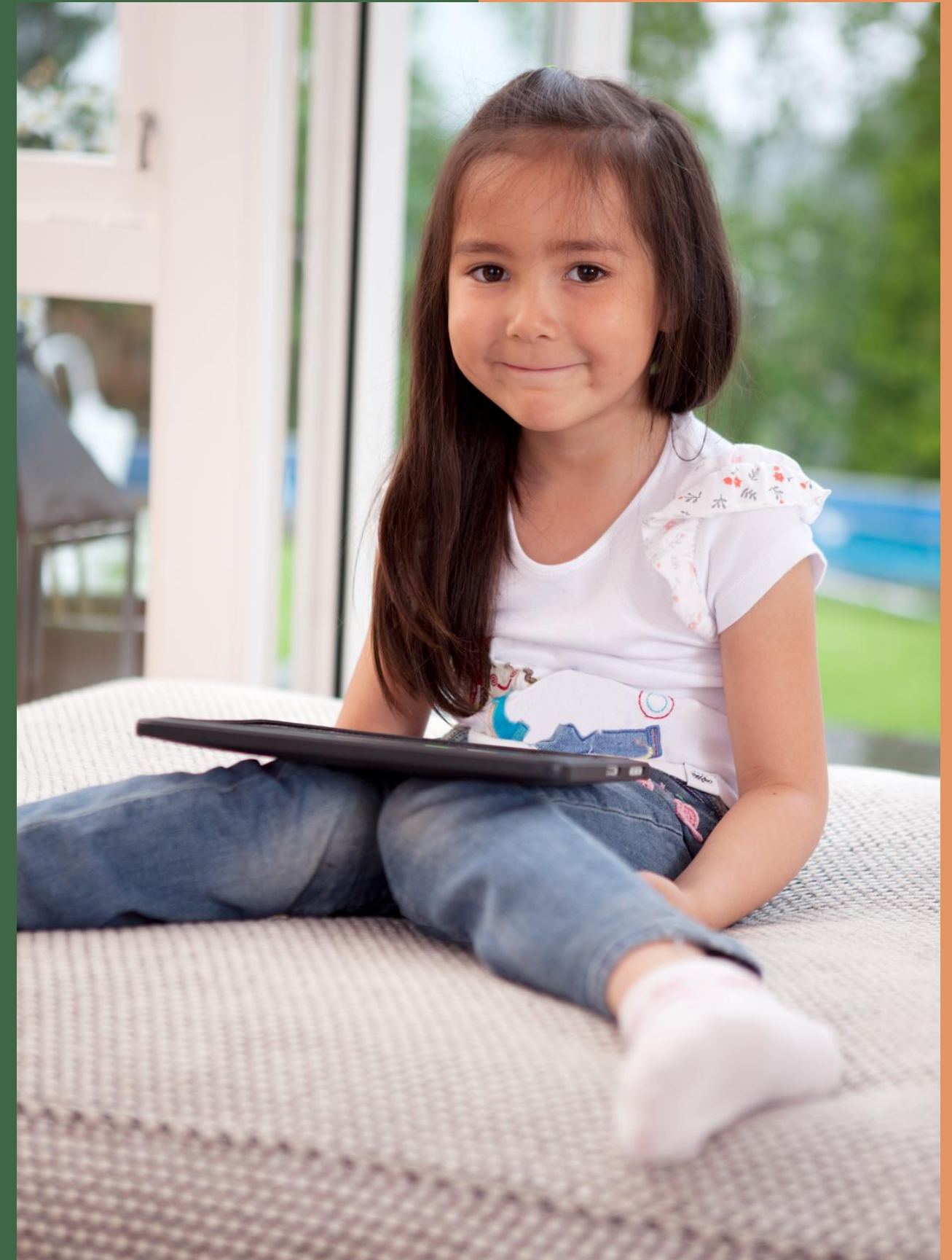
Since inception of the task force, domestic violence crimes have decreased each year until COVID - 19 struck. Electronic bracelets, enforcement, a dedicated detective and analyst and prosecution have all helped to reduced domestic violence overall.
