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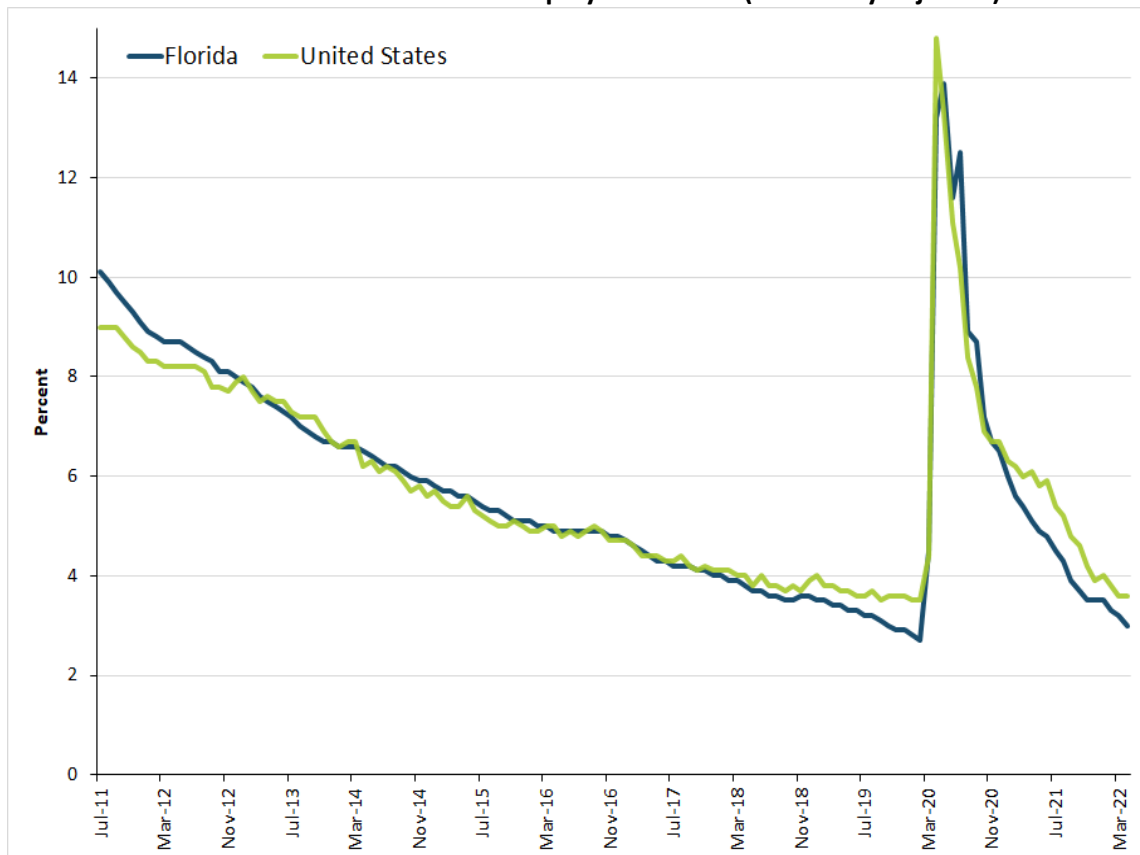
### Florida's April Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.0 percent in April 2022, down 0.2 percentage point from the March 2022 rate, and down 2.1 percentage points from a year ago. There were 321,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,543,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 3.6 percent in April.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 9,292,600 in April 2022, an increase of 58,600 jobs (+0.6 percent) over the month. The state gained 517,100 jobs over the year, an increase of 5.9 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 4.6 percent over the year.

Florida's total nonagricultural and private sector employment surpassed the February 2020 (pre-pandemic) level in October 2021 and labor force surpassed the February 2020 level in June 2021.

## Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,282,500 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back all jobs lost (+1,499,600 jobs).
- All ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in April.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+152,300 jobs, +14.3 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+118,400 jobs, +6.5 percent); professional and business services (+102,100 jobs, +7.1 percent); financial activities (+40,800 jobs, +6.6 percent); education and health services (+25,800 jobs, +1.9 percent); other services (+21,600 jobs, +6.6 percent); manufacturing (+20,700 jobs, +5.4 percent); construction (+17,100 jobs, +3.0 percent); information (+9,800 jobs, +7.3 percent); and total government (+4,000 jobs, +0.4 percent).

## Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In April 2022, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (1.5 percent), followed by St. Johns County (1.7 percent), and Okaloosa County, Nassau County, Union County, Gulf County and Collier County (1.9 percent each).
- Putnam County had the highest unemployment rate (3.6 percent) in Florida in April 2022, followed by Highlands County (3.5 percent), Hamilton County (3.4 percent), and Hendry County, Citrus County and Osceola County (3.3 percent each).

## Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In April 2022, 23 out of all 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+103,000 jobs, +8.3 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+77,100 jobs, +6.6 percent), and Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+76,300 jobs, +5.5 percent).
- One metro area in Florida experienced an over-the-year job loss: Sebring (-200 jobs, -0.8 percent)

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
