




What are precincts?


Voting precinct boundaries are drawn locally, in each county and approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

Election results to the Department of State are reported at the precinct level. Election Day voting occurs within precincts, or at combined polling locations.

Precincts are not representative districts.

U.S. Census block data must be used to change precinct boundaries.













When was the last change?

Two precincts were added in 2017.

Precinct boundaries were adjusted to balance voter population among neighboring precincts.

Prior to that, our precincts were reduced from 35 to 23 locations in 2012.

Precincts must be ADA accessible and large enough to safely accommodate the number of voters who are expected to vote on Election Day.

In Flagler County, we have a shortage of suitable facilities for voting. We do not have community centers or other public buildings in areas of large residential populations.










Why change precinct boundaries now?

Redistricting

Districts determine which voters participate in which elections. Using the data from the 2020 census, the Florida Legislature has completed the final district boundaries for State Senators and State House of Representatives.

In Flagler County, our district boundaries did not change. We are fortunate to have single districts for state senator, state representative and US Congress. However, our Florida House of Representative district number changed from 24 to 19.



District boundaries for BOCC and School Board did change and new voter information cards will be sent based on our precinct alignments with these new boundaries.










What about US Congressional districts?

Special Session

The Legislature reconvened for a special session this month to redraw the map for Congressional districts, however, our Congressional district did not change during this process.

None of the proposed maps throughout this process have shown a change for Flagler County. We will remain in District 6.

District Alignment

Adjust precinct boundaries to align with adopted local district changes and municipal borders.

- New districts:
 BOCC/SB and Palm Coast Council
- Municipal boundaries:
 Palm Coast, Flagler Beach, Bunnell

Goal:

Eliminate unnecessary precinct splits which cause multiple ballot styles in precincts.

Effect:

Ballot cost savings and reduces the potential for human error.









Numbering System

Three digit number system for precincts to indicate city or unincorporated voters.

- Current numbers:
- 1 37 have no value
- New numbers: 100, 200, 400, 500

Goal:

Create a numbering system that quickly and easily identifies each precinct within a municipality. Also corresponds with our voter registration database.

Effect:

Simplifies the ballot proofing process, groups precincts by city locations.

1= Bunnell / 2 = Beverly Beach & Flagler Beach / 4 = Unincorporated / 5 = Palm Coast









Safety & Accessibility

Combine precincts into locations with adequate space.

- 5/7:
 Rima Ridge, Community Baptist Church
- 8/9: Flagler Executive Airport, FCAR
- 15/16/17:
 Wadsworth Elementary, Buddy Taylor Middle, and Belle Terre Swim & Racquet Club

Goal:

Find suitable locations for adjacent smaller precincts.

Effect:

Provides better access, reduces voter confusion.









Precincts 5 / 7

Rima Ridge does not have a polling place within Flagler County. Residents in the precinct have been voting at Precinct 7 (formerly St. Mary's Catholic Church) since 2012. The Catholic Church is no longer available as a polling location and the voters will be moved to Community Baptist Church, half a mile away.

Combine:

Precinct 5: Rima Ridge

Precinct 7: Community Baptist Church

Precinct 103: Community Baptist Church






Seminole Woods





Precinct 16: Wadsworth Elementary School









Election Day Precinct Turnout




2004 - 2020
