Pavement Rating Systems

- PCI Pavement Condition Index
 - Provides a snapshot of the pavement health with an in-depth evaluation, measured on a scale between 0 to 100.
 - Contracted Services (every 3-5 years)

Rating 90-100	No maintenance required		
Rating 70-90	Pavement Preservation and Surface Treatments (microsurfacing, chip & seal)		
Rating 50-70	Pavement Rehabilitation – Mill and Overlays		
Rating 0-50	Reclamation and Reconstruction		

- PASER Pavement Surface Evaluation and Rating
 - A visual system that uses surface distresses to assign a rating from 1 to 10
 - In-house Staff (every year)

Rating 9 & 10	No maintenance required
Rating 8	Little or no maintenance
Rating 6 & 7	Routine maintenance, microsurfacing, chip & seal and minor patching
Rating 4 & 5	Preservative treatment (mill and overlay)
Rating 1 - 3	Structural improvement and/or Reconstruction

What is a pavement management system (PMS)?

 PMS is a systematic approach to pavement preservation, maintenance and rehabilitation which seeks to extend the life cycle of pavement infrastructure.

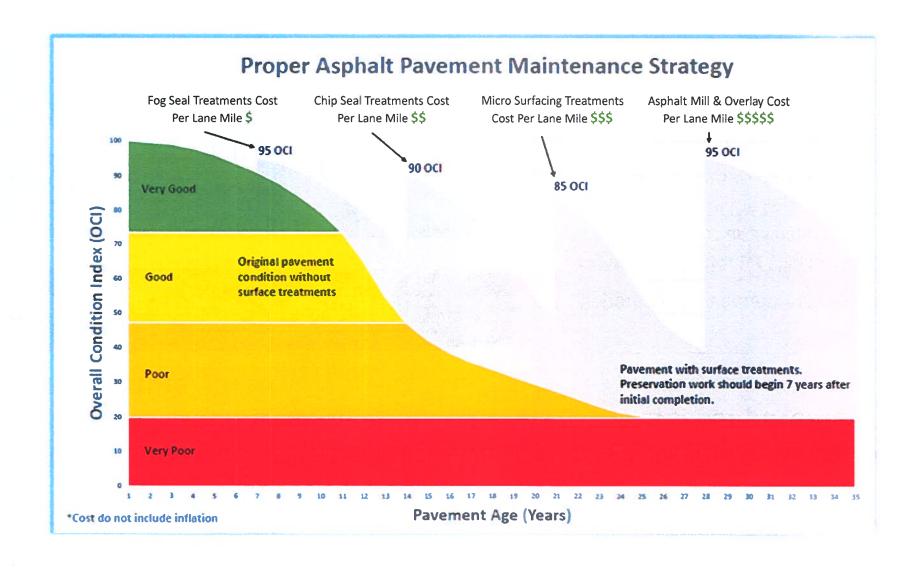

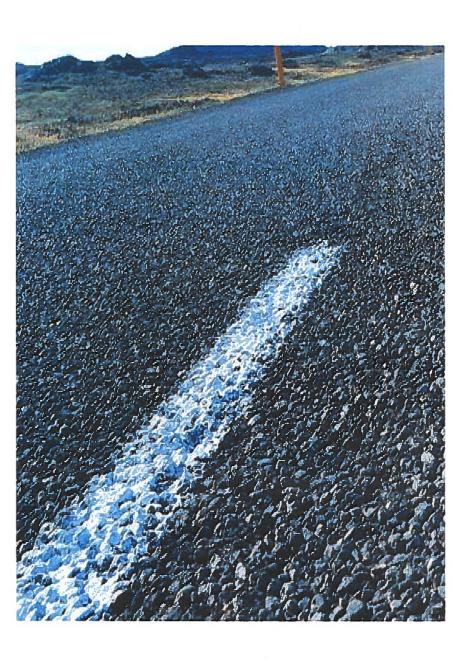




What is Fog Seal?

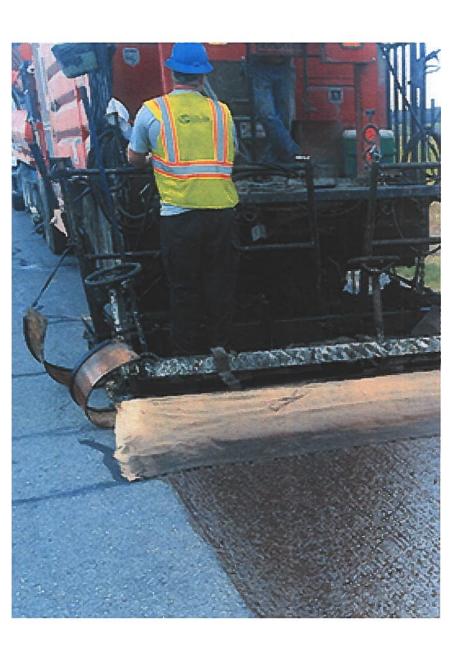
 A fog seal is a single application of an asphalt emulsion onto an existing pavement surface for maintenance purposes. The reason for a fog seal is to renew oxidized pavement surfaces. This will also seal minor cracks and improve the surface appearance.





What is Chip and Seal?

 Chip sealing is a thin film of heated asphalt liquid sprayed on the road surface, followed by the placement of small aggregate ("chips"). The chips are then compacted to orient the chips for maximum adherence to the asphalt, and excess stone is swept from the surface.



What is Microsurfacing?

 Microsurfacing is a protective seal coat which extends the life of pavement. It is a thin, tough layer of asphalt emulsion blended with finely crushed stone for traction. This is a costeffective method to renew the road surface and seal minor cracks and other irregularities.





What is an overlay?

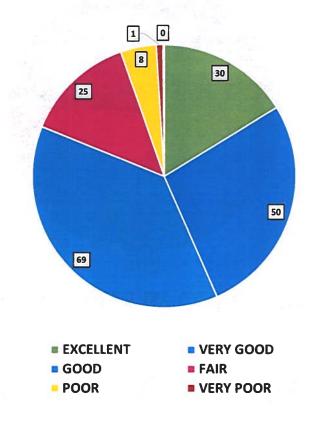
 It's a roadway maintenance technique that requires the removal of the top layer (2") of a street by the grinding action of a large milling machine.
 After the top layer is removed, a new layer of asphalt pavement is put in its place to help prolong the life of the road.

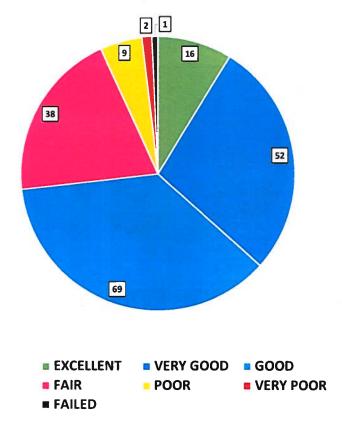

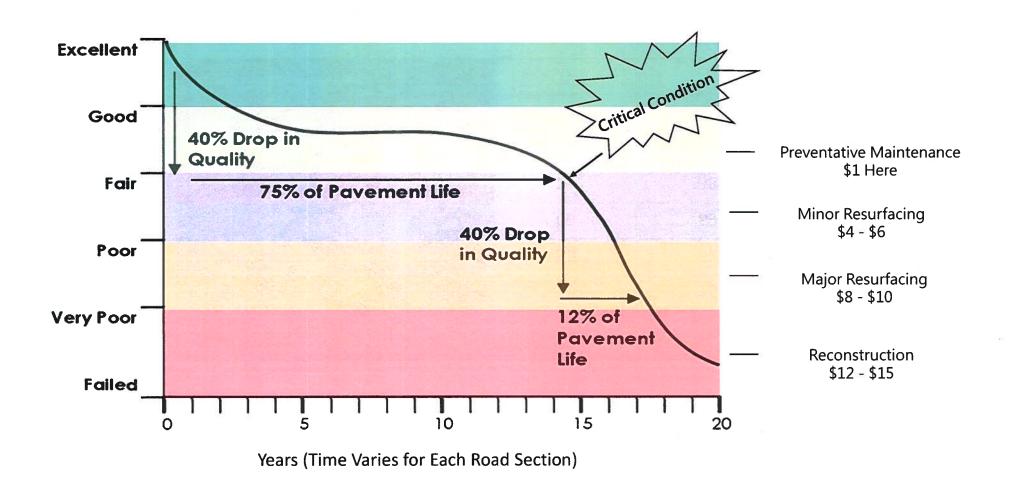

Road Deterioration Curve

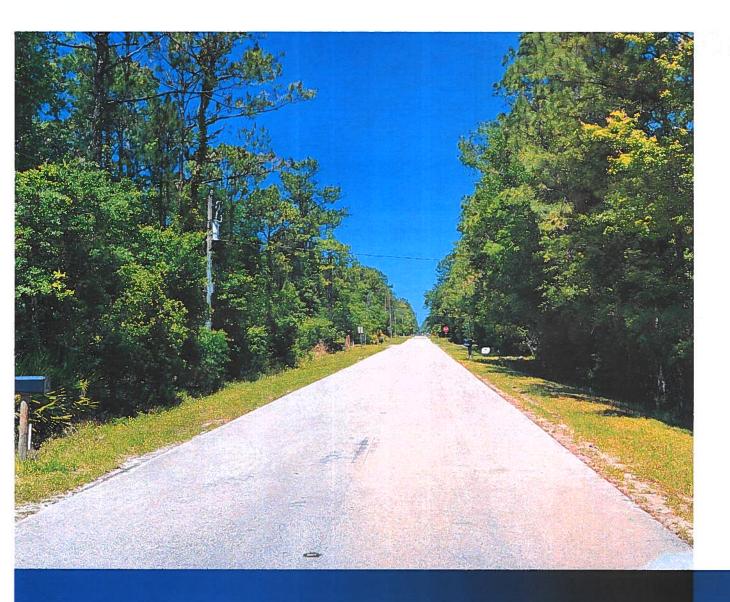




MalaCompra Road

- Will be evaluated yearly for signs of deterioration

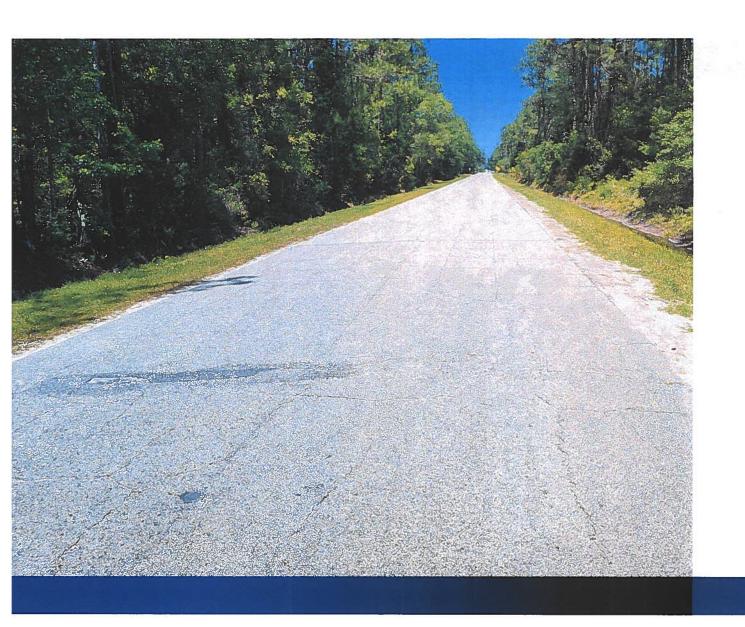




Lancewood Street

- Lancewood Street on the PASER scale is a 6/Good
- Presents the need to placed on a rehabilitation schedule

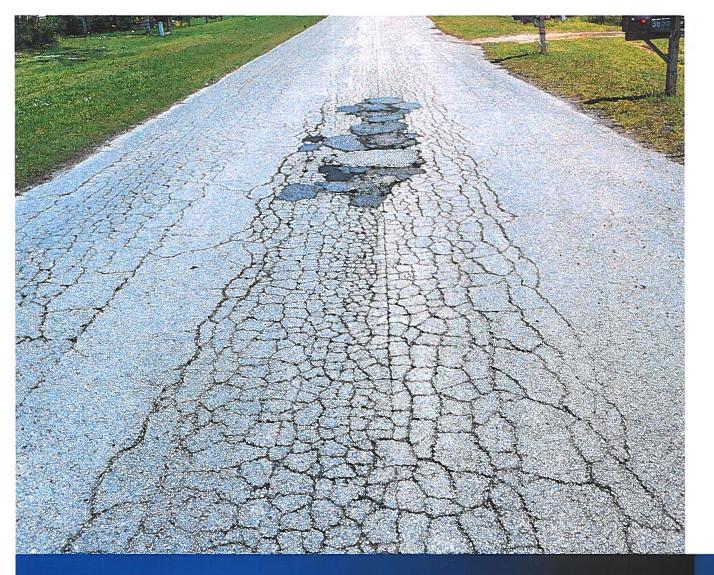




Avocado Boulevard

- Avocado Boulevard has a PASER rating of 5/Fair
- Presents the need for immediate pavement rehabilitation





Rodeo Road

- Rodeo Road on the PASER scale is a 1/Failed
- This road and all surrounding roads in Rima Ridge can only be improved by full depth reclamation.
- Estimated as 3-5 times the cost of preferred pavement rehabilitation
- Scheduled for reconstruction FY 26-27

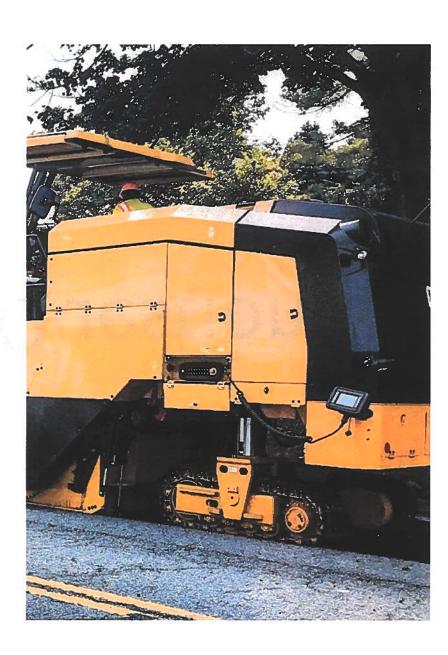

Local Program Funding



Local Agency Program (LAP)

- Used for local projects to develop, design, and construct transportation facilities with Federal-Aid funds (Federal Highway Administration)
- FDOT oversight
- No Local Match

FDOT

Small County Road Assistance Program (SCRAP)

(FSS 339.2816)

- Used for resurfacing and reconstructing county roads.
- Funds are available to counties that have a population of 75,000 or less per the 1990 US Census data.
- No Local Match

Small County Outreach Program (SCOP)

(FSS 339.2818)

- Used for repairing or rehabilitating county bridges and roads, paving unpaved roads, roadrelated drainage improvements, or capacity safety improvements on county roads.
- Population of 200,000 or less.
- 75% State / 25% Local

Any initial bid costs or project overruns after the letting that exceed FDOT's participation, will be at the county's expense.

Bridge Replacement

- Seven (7) Roadways with bridges that will need to be replaced at some time.
 - CR 304
 - Old Kings Road N (I-95)
 - CR 25 (CR302)
 - CR15 (CR302)
 - CR45 (SR100)
 - CR55 (SR100)
 - Water Oak Road
- Only receive inspections and light maintenance

Unpaved Roadways

- Local Unpaved Roads to be paved at some time.
 - 130 Centerline Miles
 - 260 Lane Miles
- Based on today's FDOT construction cost estimate
 - \$208 million dollars
 - \$52 million dollars in potential local match (25% of cost)

Safe Street and Roads for All (SS4A)

- Bipartisan Infrastructure Law provides \$5 billion grant program, with ~ \$1 billion per year over 5 years.
- Expected Award Size and Requirements
 - Thru R2CTPO
 - Safety Action Plan Grant: \$100K - \$10M
 - Implementation Grant: \$2.5M \$25M
 - Requires 20% Local Match

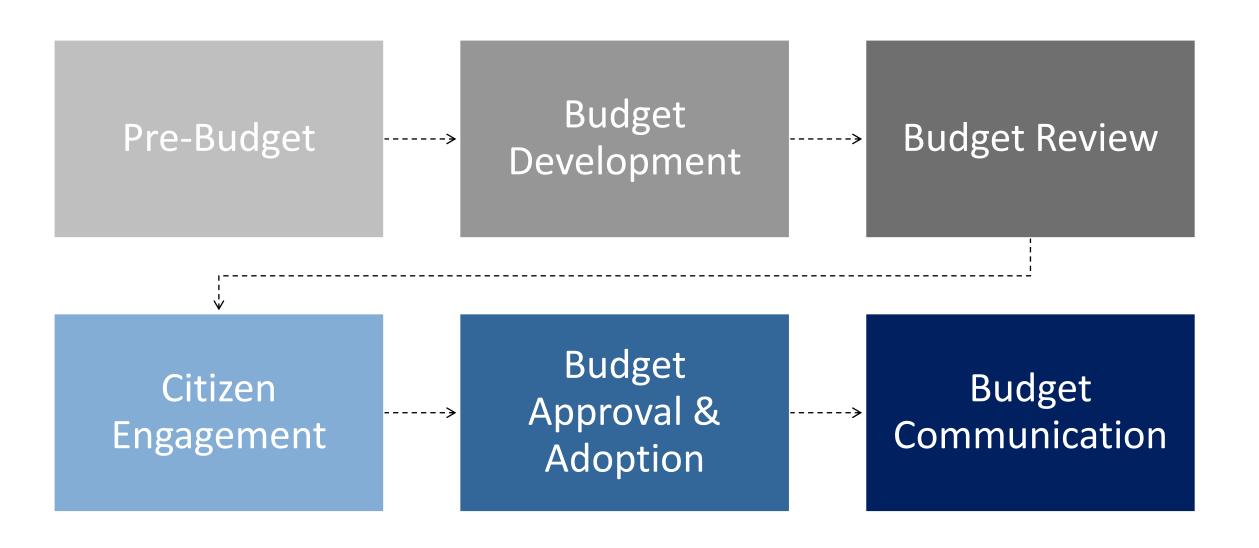

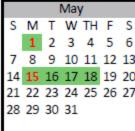

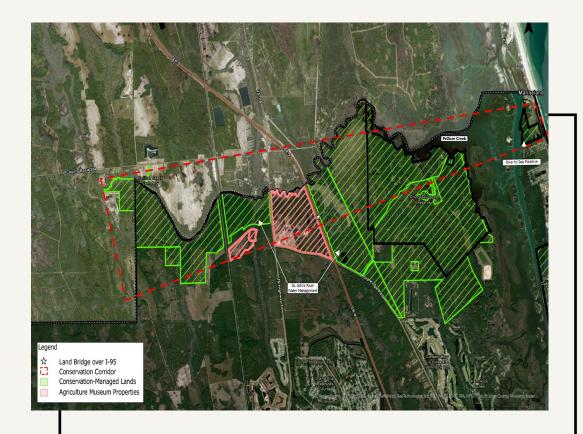

Suggested Funding Priorities 2024



Requested Funding - \$ 20,000,000



Create a Cohesive Venue for Educational and Entertaining Experiences within the Conservation Corridor.

These properties on the North side of the County represents a critical link for an existing conservation corridor along Pellicer Creek, an Outstanding Florida Water. It is centrally located within the conservation corridor and locally conservation-managed lands. This property presents a unique opportunity to complete an almost 7-mile link of publicly owned conservation land along Pellicer Creek eastward from the coastline at the Flagler County managed River to Sea Preserve to approximately 1.5 miles west of I-95. This link will not only create an opportunity for ecotourism on both sides of U.S. 1 with the connection by way of a pedestrian bridge but will also further connect lands along Old Kings Road from the wildlife and pedestrian bridge overpass that crosses I-95 to the county-owned Princess Place Preserve. This location will provide the potential to work with state agencies such as the Division of State Lands, Florida State Parks, St. Johns River Water Management District, the Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve, and the University of Florida's various research arms on public outreach, education, and research needed on issues of water quality, habitat management, water supply conservation, and other similar pursuits

This site could become a regionally significant site/attraction and economic driver for tourism - including demonstrations of past, present, and future of farming practices but also for educational partnerships and an ecotourism site creating a nature hotspot within Flagler County that would include activities such as hiking, biking, kayaking, birding and horseback riding.

Co-location of our Flagler County UF/IFAS Extension Office would extend the educational benefits of the scientific side of agriculture and natural resources and provide a platform to engage with local communities, schools, and visitors, raising awareness about the importance of conservation and promoting sustainable practices.

The final piece would be to relocate activities of the Fairgrounds to provide another economic driver, to help with operations and an educational forum for agriculture, youth and family activities.



Create a Cohesive Venue for Educational and Entertaining Experiences within the Conservation Corridor.

REQUESTED ACTION

Provide funding to create a cohesive venue that would add land to the conservation corridor, allow for ecotourism activities and co-locate UF/IFAS and the activities of the Fairgrounds.

EFFECT

This project would connect the east side and west side of the conservation corridor, provide a venue for ecotourism and educational activities to become an economic driver for Flagler County and an educational forum for agriculture, youth and families.



Requested Funding - \$ 10,000,000



Improvements to Recreation, Fields and Fairgrounds with an Emphasis on Emergency Preparedness.

Currently Flagler County has a deficit of special needs shelter spaces, as determined by the most recent Florida Statewide Emergency Shelter Plan. This deficit is determined by the number of approved and useable special needs shelter spaces compared to the expected demand for space.

Flagler County continues to grow, with a significant portion of that growth coming from senior citizens, as it has been for decades. Flagler County's senior citizen centric growth creates a unique hurricane evacuation issue for us, as senior citizen households are more likely to need special medical needs sheltering than other segments of the population.

In addition to our Special Medical Needs Shelter deficit, Flagler County also has a significant lack of non-school facilities that can serve as shelters for any type of emergency or disaster. Currently the only non-school shelter facilities that we have access to are community centers, which are generally very small with limited capabilities and not built to today's building codes.

The Flagler County Fairgrounds has the potential to serve as the perfect disaster resource and recovery site for our entire county, even in support of our neighboring counties. However, for this potential to materialize ground and facility improvements will be necessary. The site offers the perfect opportunity to:

- 1) Construct a multi-purpose facility that can serve as our primary special medical needs shelter for hurricanes, and a consolidated shelter for both post-hurricane and non-hurricane evacuations.
- 2) Improve onsite drainage and provide a hardened/elevated (flood resistant) parking surface and ingress/ egress route to/from the entrance roadway.
 - a. The roadway and parking lot should also be designed in a manner that would allow the site to appropriately handle traffic flow as a disaster point of distribution (vaccines, food, water, tarps, etc.)

When not being used as a shelter this facility would be a great replacement for Cattleman's Hall, and its adjacent structures, that would allow for year-round events that would be both culturally and economically beneficial to our community.



Improvements to Recreation, Fields and Fairgrounds with an Emphasis on Emergency Preparedness.

REQUESTED ACTION

Provide funding to improve the fields, relocate all activities associated with the Fairgrounds and create a special needs shelter for future emergency preparedness needs.

EFFECT

This project will create a dedicated special needs shelter and allow us to reduce that deficit as defined by the State. This site will also act as a disaster resources site for the county and can be used to support our neighboring counties as well.

Requested Funding - \$8,000,000



Construct a New Visitor Eco-Discovery Center

In 2019, the Flagler County Board of County Commissioners approved and adopted the county's tourism strategic plan. The strategic plan recognized that one of the key ingredients to be successful and ensure a return on investment, was the educational, marketing, and promotional components that are needed for on-going support that is focused on the ecotourism products and assets. One of the main objectives to accomplish this is the creation and development of the Flagler County Eco-Discovery Center. The eco-discovery center will act as the main hub in Flagler County to protect, conserve and enhance the recreational, natural, historical, and cultural resources.

The new 10,000 sq. ft. Eco-Discovery Center will be located on a 22-acre county owned parcel on SR100 which is on the Heritage Crossroads Byway and approximately 1 mile east of I-95 and 3 miles west of A1A Scenic & Historic Coastal Byway in Flagler Beach. This location is also approximately .25 miles from the newly constructed pedestrian bridge and adjacent to the future Bulow Creek Headwaters Regional Park. The pedestrian bridge project along with its additional miles of trails, will serve as a gateway for the already 135 miles of trails in Flagler County. The bridge connects to the Lehigh Greenway Trail and eventually to the Bulow Trail which will connect to the Bulow Creek Headwaters Regional Park currently in the design and planning phase. This 1,000-acre park is a critical part of the larger 'Palm Coast to Bulow Corridor' that includes Graham Swamp Preserve, Bulow Creek, and Tomoka marsh conservation areas. This regional greenway is of statewide significance as identified within the Florida Greenways and Trails System Opportunity map. This conservation area is large enough and well-connected enough to provide significant environmental benefits to the region.



Construct a New Visitor Eco-Discovery Center.

REQUESTED ACTION

Provide funding assistance to construct the Flagler County Visitor Eco-Discovery Center to support the goals, objectives, and priorities of Flagler County, Northeast Florida Regional Council, and the Scenic A1A Byways.

EFFECT

The eco-discovery center will act as the main hub in Flagler County to protect, conserve and enhance the recreational, natural, historical, and cultural resources.



Requested Funding - \$ 20,000,000



Construct a Facility to Expand Access to Public Health and Social Service Providers through a Public-Private Partnership.

The Department of Health-Flagler has outgrown itself. This has become evident during the last 10 years as new services have been initiated and existing services have expanded. New programs include comprehensive services for HIV patients, a Diabetes education and prevention program and expansion of Sexually Transmitted Disease, WIC (Woman's, Infant and Children), School Health and Pediatric Dental services, including a dental sealant program within the school district. As a result, we now have become space constrained with some programs and Health Department functions moving down the street to offices owned by the County and other space was leased at the County Airport to accommodate School Health, Disease Investigation and the Diabetes program. At our prime location, no space exists for a conference room, storage of supplies, office space and parking space is lacking. Flagler has the lowest sq ft of space per employee at 244 compared to an average of 469 sq ft per FTE in the other medium sized CHD's.

We now have an opportunity to co-locate and create a public-private partnership with Flagler Cares and the Flagler County Village entities to promote the 'No-Wrong Door' approach to care. We embrace the advantage of being in the same building as Flagler Cares and several health and social service agencies and non-profits. Currently, organizations that comprise the Flagler County Village include Easter seals of Northeast Central Florida, Early Learning Coalition, Healthy Start, The House Next Door, Epic Behavioral Health Care, Outreach Community Care Network, Flagler Open Arms Recovery Services and more. The Health Department is closely aligned with Flagler Cares and each of the entities identified above. We refer patients to each other on a continual basis. The reality of a Flagler County Social Services building, centrally located in Palm Coast would serve as a hub where organizations with a shared commitment to creating access for vulnerable residents can co-exist for ease of referrals and accessing health, social care, behavioral health, financial and housing supports. In essence, a one stop shop solution to available care.



Construct a Facility to Expand Access to Public Health and Social Service Providers through a Public-Private Partnership.

REQUESTED ACTION

Provide funding assistance to construct a true one stop shop solution for health and social service care in Flagler County.

EFFECT

We will be able to provide wrap around and expanded services for the residents of Flagler County with a public private partnership approach.



Requested Funding - \$ 10,000,000



Construct a New General Aviation Terminal.

The Flagler Executive Airport (FIN) is one of the busiest General Aviation (GA) airports in the state of Florida and continues to experience a significant increase in the number, size, and type of aircraft operations. Daily activity on the airport's two paved runways ranges from the smaller single-engine training aircraft utilized by area flight schools to the largest business jet aircraft flying today. This growth has led to the need for a new General Aviation (GA) Terminal to replace the existing 3,240 sq. ft. 30-year-old structure located in a lean-to in an existing hangar building. The new 15,529 SF GA Terminal Building will accommodate airport administrative offices, an airport operated FBO and its appurtenant facilities, public space, meeting space, and room for additional small tenants.

As a result, the project will allow the Flagler Executive Airport (FIN) to improve customer service, provide better public access and an overall safer operating environment for the public, and support local businesses. This project will also provide access to improved terminal facilities for a disadvantaged population area in this economically distressed rural part of Florida. As a REDI County (Rural Economic Development Initiative, the new terminal building will increase development at the airport, which will lead to business opportunities and job creation.

Overall, expansion to the terminal, is expected to improve efficiency, meet ADA requirements and provide users with more amenities and options. It will provide new offices, administration space, pilot lounge and flight planning. The building will also serve the Airport Administration and the airport operated FBO. This project will enhance safety with more centralized control between the landside and airside areas and increase capacity to support aeronautical demands now and into the future.

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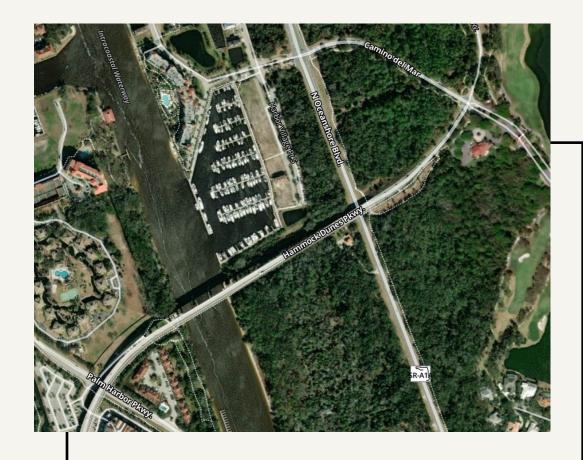
Construct a New General Aviation Terminal.

REQUESTED ACTION

Provide funding assistance to help construct a new general aviation terminal.

EFFECT

The funding will increase capacity, replace the aging infrastructure, Achieve compliance with ADA, Improve access for the historically disadvantaged populations, Improve airport safety and energy efficiency and create high-value, high wage jobs.



Requested Funding - \$ 5,000,000



A Study and Design for Safety Improvements to the Intersection on the East Side of the Hammock Dunes Bridge on the Barrier Island.

There are currently only two access points to State Road A1A from the Westside of Flagler County. These include the Route 100 Bridge and the Hammock Dunes Bridge. Since the Hammock Dunes Bridge is a toll bridge and leads direct to the Hammock dunes private community and is a difficult intersection to traverse, most people access the beaches by way of the Route 100 bridge. This bridge leads into the City of Flagler Beach and as a result the City has become a mecca for tourism and business. Over the twenty years while the population has grown from 50,000 to almost 130,000 and tourism increased to over 1,000,000, little has been done to alleviate the congestion of traffic created from residents and tourists alike.

The situation for access from the County across the ICW has become a serious and growing problem. While another bridge in the Northern Part of the County would be a solution, it is unlikely to happen any time in the foreseeable future. As a result, we are looking for a study and design for any safety improvements to the intersection at the end of the east side of the Hammock Dunes Bridge to encourage other means of ingress or egress from A1A.

Improvements to this intersection needs to be planned and executed as a first step to improve safety and flow. The second piece to improve things would be to remove the toll if feasible, so that a second free access to A1A and the Beaches would move some of the traffic volume away from Route 100 and the ever-increasing congestion in the City of Flagler Beach.



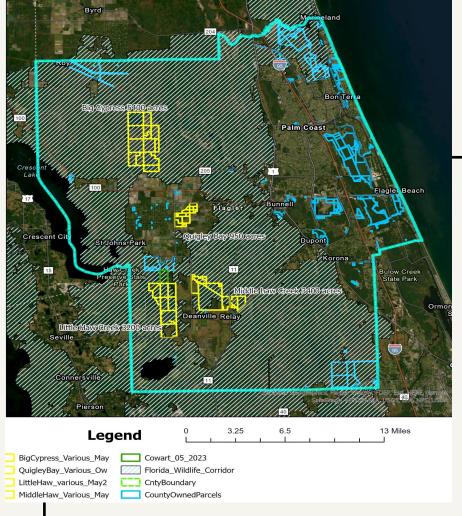
A Study and Design for Safety Improvements to the Intersection on the East Side of the Hammock Dunes Bridge on the Barrier Island.

REQUESTED ACTION

Provide funding for a study and design for safety improvements to the intersection at the east side of the Hammock Dunes Bridge.

EFFECT

This project would ease congestion into the City of Flagler Beach and provide safety improvements to the intersection on the east side of the Hammock Dunes Bridge.



Requested Funding - \$ 10,000,000



Support Acquisition of Conservation Lands to Create a Floodplain Corridor to Protect Drinking Water Quality, Wildlife Habitats and Nearby Communities.

Flagler County recognizes the priority and vision of the Florida Wildlife Corridor, which gives priority to lands that preserve, protect or enhance wildlife habitats and corridors and linkages to agricultural and rural lands. Flagler County's Environmentally Sensitive Lands Program in Summer 2023 began outreach to private property owners in the western portion of Flagler County for the purpose of purchasing land along some groundwater recharge areas and surface water discharge areas along some of the primary tributaries to Haw Creek and "feeder" water creeks which feed into Crescent Lake.

Crescent Lake is fed primarily by Haw Creek which receives discharge from several smaller creeks including Little Haw Creek and Middle Haw creek. Crescent Lake feeds through Dunn's Creek to the St. Johns River.

The Middle Haw Creek flows to the northwest from southern reaches of the County into Haw Creek and west into Dead Lake and beyond. Little Haw Creek flows north from Lake Disston into Haw Creek and Dead Lake. Both systems function as discharge for surface water which ultimately flows into Crescent Lake and the St. Johns River and lie within the Florida Wildlife Corridor.

Locally referred to as "floodplain corridors" these connected properties shown in the attached map represent opportunities to conserve water quality and protect habitat for sensitive plants and for animals dependent on these habitats including the black bear. Although the County is prepared to consider either fee-simple acquisition or less-than-fee acquisition of conservation easements from "willing sellers", our hope is that these program efforts will help our citizens to maintain their way of life, whether that way of life includes protecting local landowners' ability to continue their farming operations or to provide recreation opportunities for citizens and visitors alike where possible.

The majority focus of our program will go towards identifying willing sellers and negotiating for the acquisition of properties that will meet these goals throughout our County. Primary focus should go towards those properties within the Florida Wildlife Corridor.



Support Acquisition of Conservation Lands withing the Wildlife Corridor to Protect Drinking Water Quality and Our way of Life.

REQUESTED ACTION

Provide local levels of funding to acquire tracts of land to create a floodplain on the West Side of Flagler County.

EFFECT

Creating a natural floodplain will provide flood risk reduction benefits by slowing runoff and storing flood water. It will also provide other benefits of considerable economic, social, and environmental value to include:

- •Fish and wildlife habitat protection
- •Natural flood and erosion control
- •Surface water quality maintenance
- •Groundwater recharge
- Biological productivity
- •Higher quality recreational opportunities
