This Code constitutes a complete codification of the general and permanent ordinances of the City of Palm Coast, Florida.

Source materials used in the preparation of the Code were the ordinances adopted by the city council. The source of each section is included in the history note appearing in parentheses at the end thereof. The absence of such a note indicates that the section is new and was adopted for the first time with the adoption of the Code. By use of the comparative tables appearing in the back of this Code, the reader can locate any section of any ordinance included herein.

The chapters of the Code have been conveniently arranged in alphabetical order, and the various sections within each chapter have been catchlined to facilitate usage. Notes which tie related sections of the Code together and which refer to relevant state law have been included. A table listing the state law citations and setting forth their location within the Code is included at the back of this Code.

Chapter and Section Numbering System

The chapter and section numbering system used in this Code is the same system used in many state and local government codes. Each section number consists of two parts separated by a dash. The figure before the dash refers to the chapter number, and the figure after the dash refers to the position of the section within the chapter. Thus, the second section of chapter 1 is numbered 1-2, and the first section of chapter 6 is 6-1. Under this system, each section is identified with its chapter, and at the same time new sections can be inserted in their proper place by using the decimal system for amendments. For example, if new material consisting of one section that would logically come between sections 6-1 and 6-2 is desired to be added, such new section would be numbered 6-1.5. New articles and new divisions may be included in the same way or, in the case of articles, may be placed at the end of the chapter embracing the subject, and, in the

F. ORDINANCES SECOND READ

2. ORDINANCE 2024-13 A PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF PALM COAST AMENDING ARTICLE VI, BUDGET AND APPROPRIATIONS TO DELETE FROM OUTDATED PROVISION RELATING TO LIMITATIONS TO COUNCIL'S CONTRACTING AUTHORITY WHICH SHALL BE CONSIDERED BY BALLOT

Attorney Duffy read the title into the record.

Vice Mayor Danko asked Attorney Duffy to read the ballot language into the record.

Vice Mayor Danko shared that he was not sure how the item relates to an emergency, that the language does not tell an individual what they are voting for, and found the language confusing.

City of Palm Coast Created on 7/29/24

Mayor Alfin asked Vice Mayor for any requested changes.

Vice Mayor Danko suggested to remove the word "emergency."

Mayor Alfin discussed emergency services and the magnitude of an emergency.

Council Member Klufas asked who the contracting authority is for emergencies.

Ms. Johnston provided a response.

City Council held lengthy discussion on national disasters, emergencies, and support from FEMA and the State of Florida.

Council Member Pontieri believed that the word "emergency" should be included and discussed budget, inflation, and provided a suggestion to remove the word "bond."

City Council held discussion on funding and bonds.

Attorney Blocker provided details of the item for consideration, limitations, challenges with FEMA, and encouraged flexibility.

Mayor Alfin asked if this can be described as another form of home rule.

Attorney Blocker responded yes and that the item allows the City more local control.

Mayor Alfin shared that as previously discussed by City Council, there will be a robust education campaign for voters on the topic.

City Council held lengthy discussion on the ballot language.

Public Comment:

Mike Norris was not in favor of the Ordinance and provided a recommendation.

Mayor Alfin wanted all Council Members to be aware of the timeline, education component, City staff availability for public questions on the topic, transparency, communication, and education.

Council Member Pontieri discussed constraints for future councils and recommended potential policy changes in an effort to ensure transparency and Council accountability.

Mayor Alfin asked Ms. Alves if the current policies protect the City financially.

Helena Alves, Financial Services Director, discussed the policies as set by Council and provided the process for adjusting the policy.

City of Palm Coast

Mayor Alfin asked Ms. Johnston to schedule a policy discussion at a future workshop as discussed and found it helpful to include in the educational component.

Vice Mayor Danko asked if this allows Council, including any future Council, to borrow freely.

Mayor Alfin responded that there will still be policies and requirements in place.

Council Member Klufas encouraged discussion on potential nefarious acts and how this action can be exploited.

Council Member Pontieri agreed with the comments of Council Member Klufas and sought details of the current policy.

Attorney Blocker read the title into the record.

Council Member Pontieri provided revised ballot language.

Attorney Blocker read the amended title into the record:
Shall Article VI of the Charter be amended by removing provision (3)(e) related to fiscal Contracting Authority that limits the City's ability to enter into public private partnerships, have the ability to address growth by having future residents contribute to infrastructure costs, respond to emergencies and use available financial instruments including, but not limited to, bonds.

You are hereby notified of this Demand to Immediately Cease and Desist.

From making or causing to make any and all changes to the Existing Sovereign Power of the Palm Coast Charter which govern the City of Palm Coast.

For the remainder of your terms of office and pending ongoing investigations.

For individually (and or) collectively, you are in violation of, (one or more), but not limited to the current Palm Coast Charter, Sunshine Laws, Florida Statute, Federal Laws and the U.S. Constitution.

The Purpose of this Demand is to maintain the Status Quo, to Protect the Rights of the People and Prevent Further Harm to the Citizens of Palm Coast.

This action is taken based on the recent discoveries revealed to me through Public Live testimonies at the City's Town Council Meetings, witnessed on August 27,2024 and Sept.03,2024.

My observations conclude that the scope of violations may include but are not limited to the following:



Mayor Alfin, Ed Danko, Teresa Pontieri, Nick Klufas have all placed a Deceptive Referendum on the ballot to Vote at the Upcoming Election. To remove Provision 3e.

This will remove the citizens right to vote,

Remove the spending cap

and the 36 month repayment deadline.

It will also give them Full Financial Power and Say of All Growth.

They have already violated the charter, Sunshine laws, local, Florida Statutes and the U.S. Constitution.

They seem to be in heavy with Developers for a Westward Expansion.

Willing to Bankrupt Palm Coast Residents for Generations to do so.

There is \$105,000,000,00. of state funds that have already been misappropriated while current infrastructure is in desperate need.

Our Cities Mayor and Council Members have plotted to put a referendum with misleading language on our ballot for the upcoming election. This is to vote to Change the Charter by removing Provision (3)(e). The language in the proposed amendment is misleading and has caused quit an up roar in our city the past 2 weeks. If passed, we will lose our right to vote, we won't have a voice on the development of our community, it will change the form of our local government and allow Council unlimited use of funds with no repayment deadline and no accountability. The language going on the ballot reads as follows;

Shall Article VI of the Charter be amended by removing provision (3)(e) related to fiscal Contracting Authority that limit the City's ability to enter into public private partnerships, have the ability to address growth by having future residents contribute to infrastructure costs, respond to emergencies and use available financial instruments including, but not limited to, bonds.

One of the Council Members, Teresa Pontieri responsible for writing this is an attorney and ended up voting to have it removed from the ballot but they did a suspicious 50/50 vote with an absent council member and an empty resigned seat. Both present council member voted it off. The Mayor, who's vote counts to break a tie, voted to keep it on. Then an absent Council member or someone representing him on a voice call voted with the Mayor to keep it on. So it remains on the ballot against the people's demand for removal. And now we also have to be worned about how it's titled on the ballot. Title has not been revealed yet.

The original Charter Provision Protects the rights of the people, protects our votes, sets a \$15,000,000,00. Spending Cap and Sets a 36 month Repayment Deadline. It's easy for them to just ask for more time and more money. There is evidence that the current Charter has already been violated of these terms. There is \$105,000,000,000. In State funds meant for our local infrastructure that was "accidently" without approval, been redirected to a Westward Expansion project that has not been approved and has not started. None of this was approved by the electors of the City which are currently the people of Palm Coast. All while they were trying to get us to agree to a \$90,000,000,00. Stadium and Commercial Development in that Westward Expansion. While our local infrastructure suffers. The sudden announcement of the \$105 Million was brought to our attention as if it were an accident. Councilwoman Pontieri is quoted as saying she "doesn't expect a check back to the state of Florida but expects quite a bit in infrastructure." Another Councilwoman resigned August 19th. Possibly because of this. 3 of the other seats were just voted out in the recent Primary. The Mayor and these council members are trying to cover their butts. By forcing an immediate change in our local government that would allow them to have no accountability for the damages already done, continue to bankrupt our City and cause irreparable harm to the citizens of Palm Coast.

By Removing or changing this Charter Provision (3)(e), the vote of the people will be replaced with Council & controlled by Developers. Which they may have ties to. One councilman offered to set me up with an attorney and told me to keep quiet and just follow the attorneys lead. It seems like he is desperately trying to save his own butt. I told him not to contact me any further, that I have formed my own opinions just from the 2 council meetings I attended. I have all my information gathered and need to talk to someone about what we can legally do to stop them. It's been said that the Mayor is also part of a special interest group. It appears they are doing this for personal gains.


The current Charter Provision (3)(e) reads as follows


Remedies Sought:

Expressly prohibited by law. Title VII Chapter 166.021—Powers. The deceptive language proposes to remove Charter Provision (3)(e). Our current Charter laws protects the voice and vote of the citizens of Palm Coast and sets limits on the city's ability to enter into public private partnerships, sets a \$15,000,000.00 cap on spending and sets a 36 month repayment deadline. Original Charter, Provision (3)(e) Language:

"Unless authorized by the electors of the city at a duly held referendum election, the Council shall not enter into lease purchase contracts or any other unfunded multiyear contracts, the repayment of which: extends in excess of 36 months; or exceeds \$15,000,000,00."

Language for the ballot to remove Provision (3)(e)

Shall Article VI of the Charter be amended by removing provision (3)(e) related to fiscal Contracting Authority that limit the City's ability to enter into public private partnerships, have the ability to address growth by having future residents contribute to infrastructure costs, respond to emergencies and use available financial instruments including, but not limited to, bonds.

Descriptions of further Concerns of Violations;

Mayors Misuse Of Voting Privileges - Chapter 260.030 (6)

The Mayors vote counts toward breaking ties of the council, not to create a tie.

Misleading Presence of Council Members for Voting Purposes

Violation of Sun Shine law, that a requisite # of members must be physically present to create a quorum for voting purposes. On Sept.03,2024, only 2 council members and the Mayor were physically present to vote on the referendum to be removed from the ballot. Both present council members, Mr. Danko and Ms. Pontieri voted yes to have it removed. Mayor Alfin voted No, along with Councilman Klufas who was not physical present in his attendance.

Misused Vote Of an "Absent" Council Member

Council member Klufas or someone acting on his behalf was on a voice call. Both Mayor and Absent Councilman voted against removing the referendum. Creating a tie to keep the intended referendum and its deceptive language on the ballot.

Changing the Form Of Government / Violation of Our Constitutional Rights

By removing Charter Provision (3)(e). The citizens of Palm Coast will lose our rights to vote. Vacant Seat

A seat on the Council was resigned on August 19,2024, effective on August 23,2024. It is now 2 months before the next scheduled election, plenty of time to add candidates for this seat to the ballot. Charter law states that Council can only appoint if the seat becomes empty more than 6 months of a scheduled election and gives them 90 days to do so. Anything within 6 months of a scheduled election belongs to the vote of the electors of Palm Coast. If Necessary, with time constraints, this would call for a special election to fill that seat.
