

- The FCSO is the largest and only full Flagler County.
- We provide all police services for the City of Palm Coast, Town of Beverly Beach, Town of Marineland, as well as the unincorporated areas. We support Flagler Beach and Bunnell Police Departments.
- We provide all court and detention services in Flagler County and our jail is the Sheriff Perry Hall Inmate Detention Facility (AKA: The Green Roof Inn) with a capacity of 404 inmates.
- We also currently operate the 911 center in Flagler County which answers and dispatches all 911 and non - emergency calls for police, fire, and medical services.
- There are more than 400 FT & Volunteer members of FCSO serving you!


TRAFFIC FATALITIES




Total Crashes in 2023 VS 2024


Historic Crime Reduction Flagler County Population and Crime Rate 2017-2024 – includes Palm Coast

79% felt safe from violent crime




PALM COAST SAFETY and CRIME RANKINGS



The Breakdown of Average Costs per Deputy - \$155,642





Sheriff Office 2026 Budget Breakdown








The Breakdown – Per Capita Cost of LE Services by Flagler County Jurisdictions

The chart to the left shows the cost per capita comparison for law enforcement services to residents in Flagler County.







FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES/CHALLENGES

- Palm Coast is 18th Fastest Growing City in the United States (Source: FL 5/18/2023)
- Palm Coast population has growth 22.98% since 2020 census (Source: Data USA/WorldPopulationReview.com)
- Palm Coast average growth rate is 3.88% annually but grew 4.5% between 2023-2024 (Source: WorldPopulationReview.com and DNJ)
- Palm Coast is Ffastest Growing City in Volusia/Flagler area (Source: Daytona News Journal May 16,2025)
- Palm Coast Current Population is 110,362 (Source: WorldPopulationReview.com
- Jacksonville criminals are increasingly coming to Flagler County/Palm Coast to Commit Crimes
- Daytona and Palatka criminal element connection to Bunnell and Palm Coast
- Technology has helped us reduce crime BUT
 - Need deputies to respond when LPR hits occur or technology is useless •
 - Crime is trending down again in 2025, but quality of life calls are increasing but don't get counted by FBI NIBRS (UCR) – car crashes, disturbances, mental health, suspicious incidents, etc. Need for multiple response based on call type and Deputy safety.
 - To do this must maintain and increase staffing as community grows or you risk losing ground




- Teaches practical job skills through training courses.
