Academic Progress & Improvements

During my tenure as superintendent from 2012 – 2016, there were many circumstances that changed and/or directly impacted academic progress and measurement. The State of Florida changed academic standards from Next Generation Sunshine State Standards to Common Core Standards and then to "Florida Standards". With that change came new course descriptions, more rigor and a substantially more rigorous accountability system for schools and districts. In the span of just a few years, the changes made at the state level resulted in decreased "levels of performance" all over the state because of the new school grading system. Our superintendents association made sure the parents of our students understood their children had not ceased learning, rather, the rules of the game changed in the middle of the game. If a student decreased on the FSA due to the more rigorous test, we were able to show parents student growth through other programs such as iReady, Think through Math, and Stanford 10 scores. Florida schools, parents, and all stakeholders have had to learn a lot about the accountability process in order to understand that our kids are still learning and our schools are still doing a good job.

Even with all of that upheaval, I am pleased that our schools stayed on level with surrounding districts and showed significant progress in grades K-2. School year 2014-2015 was the first year we began utilizing digital devices for each student in grades K-3. The teachers used the devices to integrate project-based learning into their curriculum. Our Stanford 10 Scores showed significant positive changes in both reading and math. Our highest poverty elementary school showed the most growth and best achievement in Kindergarten in the entire district for two years running. I am convinced the excitement generated by the classroom teachers in utilizing the technology transferred to the students and made their learning more authentic and enjoyable.

One of my schools, Sneads Elementary School, maintained a grade of "A" during my entire tenure even with all of the changes from the state level. Those teachers have shared their curriculum maps and progress monitoring tools to help other teachers in the district change their instructional practices to best meet their students' needs and ensure students are ready for rigorous Florida Standards Assessments. The elementary curriculum director I hired during my tenure is a seasoned veteran teacher and administrator from that school, and I have already seen improvements she's made to elementary curriculum for the district.

One of my secondary schools, Sneads High School, was recognized as the only secondary school in the state of Florida to be named as a National Title I Distinguished School because of the success of their educational programs and progress made by the students.

Jackson County maintained a district grade of B during my tenure and I feel confident with some of the initiatives that I began, they are on their way to being an A district very soon.
