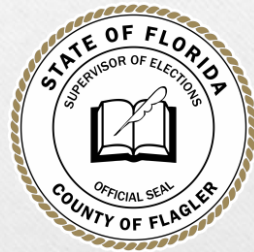

What are precincts?

Voting precinct boundaries are drawn locally, in each county and approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

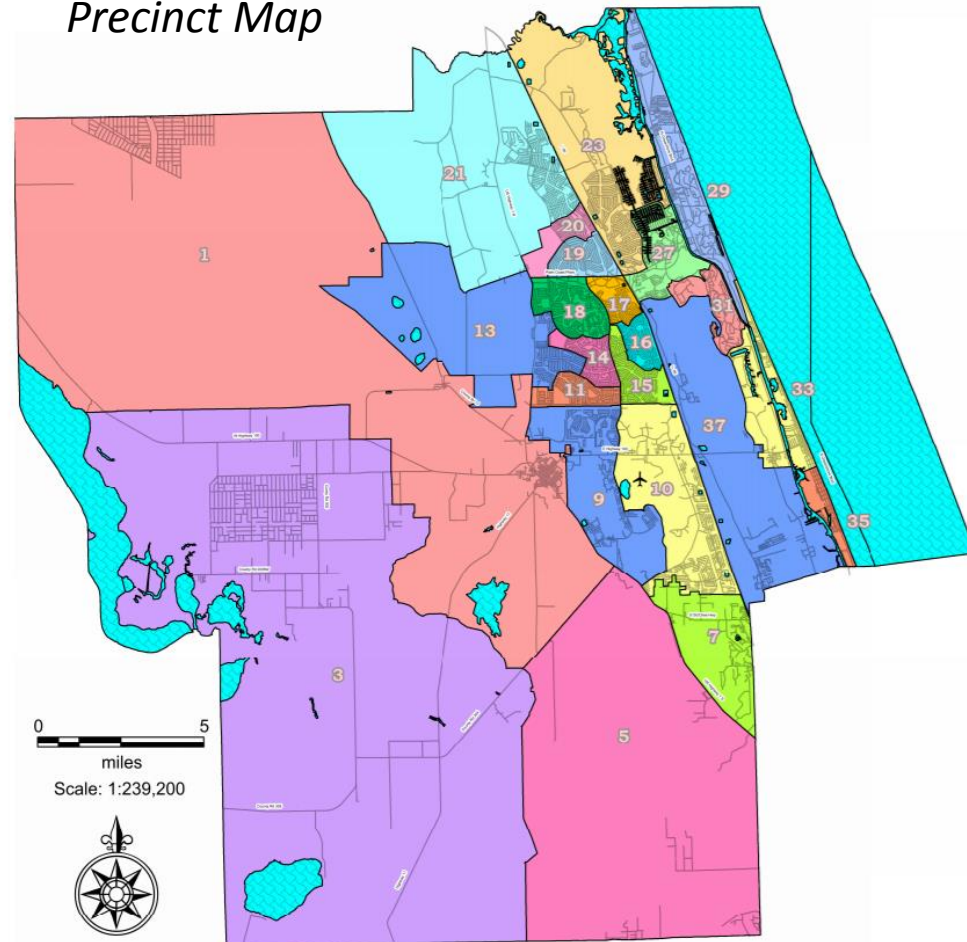
Election returns to the Department of State are reported at the precinct level.

Election Day voting occurs within precincts, or at combined polling locations.

Precincts are not representative districts.

U.S. Census block data must be used to change precinct boundaries.

When was the last change?

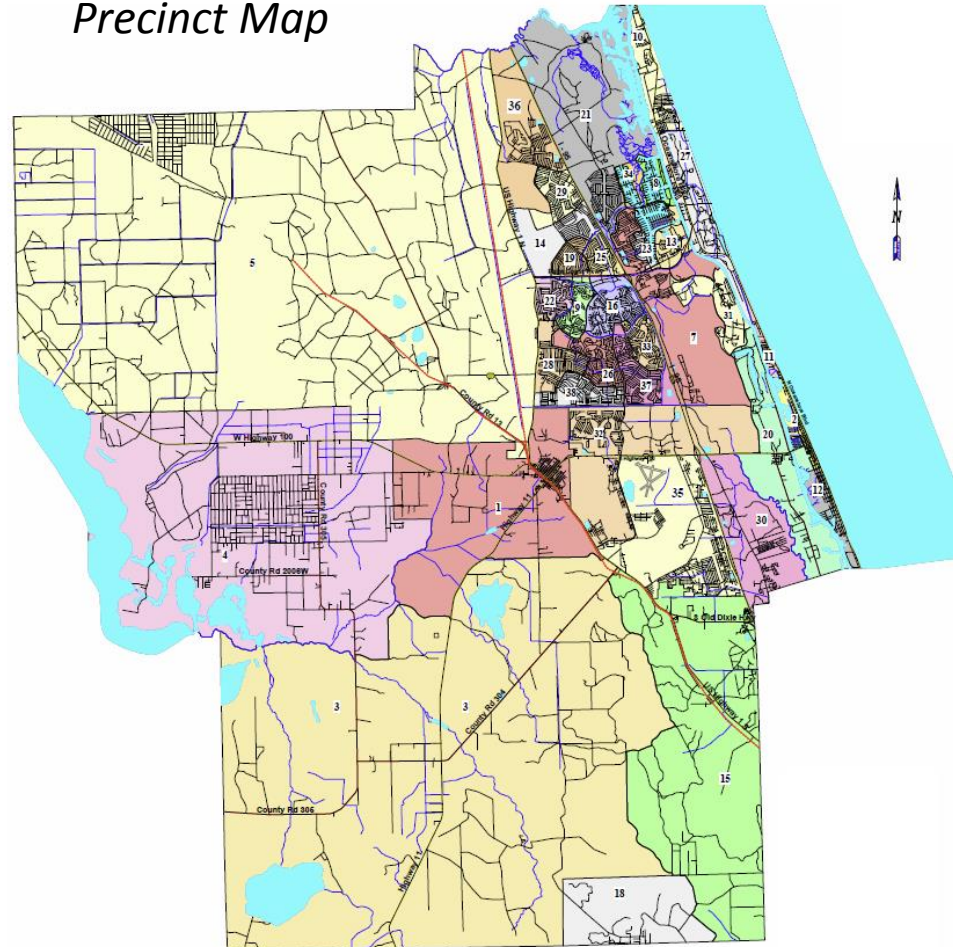
Five years ago, in May 2012, the precinct boundaries were adjusted to accommodate redistricting which follows the decennial census.

Precincts were reduced from **35** to **23**.

The consolidation effectively closed **12** polling locations and shifted more than half of the county's voting population.

This shift has created densely populated precincts in our county.

Why change precinct boundaries now?

Flagler County is now a **medium-sized county** based upon voter registration totals. We are growing!

Main focus areas:

- Safety and accessibility
- Cost benefit analysis
- Accommodate future growth
- Timing

Considerations:

- 2016 General Turnout - Precinct **VS.** Early Voting and Mail
- *How many people are voting in their precinct on Election Day?*

How much does a new precinct cost?

Approximately \$11,937

Poll Workers

- 6 workers = \$1,225

Ballots

- Election Day (Primary) = \$1,206

Each precinct creates an additional style for EV and VBM, not included.

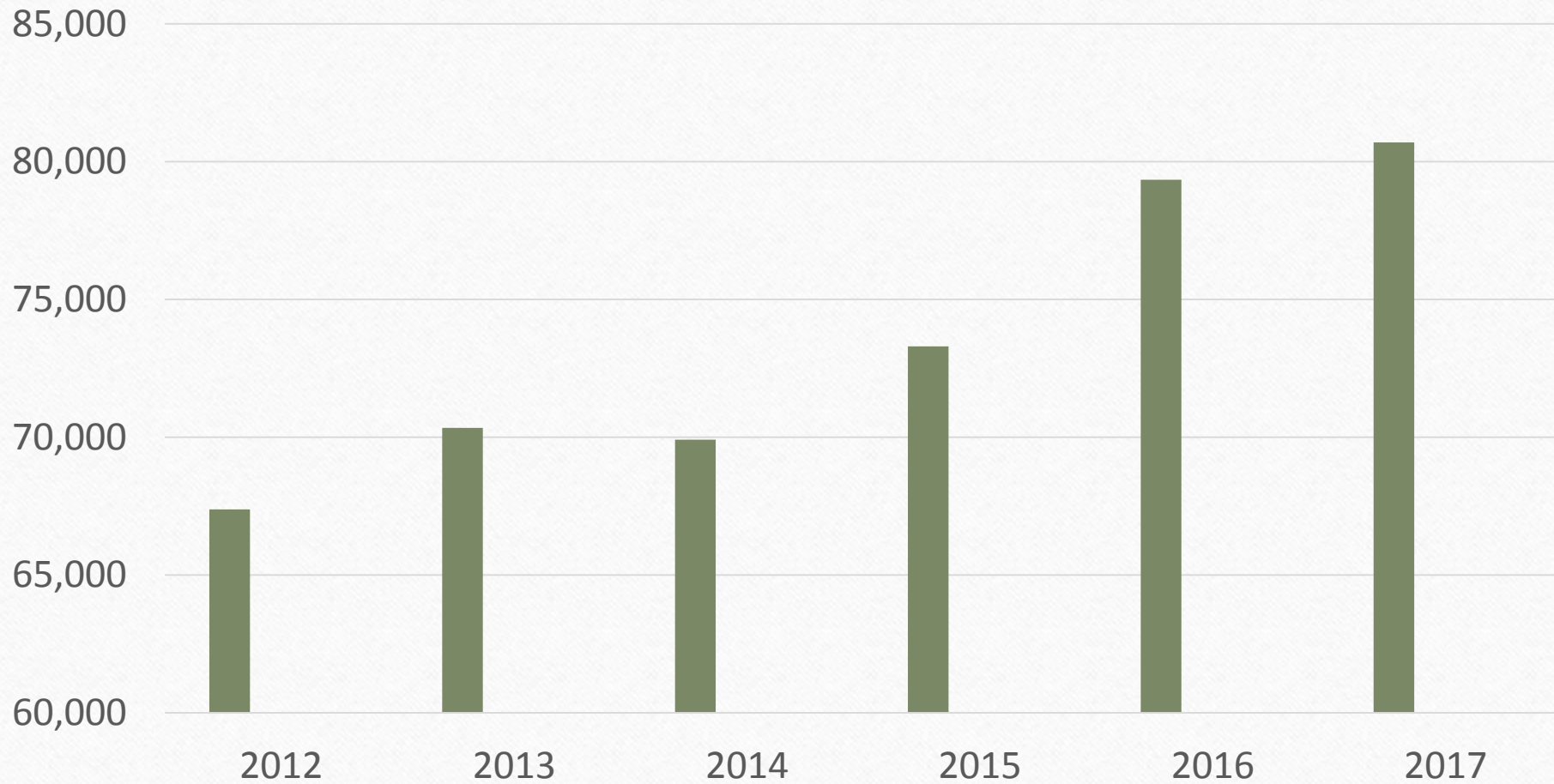
Equipment & Maintenance

- EViD check-in (3) = \$3,293
- Annual maintenance for voting system = \$3,496

Supplies

- Secured cage for delivery, voting booths, etc. = \$2,717

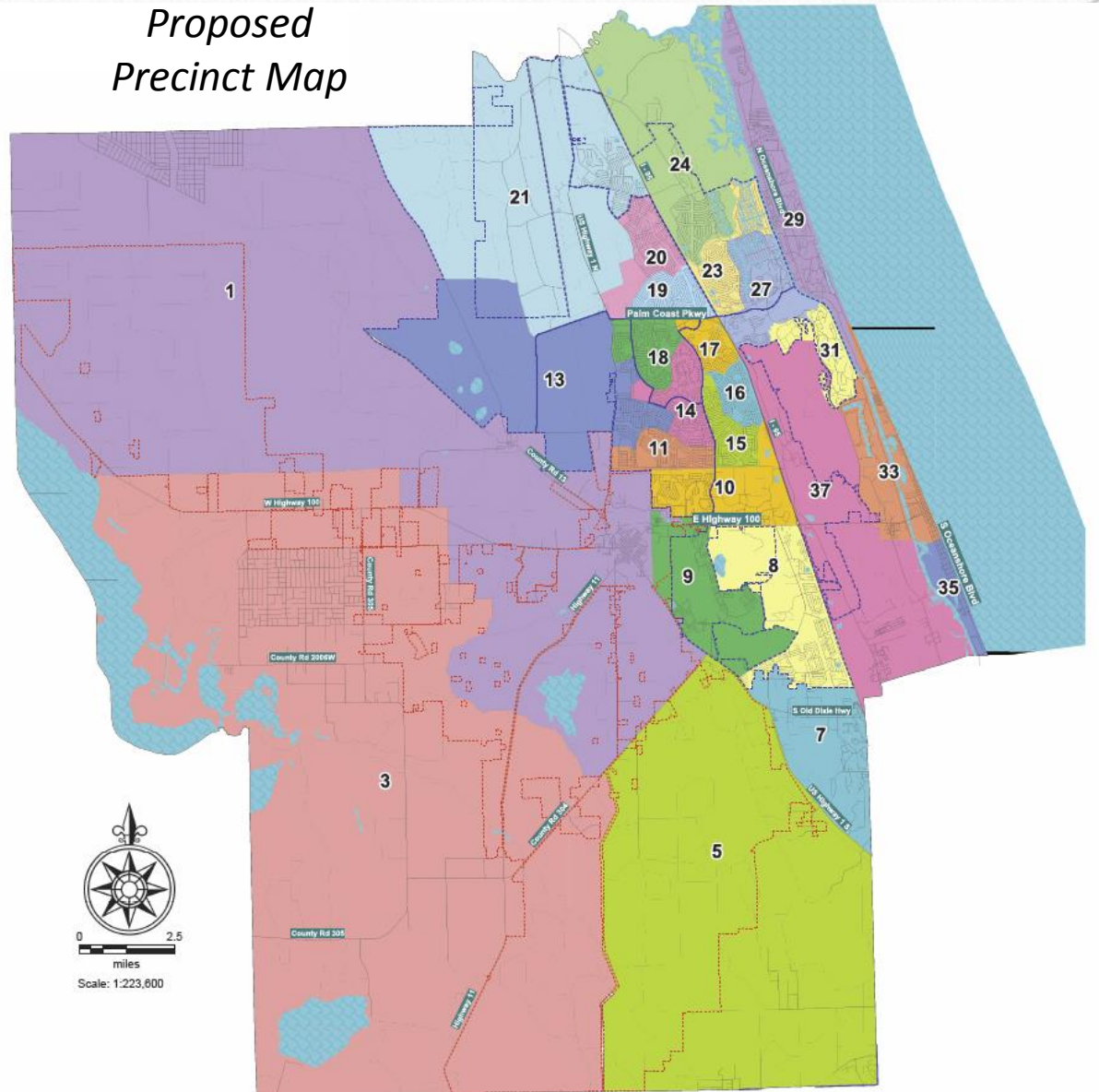

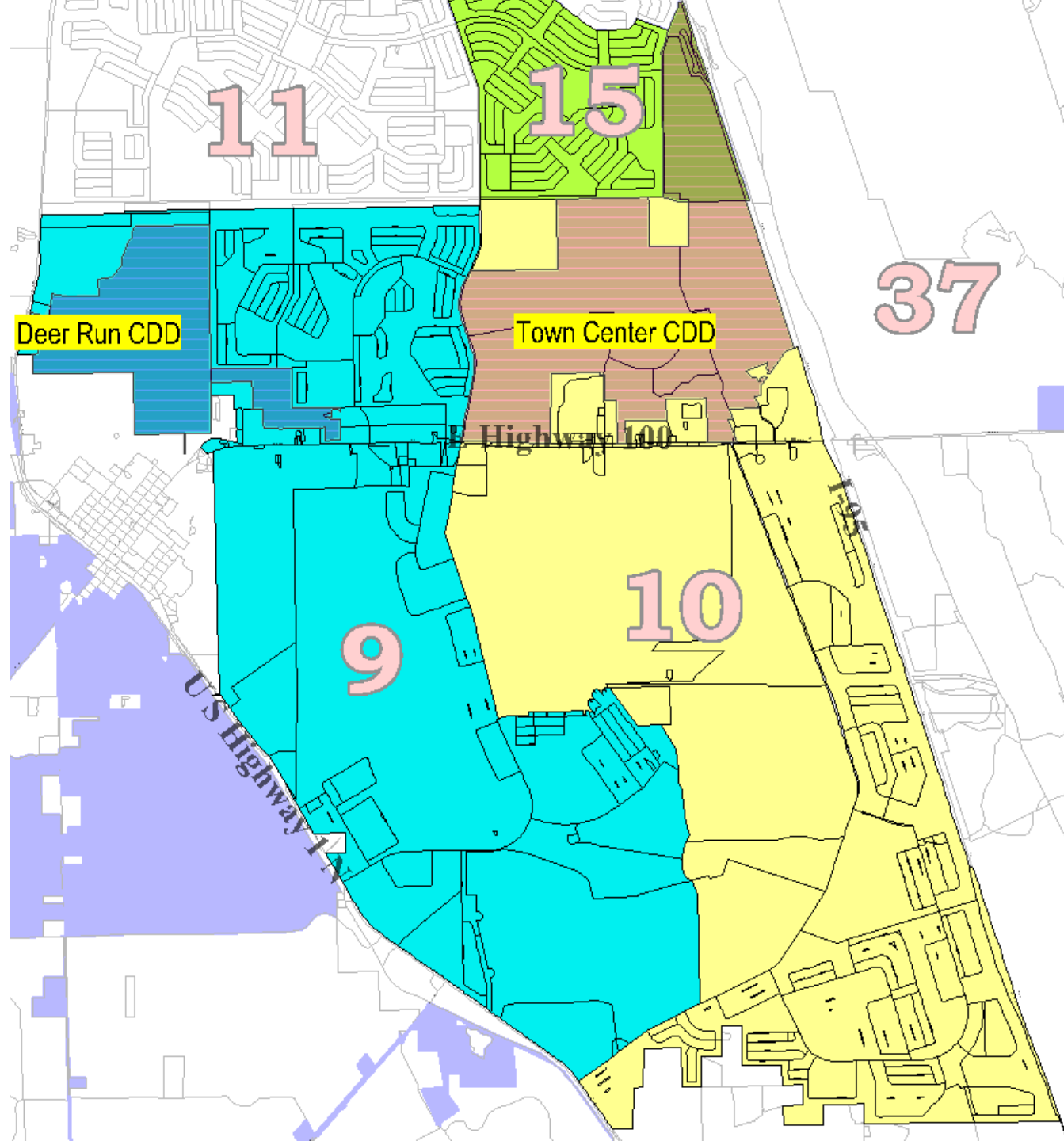
How are precincts changing?

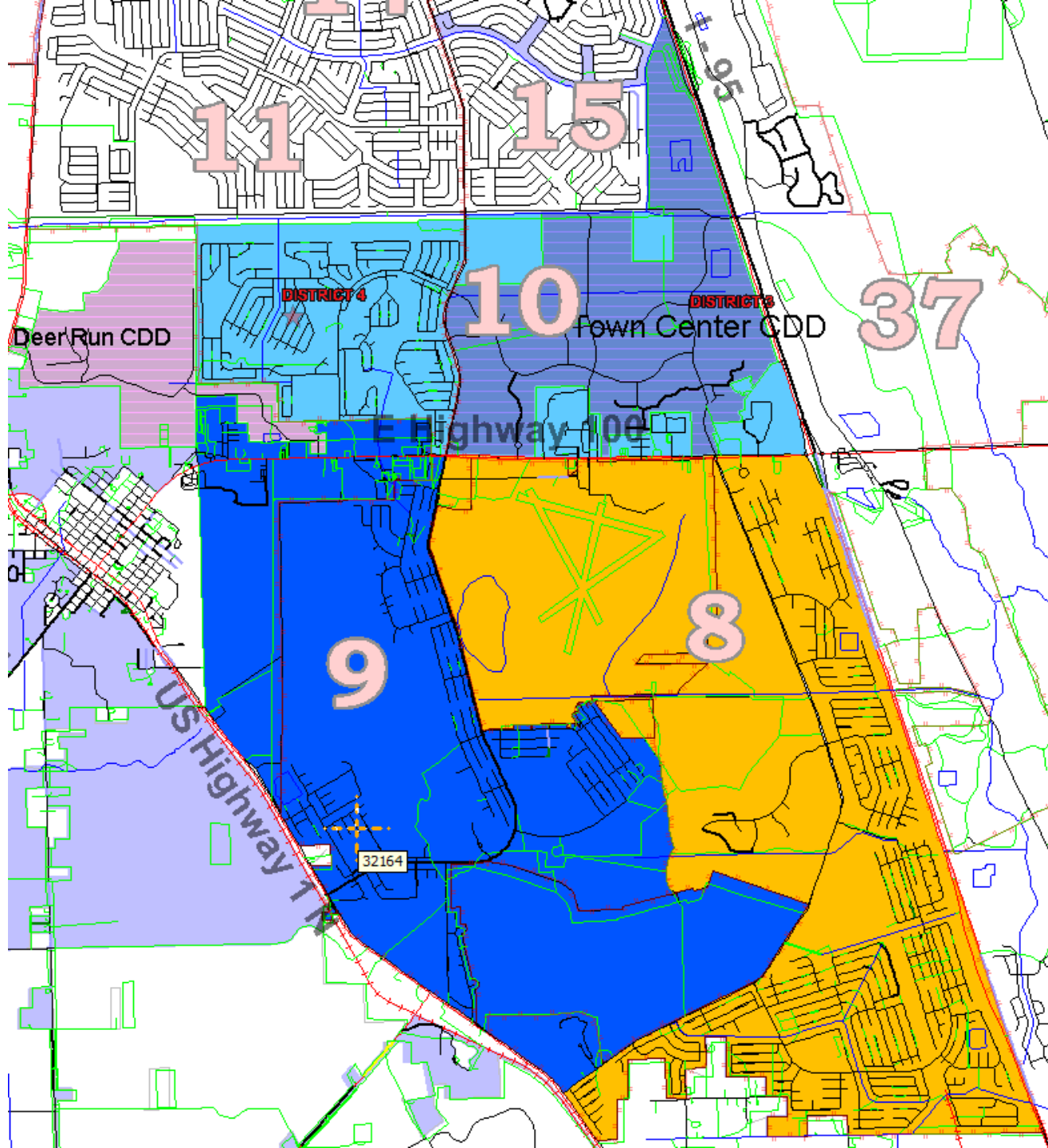
Adjustments:

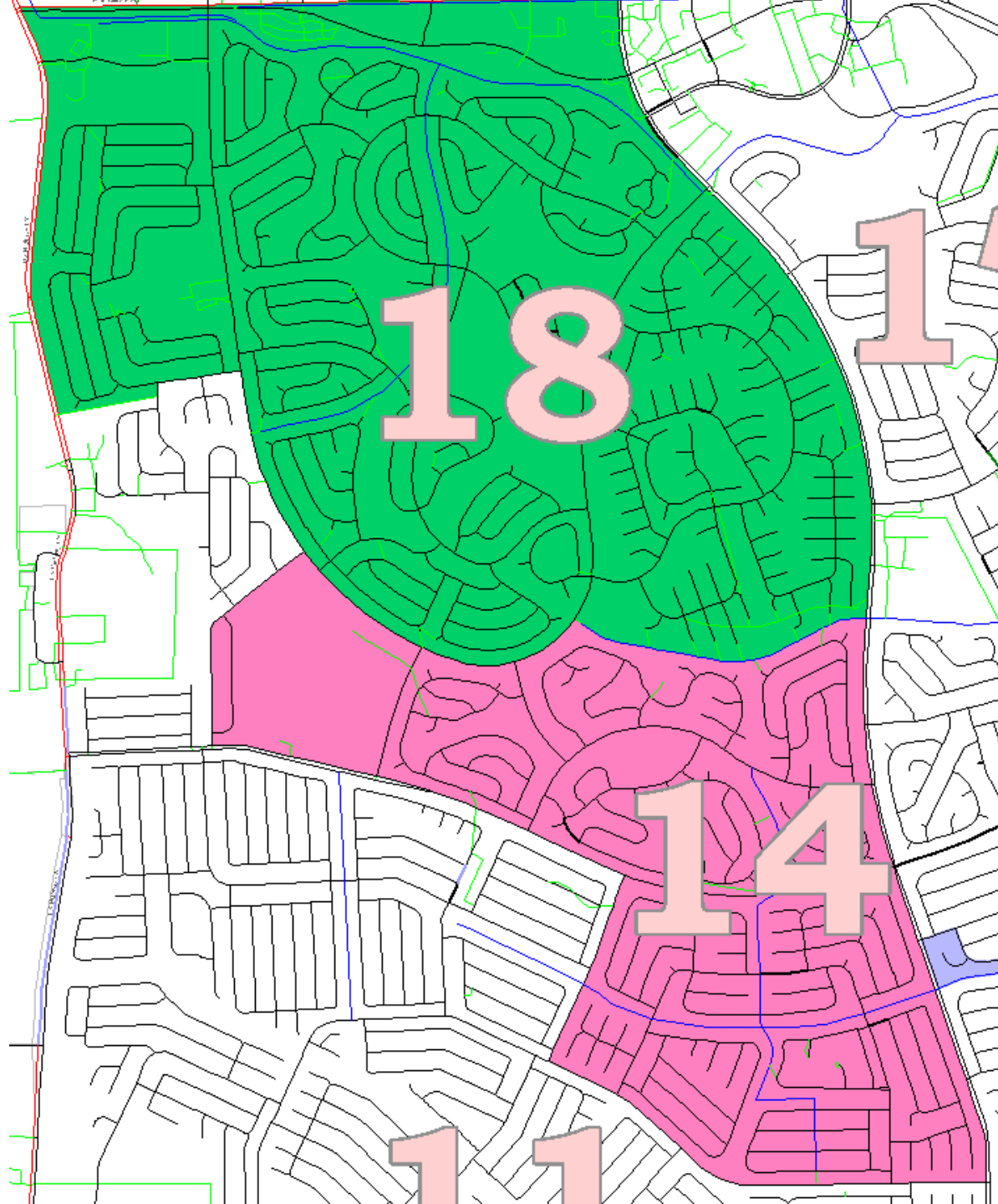

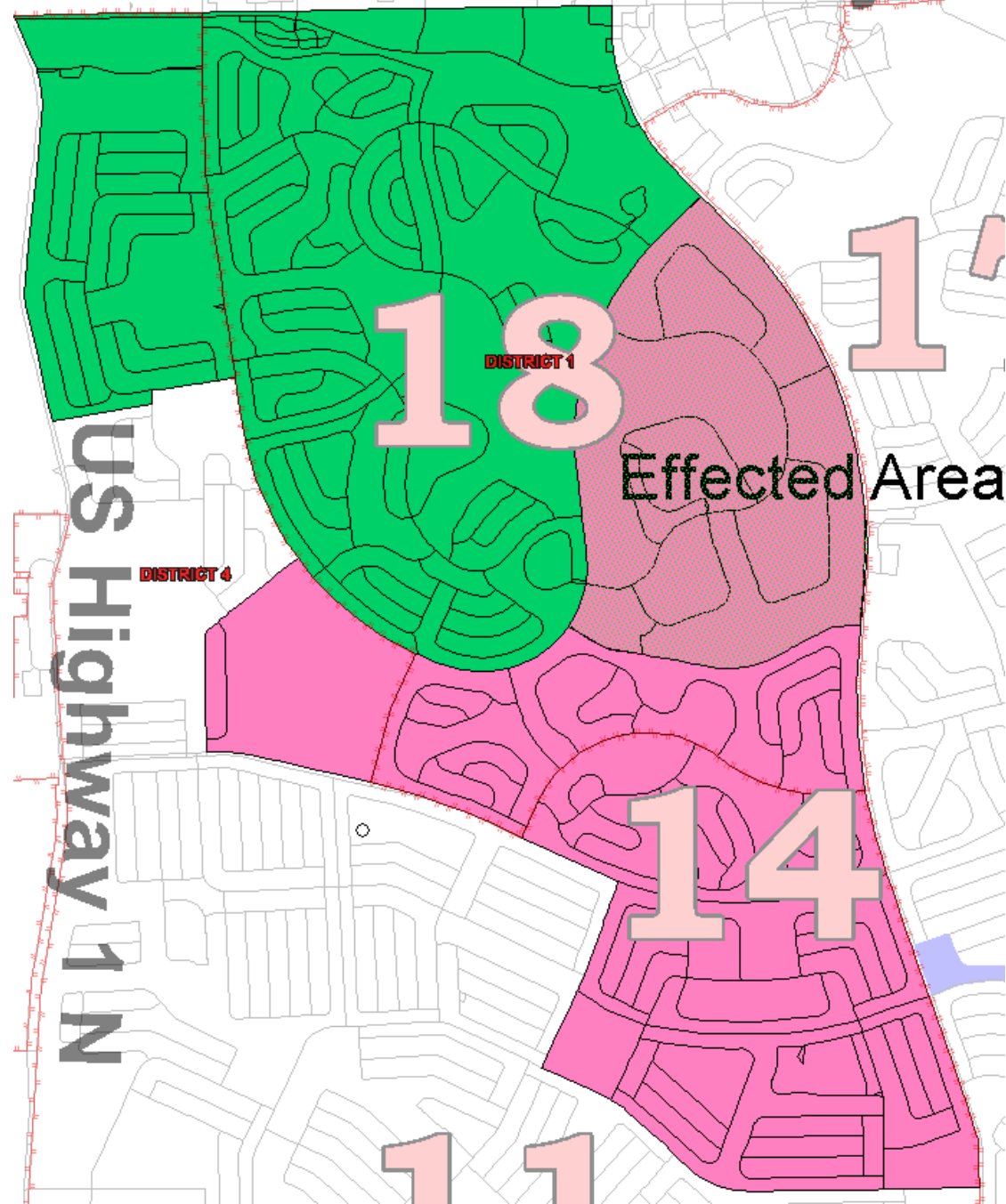

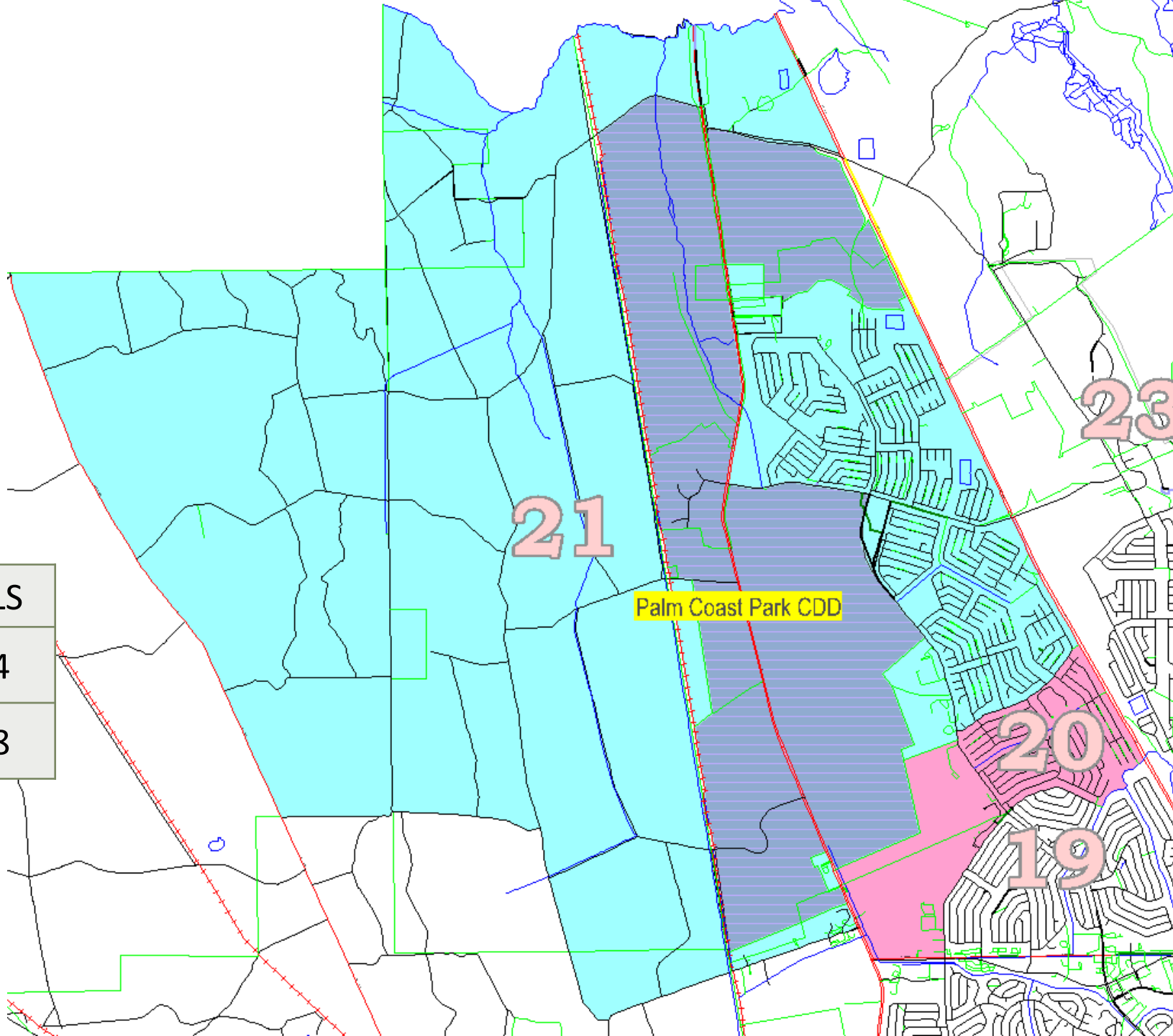

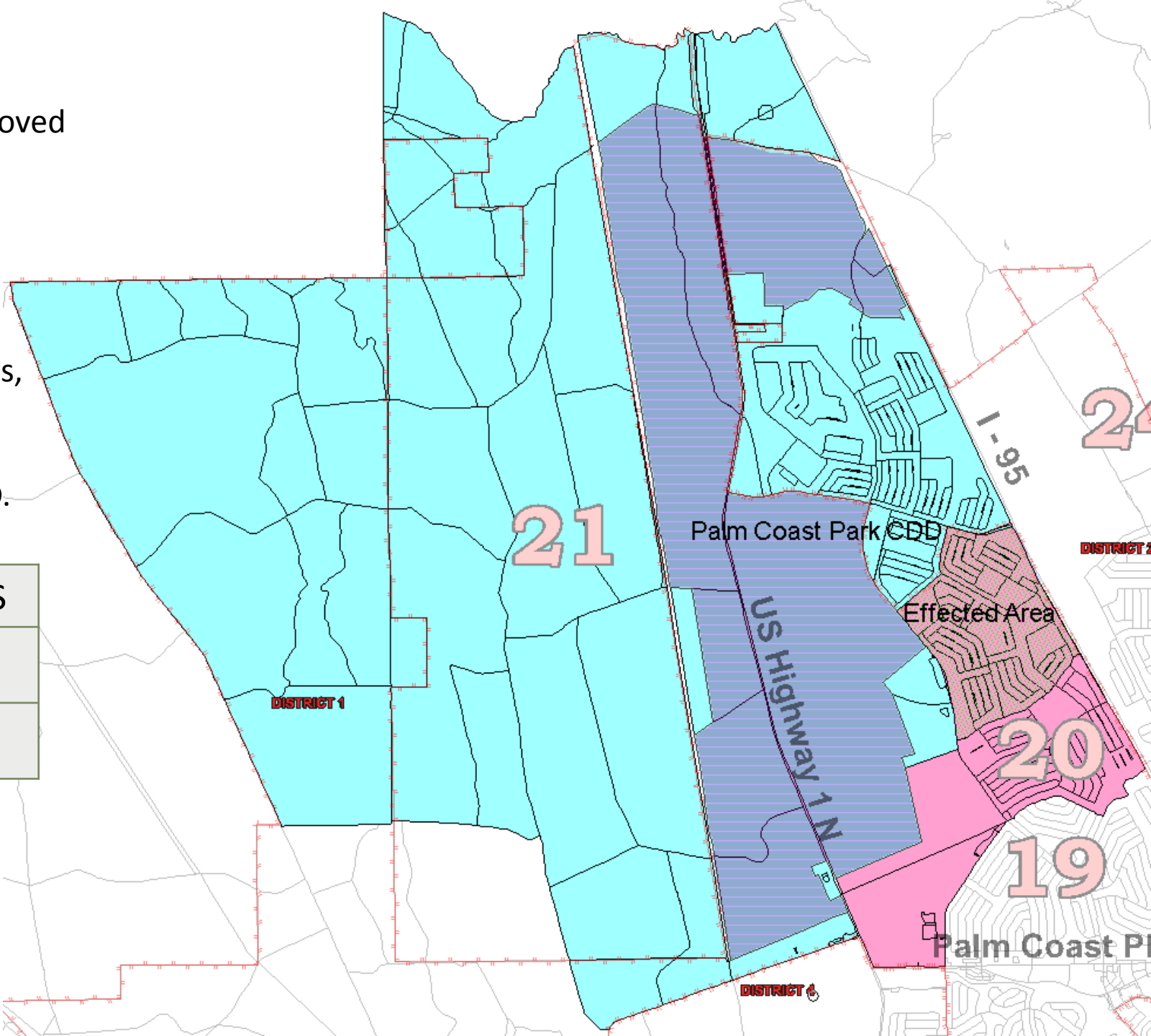

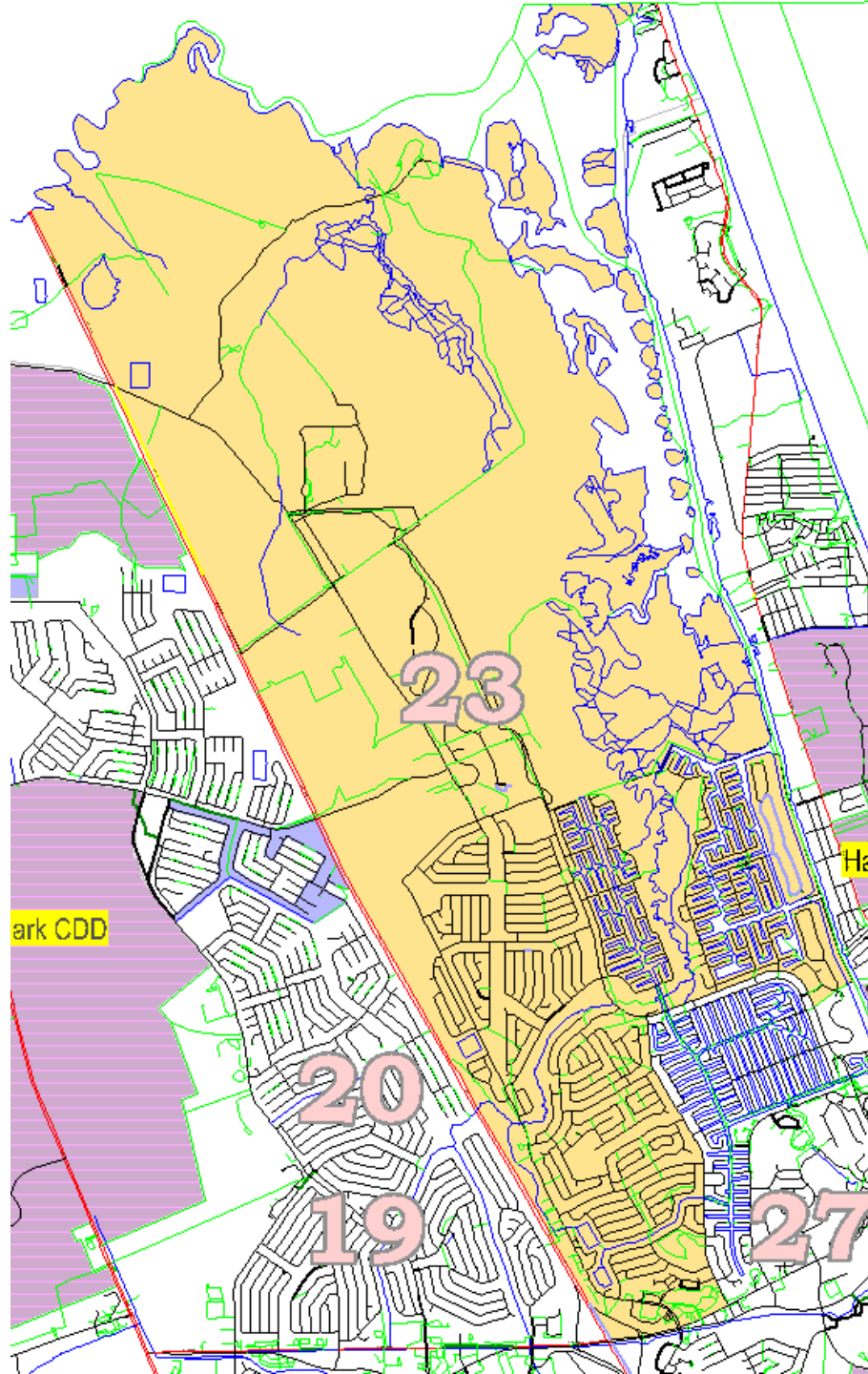

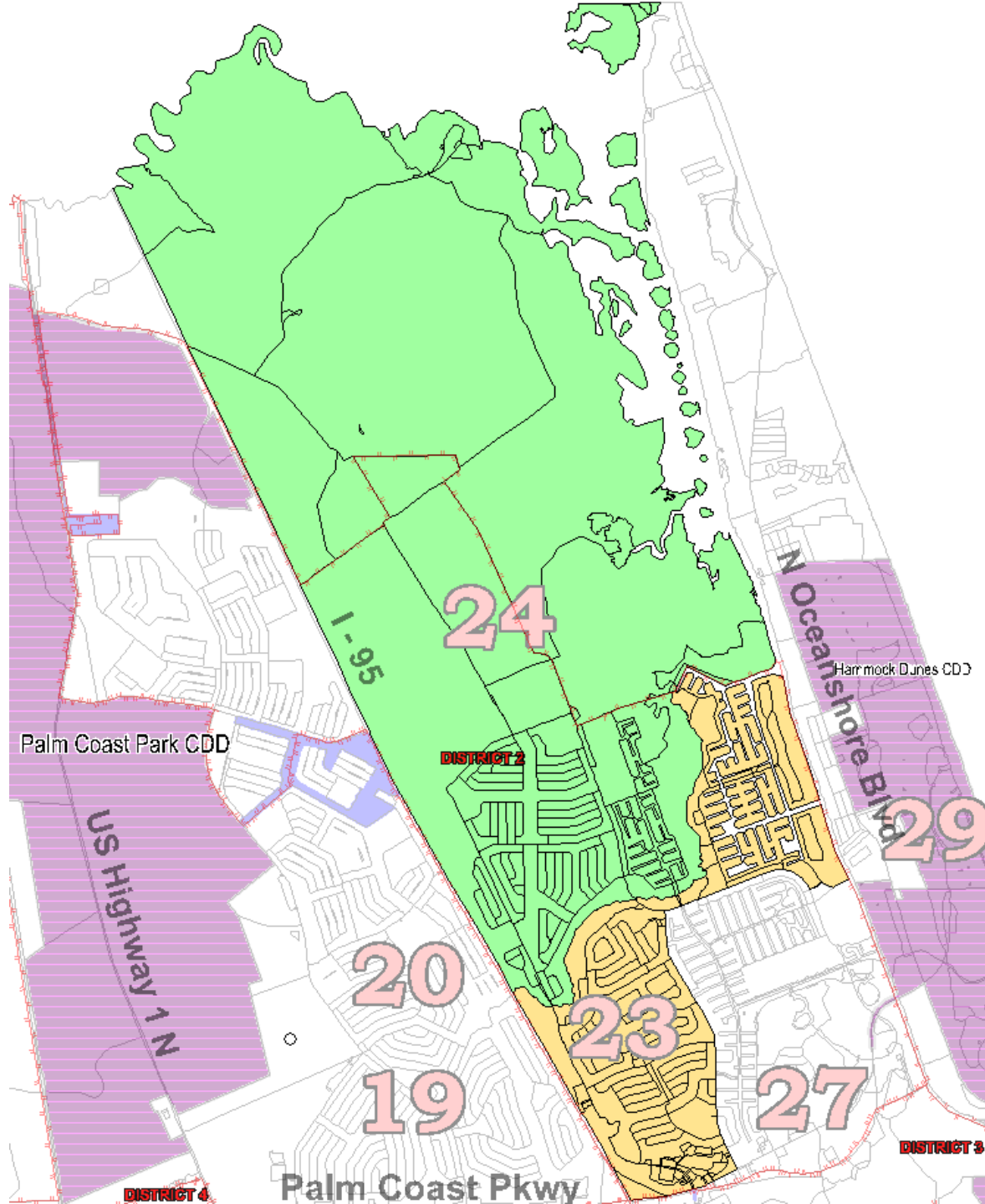

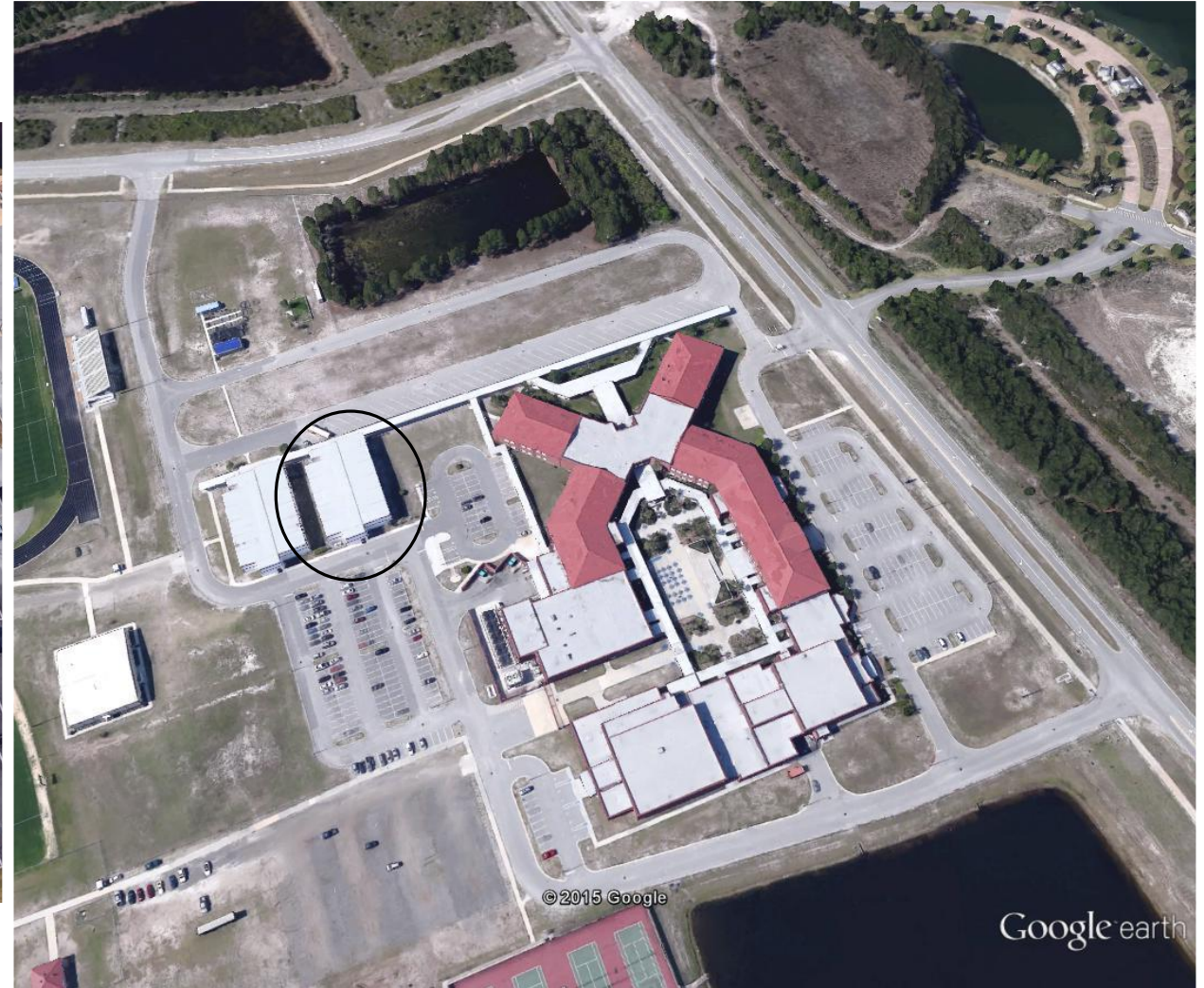
