Traffic Crash / 2017-99446 / Old Dixie and US1 / At about 130am received a call of an over turned vehicle, a motorcycle on fire and possibly a third vehicle involved in a crash. Upon arrival it was determined that it was a single vehicle roll over and the engine was ripped from the vehicle and caught fire, blocking north bound US1. The vehicle snapped and completely flipped a utility pole, causing the wires to rest on the cables holding up the flashing lights for the intersection. US1 and Old Dixie was shut down in every direction, until FPL arrived and determined it was safe for vehicle to travel under the cables. South bound lanes were opened as soon as it was considered safe. Northbound was closed for several hours, until the engine and other parts were moved from the roadway.
