### Part One UCR Crimes: Type of Call / Case Number / Address / Case Summary

Disturbance Physical / 2017-41282 / Faircastle Lane, Palm Coast /Deputies responded to a physical disturbance between boyfriend and girlfriend. Upon deputies' arrival, Subject 1 (S1) Michael D. Person (B/M 2-11-93) was observed yelling and screaming in the front yard of the residence naked. Sgt. Neat made contact with S1 and Victim 1 (V1). S1 grabbed V1 by the head and attempted a chokehold. Sgt. Neat deployed his taser and the male was taken into custody after multiple deployments. S1 was found to be under the influence of LSD and was transported to FHF for medical clearance. While at FHF, S1 became combative and kicked Dep. J. Williams in the mouth, causing a bloody lip. S1 was charged with domestic battery, resisting arrest without violence and battery on a law enforcement officer. See report by Dep. Parker.

### Non-Part One Crimes: Missing Persons, Traffic Fatality, Use of Force, Weapons

Missing / Recovered Endangered Adult / 2017-41208 / Prince John Lane, Palm Coast / Zone 4 / Deputies were called to the above residence reference Missing 1 (M1) Miodrag Stojadinovich (W/M 09-04-1929), who suffers from dementia missing from the residence. M1 was last seen at approximately 5:30 p.m. by the caretaker. Several deputies, K9-4, Flagler County's Fireflight, VCSO's Air-One helicopter and eventually Tomoka Correctional Institution's bloodhounds all responded to track M1. After a long search, M1 was still not found. Contact was made again with VCSO for air support using heat-seeking equipment. Air-One responded and within two minutes M1 was found in a vacant lot on Prince Eric Drive. M1 was medically cleared and returned to the group home. See report by Dep. Santoianni for further.
