<b>Follow up Stolen Vehicle</b>	20-149	Garden Street	While on scene at a verbal disturbance at 3 Ranber Ln, Deputy Schmidt made contact with a white male that had multiple neck tattoos which he recalled being similar to the description of several males involved in yesterday's stolen vehicle incident. Upon further investigation it was discovered that the male was one in the same and provided law enforcement with his account from yesterday's incident. The male was cooperative and provided vital information and details which led to the location and recovery of the stolen Lexus. The vehicle was located at 1 Beech Pl and was parked directly in front of the residence. Several witnesses, who gave written statements, advised that S1 was the person in possession of the vehicle and was driving it around. Surveillance footage from two neighbors confirmed that he was in possession of the vehicle. Contact was made with him and under Miranda, he advised he was driving the car. Vehicle recovered and removed from FCIC/NCIC and returned to registered owners on scene. Report made x3
<b>Stolen tag</b>	20-438	Barley Ln	RP advised the tag off his trailer was stolen sometime between today and December 1, 2019. Unknown when tag was taken and no suspect info. Tag entered into FCIC/NCIC by dispatch. Report made Deputy Sanchez and FTO Quintieri.
<b>Larceny</b>	20-431	US 1 South (Ponderosa Trailer Park)	RP reported that an unknown person stole her 1998 Lance Legend slide in truck bed camper valued at \$7,500 sometime between December 27, 2019 and today. The camper was entered into NCIC as stolen.
<b>Stolen Vehicle</b>	20-492	Oleander Avenue	RP reported that an unknown person stole his 1995 black Honda Accord LX 4 door with a rusted rear quarter panel, sunroof, and shiny rims. RP had not registered the vehicle since he purchased it in July. The vehicle was inoperable, with a flat tire and dead battery. Tire tracks in the driveway, make it appear that the vehicle was pulled by another vehicle when it was removed. The vehicle was entered into NCIC as stolen.
