14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The project includes a 4,290 sq ft addition to Flagler Technical College for 3 lab/classroom spaces. Classrooms will be used to alleviate student waiting lists and expand Career and Technical Education (including apprenticeship and preapprenticeship programs), GED and ESOL classes. Flagler County School District supports the Governor's initiative to be #1 in the nation by the year 2030 in CTE. Programs will connect secondary CTE offerings with dual enrollment and postsecondary opportunities for students. Programs offered will also be in line with business and industry training needs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities include a 4,290 square foot addition to BLDG 1 at our Central Services Complex for Flagler Technical College. The building project will include the cost of the Architect, Engineers, Structural Engineer, Civil Engineer, Construction Manager.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Once the expansion project is complete, additional educational services will be provided to citizens through expanded capacity to offer CTE and GED/ESOL classes. This project will alleviate student wait lists due to limited facility capacity.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The targeted population are underserved individuals without a high school diploma, those with limited English language skills, and those seeking to become economically self sufficient through earning a career certificate and/or industry credential in targeted local demand areas. Approximately 200 students yearly will be served through the addition of these three classrooms.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The benefit of this project is that student wait lists due to limited facilities will be eliminated. Students will be able to enroll and begin their education and career path sooner. It will also provide much needed classroom space for Career and Technical Education (CTE) program and Adult Education program expansion, including pre-apprenticeship and apprenticeship programs. This project will assist students to enter the workforce faster and earn a meaningful wage. All CTE programs will connect secondary CTE offerings with dual enrollment and postsecondary opportunities for students. Programs offered will also be in line with business and industry training needs. Outcomes will be measured through a comparison of enrollment numbers. enrollment numbers project completion.

A performance improvement plan will be submitted and implemented to increase enrollment if deliverables are not met.
