Shooting	20-17751	Covington Lane	Units responded to the residence reference a male shooting himself in the head. Male was airlifted to Halifax Medical.
Death	20-17738	Cypress Point Pkwy (Superwash)	Palm Coast Fire Department responded to a brushfire east of the Superwash. Upon combating the fire they discovered a deceased person within the fire location. ISD, CSI and State Fire Marshal responded. Report by Deputy Sanchez.
Traffic Stop	20-17763	Palm Coast Parkway and Old Kings road	Sergeant Goncalves attempted a traffic stop on a black Camaro which had a stolen license plate on it which fled. The vehicle became disabled on 195 and three males were detained. The vehicle matched the description of one used in a Commercial Burglary in Gainesville on 2/23/20 to Fluent Cannabis Dispensary. Within the vehicle a cannabis tube belonging to Fluent Cannabis Dispensary was located. Attempts were made to contact an Emergency Contact from Fluent to attempt to confirm the tube was stolen from the burglary but no contact was able to be made. Also inside the vehicle was a large pouch of assorted credit cards, driver's licenses and social security cards belonging to smash and grab vehicle burglaries from 2018 and 2019 cases from Polk County, Orlando PD, Orange County, Highlands County, Hillsborough County, Manatee County, Citrus County, Altamonte Springs PD, Pasco County, Plant City PD and Osceola County.
