The University of Puerto Rico was recognized as an institution of higher learning and admitted to the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools on April 29, 1946. It has also been a member of the Association of Spanish-American Universities (Asociación de Universidades Hispanoamericanas) since 1955.

The University has been affiliated with the College Entrance Examination Board since 1965. The Rio Piedras Campus joined as a separate institution in 1967.

Individual accreditations of the different colleges, schools, and departments are included in their publications.

SYSTEM FOR MISSING COURSEWORTH EFFECT  
UNTIL THE 1979-80 ACADEMIC YEAR

Except for first-year basic courses and special courses marked with numbers below 100, all the courses at the University bear a three-digit number. The first digit indicates the level of the course in the following manner:

100 - Courses for first and second year students.

200 - Courses for second and third-year students who have satisfactorily completed the prerequisites.

3300 - Higher courses for undergraduate students who meet the prerequisites and for graduate students.  
4000 - Graduate courses.

SYSTEM FOR NUMBERING COURSES BEGINNING  
IN THE 1980-81 ACADEMIC YEAR

All courses at the University are given a title which contains letters indicating the subject and numbers indicating the level of the course. Course level is indicated by the first digit of the number, as follows:

- 0 - Remedial. The material covered is deemed to be pre-university, although offered at the University.
- 1 - Associate Technical, first level.
- 2 - Associate Technical, second level.
- 3 - Undergraduate, first level. First two years in transfer and Bachelor's degree programs.
- 4 - Undergraduate, second level. Next two or three years in Bachelor's degree programs.
- 5 - Undergraduate, advanced level. Courses that may be taken for a Bachelor's or Masters degree with the authorization of the director of the department.
- 6 - Master's degree level.
- 7 - Doctorate, first professional level.
- 8 - Doctorate in Philosophy and Letters.
- 9 - Post-Doctorate level.

**Regular Academic Year** The academic year consists of two semesters and a summer session. The first semester runs from August through December and the second from January through May. Semesters begin and end in accordance with the dates established in the Academic Calendars.

**Summer Session.** The summer session is offered during the months of June and July, through the dates established in the Academic Calendar.

Applications to begin university studies in the summer shall not be accepted except for students from other universities who wish to pursue studies at the Campus as transient students.

COLLEGE

Unit of credit. One semester credit-hour is equivalent to one hour of recitation, two to four hours of laboratory work, or two hours of language drill per week, throughout the semester, which consists of 15 weeks and a final tests period.

**Grades.** The grades at the Rio Piedras Campus carry the following values: A = Excellent; B = Good; C = Satisfactory; D = Passing, but deficient; F = Failing; F- = Left course without authorization; P = Passed (undergraduate); PS = Passed Superior; PN = Passed Notable; PB = Passed Good; NP = Not Passed (not used in the computation of the grade point average) - graduate level; W = Withdraw Officially (not used in the computation of the grade point average); I = Incomplete work (must be completed within one semester); REP = Course was repeated later. This grade is not included in cumulative totals.

**Provisional grades.** A student may receive a provisional grade with the notation of incomplete if the teacher feels that just cause exists for the student's failure to comply with all the requirements of the course. An F is given to that part of the work not done. Before the end of the next academic semester,
