

S.R. A1A RESILIENCY PLAN

FLAGLER AND VOLUSIA COUNTIES

Financial Project Identification (FPID) Numbers: 452443-1 and 452444-1

Description

Representatives from the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), Flagler County, the City of Flagler Beach, and Volusia County, are exploring options to repair and strengthen approximately 13 miles of State Road (S.R.) A1A in Flagler and Volusia counties. Specifically, the mission of the S.R. A1A Resiliency Strike Team is to make the Scenic S.R. A1A System, including the roadway, beaches and dunes, serviceable, functional, and resilient for decades to come.

The Strike Team was formed in response to the recent damage to areas of S.R. A1A from Hurricanes Ian and Nicole. The team will partner with the local community, as well as regional, state and federal agencies, to evaluate a wide range of potential solutions to advance to design and construction. The team expects that different alternatives may be used along the corridor, depending on the specific needs for that area.

The plan is focusing on the segment of S.R. A1A from Roberta Road in Ormond by the Sea, Volusia County, to Osprey Drive in Beverly Beach, Flagler County. The goals are to find solutions to:

- Preserve the scenic vistas of this amazing state treasure for decades to come
- Preserve & protect the ability of S.R. A1A to serve as a scenic transportation corridor for the local & state community
- Preserve the natural environmental benefits of this vital transportation corridor
- Enhance the technology & service benefits available along the corridor to improve public safety and create educational opportunities for the public
- Partner with the coastal communities, local, state, and federal governmental entities in order to layer in additional protective measures

Community listening sessions in each county are expected to occur in January 2023 to provide residents, businesses, property owners and other interested individuals an opportunity to provide ideas and feedback.
