Please accept my resume as an application for the City Manager's position for the City of Bunnell, which is currently being advertised.

I have been employed with the City of Bunnell as the Director of Grants, Community Projects and the CRA, and believe that I am a highly qualified candidate for this position to lead the City.


I have an extensive and varied background as you will see within this package. I graduated college in 1994, and soon thereafter began my career in upper management. I have worked nearly twenty years with numerous Federal and State agencies following explicit rules, regulations along with inspections to verify compliance within the job responsibilities and mandated performance measures.

Since moving to Florida in 2000 my career has expanded into local Government agencies where I have worked diligently within Flagler County to create a better home for the citizens that we serve. My efforts have primarily focused around identifying new sources of revenue so that a project and/or goal can be accomplished as envisioned. I have been writing grants for over ten years and to date have successfully secured more than thirty (\$30+) million in new dollars towards community projects.

I have spent the last six years working in local government and have truly enjoyed my time and undertakings at the City of Bunnell. As you are all aware, where we see ourselves today is truly a culmination of the last five years of efforts coming to fruition. We are in the final process of purchasing Plantation Bay Utilities with Flagler County. I have been an essential player as the key contact to coordinate all documents being sent to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and other parties involved. I have spent over a year working with the loan agents, attorneys within the City, County, consulting attorneys, both City and County Commission meetings, various departments within both City and County, the seller, their negotiating team, attorneys, operations managers, financial and engineering consultants all in an effort to organize and communicate the activities within this process. Once the purchase of Plantation Bay is completed the City will immediately begin upgrades to the plants as deemed necessary by the DEP Consent Order. Dollars for these projects have been calculated through grant funders along with long term debt.

Our City Water Treatment Plant upgrades are still underway. The details involved are time consuming and arduous. We are currently rewriting our Legal Services Agreement due to the City's change in attorney firms. The State is now reconsidering the preapproved verbiage within our authorized Resolution to determine if it is acceptable. We have a Bond Hearing date scheduled in September that we need to advertise for however; based on the States determination will decide if we need to postpone the hearing due to Commission action. The judge will not be available in October, which could push the project into November. The new interim financing term agreement is over a year old now, some conditions have changed and we may find ourselves needing to advertise for a new RFP for the funder.

I have briefly described the two examples above to explain the complexity of what the City is currently involved with. I am thoroughly educated as to most of the City's activities and have been a primary player in each of our key projects. The City has grown tremendously within the past few years and our efforts are blossoming. It is critical for the City to move forward in a professional and consistent manner



at this time so that we can complete the numerous projects that are valued in the millions successfully and be prepared as the economy recovers.

As the Director of Grants, Community Projects and the CRA, I regularly work with all the departments within the City of Bunnell, either through grant funding, research or event coordination. I have a good rapport with my peers and staff within the City. My work has been commended for the successes that I have achieved, my positive attitude, dedication to the City and numerous occasions of performing the Acting City Manager in training seat. Here is a brief listing of projects and departments that I am working on at this time:







The City of Bunnell is dedicated to providing our citizens, businesses, and visitors with quality of life and services.

For over 100 years Bunnell has worked to define itself, and promote its many opportunities. Historically, the priorities have been rooted in agriculture and silviculture, providing natural resources and its central location to transportation routes. Articles dating form the late 1890's to the early 1900's promote the area describing unlimited natural resources for crops, fruit trees, hunting and fishing, with transportation options to distribute the goods. Recently, Flagler County has experienced a population and development boom. The quiet, rural and agricultural orientation of the County has changed significantly east of US Highway 1 and the Florida East Central railroad tracks.

Bunnell City Government was established in 1913, experienced a large annexation in 2006 and is currently 136 square miles of land, which is the second largest land mass City in Florida with a population of 2,676 residents.





I put emphasis within the Department to take a coordinated approach that ensures every element of each project complements and strengthens the others. It isn't only about getting results. The Grant Department works toward acquiring funds through outside resources to support City of Bunnell initiatives.





Additionally, FVS provides direct volunteer services for Emergency Support Services and community events.

Flagler Volunteer Services sponsors the following three programs: the Flagler County Retired & Senior Volunteer Program, the Flagler County Volunteer Center, and Flagler County Emergency Support Services. These programs serve 86+ stations in Flagler County. Listed below are duties and accomplishments while employed by Flagler Volunteer Services:

- Budget management, created and maintained fiscal responsibilities of daily operations including development of new programs
- Developed and expanded the business by incorporating two new programs to provide security of long-term sustainability for the agency, through the inclusion of the Flagler Volunteer Center and the Flagler Emergency Support Services divisions

Services include: two senior centers, daily nutritional meals, social activities, meals on wheels program, day care program, Title III transportation, in-home care support and respite services.

I was hired as the Manager of both Flagler County Senior Centers and the meals on wheels program, my duties included:

- Management of food that adhered to FDA Regulations for two senior centers and 150 home delivered meals five days a week

- Organized and implemented a health and fitness facility which was supported by trained professionals for class instruction


SARAH PIERCE ASSISTED LIVING CENTER

The Sarah Pierce is an assisted living community, located in Litchfield, CT. Assisted living facilities provide care to elderly people who need help with daily tasks such as meal preparation, mobility, bathing or dressing. Assisted living centers do not provide housing for elders with severe medical conditions that require medical care and monitoring from a doctor or registered nurse. Assisted living offers intermediate care for individuals who cannot reside on their own in an independent living facility, but do not need the full-time health care services of a nursing home. The Sarah Pierce has a capacity of 83 residents.

I was hired to assist in opening the facility and establish a solid foundation to build a future for the business. Within my position were the following duties:



- Monitored all residents to ensure that necessary services were identified and implemented in their best interest
- Created and executed all entertainment and social activities both within and outside of the facility
- Held a Public Service Bus license and provided the necessary transportation to medical and social engagements for the residents

While employed the water lines froze and burst, thereby requiring a ten day evacuation to a nearby hotel. I implemented all necessary procedures and actions to ensure health and safety along with assurances for the residents during this stressful event.

LARC was incorporated in 1964 as a private nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization by a group of parents who wanted a better life for their children. At that time there was no "Right to Education Act" mandating education for all children, and there were few, if any, community resources so parents began to network and advocate for their families.


I was hired as a single Group Home Manager of six developmentally disabled residents. I was later promoted to supervise two group homes. A group home manager is the key responsible party for the day to day operations, support and functioning of the home and care of the residents.

As Group Home manager my responsibilities were:

- Maintain 24 hour staffing care including supervision, training and management
- Make certain that a client is supported by all necessary human resources
- Ensure that medical plans are implemented including, psychological/behavioral support, health and safety, nutrition, social and entertainment
- Provide basic home management shopping, cleaning, yard work and maintenance
- Support activities including a work day program and/or employment
- Ensured that the homes met all State and Federal Government rules, regulations and guidelines that included regular inspections to ensure that overall well being is being properly administered

I was promoted a third time at LARC, when I was the key personnel identified to spearhead the creation, development and implementation of Person Centered Planning Program — Community Development People Person Facilitator my duties were:

- To create teams around each client to assimilate them into the community
- I supported 24 group home residents and 130 individuals who attended the work day center program



- Facilitated "Mapping" strategies to identify goals and aspirations for each client
- Identified key persons in each clients life and established functional teams around each client
- Supported teams to assimilate and integrate clients successfully into society and lead a more fulfilling life

I am proud to say this program still successfully operates within the agency even to this day.




