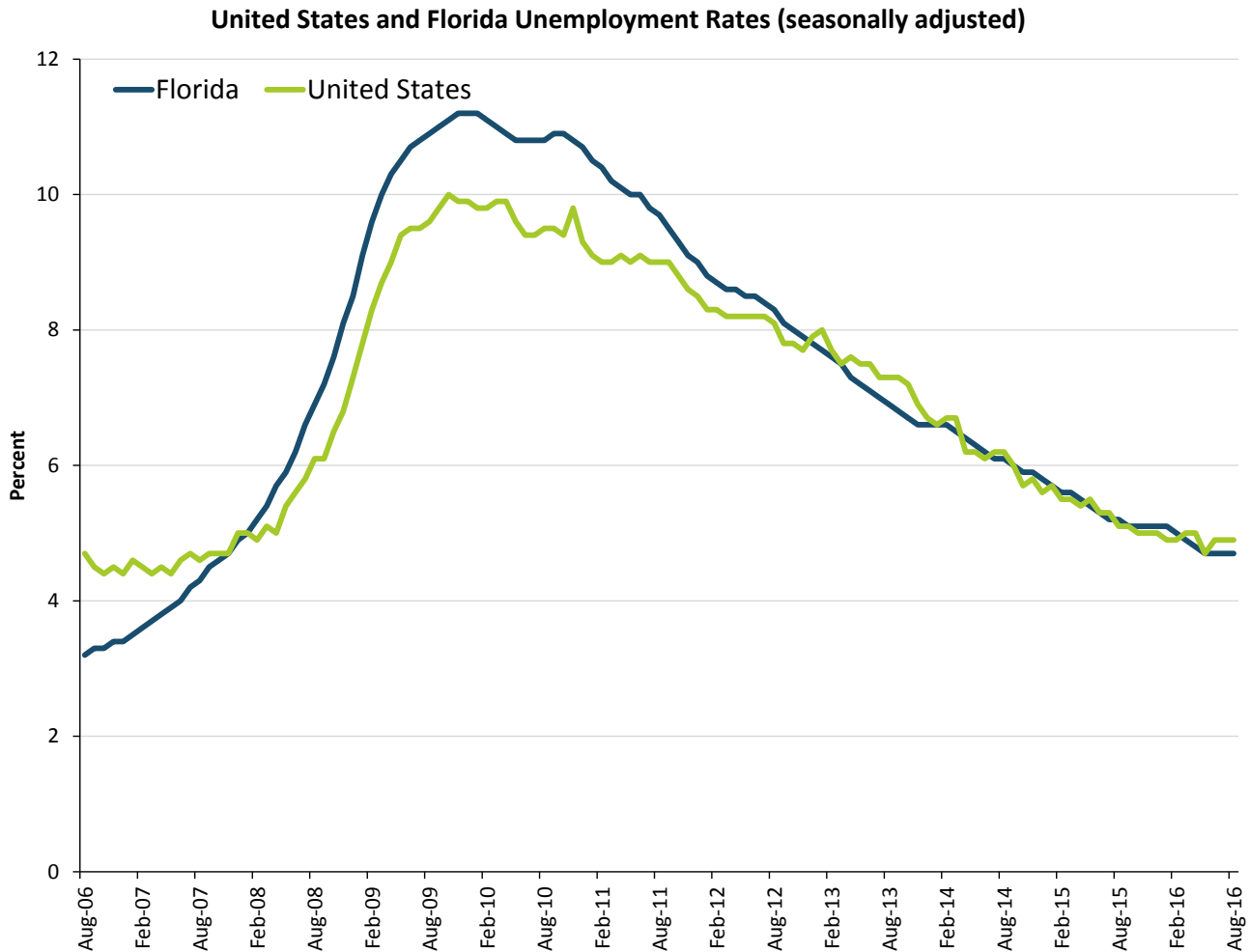

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Florida's August Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.7 percent in August 2016, unchanged from the July 2016 rate, but down 0.5 percentage point from 5.2 percent a year ago. There were 454,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 9,717,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 4.9 percent in August.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,392,400 in August 2016, an increase of 24,500 jobs (+0.3 percent) over the month. The state gained 259,800 jobs over the year, an increase of 3.2 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.7 percent over the year. Florida's over-the-year job growth rate has exceeded the nation's rate since May 2012.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,392,400 in August 2016, up 259,800 jobs compared to a year ago. August 2016 was the 73rd consecutive month with positive over-the-year job growth. The industry gaining the most jobs was professional and business services (+59,800 jobs, +4.9 percent).
- Other industries gaining jobs included education and health services (+47,900 jobs, +4.0 percent); leisure and hospitality (+38,000 jobs, +3.3 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+37,100 jobs, +2.2 percent); construction (+22,000 jobs, +5.1 percent); government (+18,500 jobs, +1.7 percent); financial activities (+16,500 jobs, +3.1 percent); manufacturing (+15,200 jobs, +4.4 percent); and other services (+8,400 jobs, +2.5 percent).
- The only industry that lost jobs over the year was information (-3,600 jobs, -2.6 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In August 2016, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.1 percent), followed by St. Johns County (3.6 percent), and Lafayette County (3.8 percent).
- Hendry County had the highest unemployment rate (11.6 percent) in Florida in August 2016, followed by Hardee County (7.3 percent), and Glades County (7.0 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- Twenty-three out of twenty-four metro areas in the state had over-the-year job gains in August 2016. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+51,600 jobs, +4.4 percent), Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+38,200 jobs, +3.1 percent), and Ft. Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (+34,800 jobs, +4.4 percent).

Note: The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
