Hurricane Irma Situation Overview

Northeast Florida and Southeast Georgia



- Powerful Category 5 Hurricane Irma will track west northwest toward the southern Bahamas and Florida Straights through this weekend.
- Increasing chances of tropical storm conditions this weekend & increasing chances of hurricane conditions across parts of NE Florida and adjacent Atlantic waters by Sunday.
- Potential Local Impacts:
 - Coastal Interests:
 - More frequent rip currents moderate to high risk through the weekend
 - Building surf beginning Thursday.
 - Coastal flooding & beach erosion potential increasing Friday.
 - Locally heavy rainfall this weekend.
 - Marine Interests:
 - Small Craft Advisory conditions likely by Thursday.
 - Tropical Storm Conditions possible by Saturday night over portions of Florida waters.
- Uncertainty remains with weekend track and intensity of Irma.

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
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Hurricane Irma Status






- At 5 am EDT today, Category 5 Hurricane Irma was about 1,463 miles southeast of Mayport, Florida.
- Forecast changes: An eastward shift in forecast track this weekend.
- When and where Irma takes a northward turn will greatly influence the inland extent and severity of local impacts.



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
Time of Arrival of Tropical Storm Conditions

Northeast Florida and Southeast Georgia




- Chances of tropical storm (TS) force winds (≥ 39 mph) continue to increase across NE Florida & SE Georgia.
- The earliest time of arrival of sustained tropical storm force winds is Saturday afternoon for NE Florida & coastal waters.
- Probabilities for TS force winds at:



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
Time of Arrival of Hurricane Conditions

- Hurricane force winds could potentially impact parts of NE Florida and the adjacent coastal waters Sunday and Monday.

- Monitor the latest official forecast: nhc.noaa.gov and weather.gov/jax
- Ensure your supply kits are stocked.
- Review your family's hurricane plan.
 Ask & answer:
 - 1. Are you in an evacuation zone?
 - When & where will you go if you need to evacuate?
 - 3. What would you do with your pets and/or livestock if told to evacuate?
- Additional Considerations:
 - Traffic will increase as South Florida residents evacuate.
 - Hotel availability will become more limited.




