Special accomplishments during career

- Was selected in 1984 to attend the Ford Supplier Institute to study statistical methods and their
 applications in business. Became responsible for developing and then training entire corporation in
 the use of statistical methods to be used to monitor and control Timken's manufacturing process.
- Was named Plant Manager of The Gambrinus Bearing Plant in 1989. Upon that appointment,
 I was the youngest person to become Plant Manager in the near 100 year history of The Timken Company.
- In 1989 was sent to Japan for three weeks as The Timken Company representative as part
 of a U.S. study mission to better understand the competitive advantages, techniques employed, and
 methods used in Japanese manufacturing.
- Following the Japan trip and study mission, The Timken Company, based on my participation
 and findings, began to implement just-in-time manufacturing concepts in their plants world-wide.
 In fact, I became the corporate so called "master" of cellular manufacturing and one-piece flow
 employed to reduce inventory and lead times of Timken's products.
- During 1990, as General Manager of the Canton Bearing District, I was directly responsible for the complete transformation of the three plants that comprised the district. During that project we were able to reduce product lead times by 50 %, reduce costs by 20 %, and improve on-time delivery by nearly 40 %.
- In 1992 was trained by the McKinsey Consulting Group in a bottom-up cost reduction initiative we called" breakthrough" at The Timken Company. (This was the same initiative Jack Welch employed at G.E. called "workout") This initiative reduced the total cost structure in the Canton Bearing District by over \$25 million annually.
- When sent to restore British Timken in Duston, England to profitability after ten years of losses, my team and I achieved break-even within six months and profitable operations by the eighth month. We sustained profitability during my leadership tenure.
- In 1997, as President of my own company, I was able to negotiate a \$2.3 million dollar loan from the state of Ohio Economic Development Board to build a new 100,000 square foot plant.

- A heightened level of city management discipline throughout the entire organization.
- The city organization would be restructured to have all department heads reporting directly to the city manager position.
- All city business, upcoming challenges, triumphs, disappointments, and problems would become completely transparent between the city manager, department heads, staff and the City Commission.
- An open door policy, along with an effective communication style, would be stressed and maintained between the City Manager and the four (4) constituencies the position serves: The City Commission; Flagler Beach citizens/taxpayers; Federal, state, and Flagler County Government; and the associates employed by the City of Flagler Beach.
- Department heads would be coached and challenged toward the achievement of our goal in reducing total cost, while continuing to provide the services to our citizens as determined by the City Commission.
- Apply project management skills and tools to help manage future major projects to ensure completion within budget and on time.
- Non~linear or transformational changes to the city's total cost structure would be undertaken
 and implemented, as presented for approval by the City Commission. (I have already identified
 \$200,000 of cost saving ideas/changes which, if approved by City Commission, could be implemented
 within 45 days).
- Synergies between field departments would be identified, exposed, and changes implemented to realize cost savings, while not reducing services offered to our citizens.
- I have personally made a sizeable investment in real estate in our city. I want the most services that we can provide at the least cost. I would attempt to make this a reality for all our taxpayers.
- The city manager would be visible, present, and approachable to our citizens and associates on a daily basis.
