ORDER ADJUDGING DEFENDANT INCOMPETENT TO STAND TRIAL AND COMMITMENT TO DEPARTMENT OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

THIS CAUSE having come to be heard before the Court, and the questions of the competency of the Defendant in this cause to stand trial having been raised in accordance with the provisions of FRCrP 3.211(a) and F.S. 916.12, the Court appointed to examine the Defendant and to report to the Court on whether the Defendant meets the criteria for commitment to the Department of Children and Families as provided in F.S. 916.13(1). The Court having received the written reports of the above-named expert(s) in relation to the issue of the Defendant's competency to stand trial and need for commitment, it is hereby

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that

- 1. The Defendant is incompetent to stand trial due to mental illness as defined in F.S. 916.106(7).
- 2. The Defendant meets the criteria for commitment to a treatment facility of the Department of Children and Families as provided in F.S. 916.13(1).
- 3. The Defendant is hereby committed to the Department of Children and Families to be placed in a mental health treatment facility.
- 4. The Clerk of this Court is directed to forthwith forward a certified copy of this Order a long with copies of any written reports submitted to this Court by experts appointed by the Court relating to the issues of competency and commitment; copies of any other psychiatric, psychological or social work reports submitted to the court relative to the mental state of the Defendant; and a copy of the charging i nstrument and all supporting affidavits or other documents used in the determination of probable cause to:

- 5. Upon notification of an available bed space by the Department of Children and Families, the Sheriff of Flagler County shall, on the date specified, forthwith transport and deliver the Defendant to a treatment facility designated by the Department, together with a certified copy of this Order and the other documentation outlined in paragraph 4 above.
- 6. The Department, through the Administrator of the facility to which the Defendant is admitted, shall report directly to this Court, with copies to the attorneys for the State and the Defense on the issues of competency for trial and the need for continue commitment as provided in FRCrP 3.212.
- 7. In the event the Defendant's presence is required at any hearings in this cause, this Court shall issue an Order to Transport, directing the Sheriff of Flagler County, or his designee to resume custody of and transport the Defendant back to the jurisdiction of this Court.
- 8. The provisions of FRCrP 3.191 are hereby temporarily suspended.
- This Court retains jurisdiction in this cause, and the Defendant shall not be discharged or released from commitment within the Department of Children and Families without further Order of this Court.
- 10. The Department of Children and Families shall follow all time restraints provided in Florida Statutes in placing the Defendant in a treatment facility.

Dear Judge Perkins:

Pursuant to your written order, I met with Joseph Frank Bova to assess his competence to proceed. I evaluated Mr. Bova at the Flagler County Jail on March 29, 2021 for approximately .4 hours, and I returned to meet with him again on April 2 for .2 hours. Per Florida Statute 916.12, a defendant is incompetent to proceed if the defendant does not have sufficient present ability to consult with her or his lawyer with a reasonable degree of rational understanding or if the defendant has no rational, as well as factual, understanding of the proceedings against her or him.

Current Charge: Homicide – First Degree Felony Murder (F1)

NOTIFICATION AND BRIEF INTERVIEWS: I began the initial interview by providing Mr. Bova with the court order for this evaluation. As he reviewed the document, he mumbled under his breath. He also periodically raised his left arm and made gestures. After he reviewed the court order for 10 minutes, I asked him to explain the purpose of the evaluation. He responded, "I don't have my reading glasses." Mr. Bova is in his 30s and I asked why he required reading glasses. He replied, "My throat hurts. I can't talk too much." I informed him that this is a competency evaluation ordered by Judge Perkins and I listed the six competency factors from the order. I recounted that the pertinent information he provided would be included in a report which will be submitted to the court, the assistant public defender, the assistant state attorney, and SMA Healthcare. I also explained that my role was to perform the evaluation and that I was not going to provide him treatment. When I finished providing this information, Mr. Bova said that he did not have questions. He then abruptly got up from his seat and walked to the door. I asked why he was leaving, and he responded, "Once again, I don't feel good" and he refused to continue with the interview. I informed Mr. Bova that I would return when he was feeling better. He responded, "You don't have to come back." I asked him to explain, and he stated that he has already had three evaluations and there was no need to have another one. I informed Mr. Bova that the judge ordered this evaluation. He asked why the evaluation was ordered and I repeated the purpose of the interview. He once again refused to continue, and I concluded the evaluation.

I returned to meet with Mr. Bova one week later. He once again mumbled under his breath as he reviewed the court order. He also mumbled as I was writing, and he spoke at a low volume in response to my questions. I asked him to speak more audibly and when he did his speech was organized and he provided relevant responses to my questions. On one occasion he raised his left hand in the air. He did not respond when I asked why he did this. He referred to the order again and asked me, "Who's Roger Davis?" He also read aloud "mental examination" and he said, "I've had three mental examinations. I've been deemed competent each time. I

don't need to do the evaluation." Mr. Bova then asked me, "Do you know what legal recourse is?" He refused to continue with the evaluation at this point. When the officer came to escort me to the lobby Mr. Bova asked him, "How do I contact my attorney? How do I contact the judge? I want to represent myself pro se."

PROCEDURES UTILIZED: The evaluation consisted of a review of records and brief interviews.

REVIEW OF RECORDS: Assistant Public Defender Mr. Mosley contacted me by email on March 9, 2021. He informed me that Mr. Bova's case was remanded for a new trial. It was Mr. Mosley's understanding that Mr. Bova had not received psychiatric medication since he was sentenced to prison. They met the morning of the email and Mr. Bova was talking to himself as if he were hallucinating.

I received an email from Ms. Becky Quintieri MS, CJM, dated March 18, 2021. Ms. Quintieri is a director at the Flagler County Jail. She informed me that Mr. Bova was not taking psychiatric medication when he was transferred from the prison to the Flagler County Jail.

A March 9, 2021 Suggestion of Mental Incompetence to Stand Trial document reflected that Mr. Bova appeared disoriented to time and place. He did not appear to appreciate the nature of the charge against him or the range and nature of possible penalties. He did not appear to understand the adversary nature of the legal process and he did not appear to understand the role of his assistant public defender. In addition, Mr. Bova could not aid in the preparation of his defense. He exhibited inappropriate behavior in the presence of counsel and the court. Furthermore, during a video conference on March 9, 2021 Mr. Bova appeared to be having an active conversation with someone who wasn't present. However, he would not acknowledge this when he was questioned about it. He did not appear to be on his medication.

I previously met with Mr. Bova to assess his competency in this case, and I submitted a report on May 27, 2019. The diagnostic impression was schizophrenia, in remission. While Mr. Bova stated that he experienced auditory hallucinations in the past, he said that he was no longer experiencing hallucinations and he did not endorse other current psychotic symptoms. Mr. Bova performed well during the competency evaluation and I opined that he was competent to proceed.

DIAGNOSTIC SECTION:

Schizophrenia

OPINION SECTION: I previously met with Mr. Bova to assess his competency for this case, and I submitted a report dated May 27, 2019. He stated that he suffered from auditory hallucinations in the past. However, Mr. Bova said that he no longer experienced hallucinations or other psychotic symptoms when I met with him. My diagnostic impression was schizophrenia, in remission. Mr. Bova performed well during the competency interview and he did not appear to have significant impairments. I opined that he was competent to proceed.

I returned to meet with Mr. Bova for the current evaluation and on both occasions, he talked under his breath as if he may have been having a conversation with an unseen individual. He also exhibited odd behavior as he lifted his arm and made gestures. He refused to explain his actions. On both occasions, Mr. Bova asserted that the current evaluation was unnecessary because he had participated in previous evaluations. He refused to continue with both interviews after just a few minutes.

When I met with Mr. Bova in 2019, he was complaint with prescribed antipsychotic medication. However, he was reportedly not prescribed psychiatric medication when he was recently transferred from prison to the Flagler County Jail, and he has apparently refused to take medication since he returned to the jail.

The fact that Mr. Bova is not currently taking psychiatric medication could account for his bizarre behavior including mumbling under his breath as if he were having a conversation with an unseen person. It is also possible that Mr. Bova is feigning these behaviors in an attempt to avoid prosecution for the serious charge. A third possibility is that he is both experiencing legitimate psychotic symptoms and he is also exaggerating the symptoms.

I believe that it is likely that Mr. Bova is feigning symptoms. However, this does not exclude the possibility that he also has legitimate symptoms. I do not have sufficient information to make this distinction.

I made two attempts to interview Mr. Bova and he was uncooperative on both occasions. I have no reason to believe that he will reconsider and agree to be evaluated. Given this, the most conservative course is to opine that he is incompetent to proceed. If he were committed to a state hospital, his psychiatrist could seek a court order for involuntary medication. In addition, his treatment team would have an opportunity to interact with him over an extended period of time to assess whether his reported symptoms are legitimate or feigned.

Once he has been deemed competent at the hospital, it would be important to ensure that he remains on the same medication regimen at the jail that he received at the hospital as he proceeds with his case.

While competence to proceed as defined by Florida Statute 916.12 is ultimately a legal issue to be determined by the court, in my opinion, Mr. Bova is incompetent to proceed. He lacks sufficient present ability to consult with his attorney with a reasonable degree of rational understanding.

Involuntary hospitalization is another legal issue that is decided by the court. In my opinion, Mr. Bova meets Florida Statute 916.13 criteria for involuntary commitment. The diagnostic impression for Mr. Bova is schizophrenia. However, he has reportedly refused to take psychiatric medication since he returned from prison to the jail. This reflects that Mr. Bova is unable to determine for himself if treatment is necessary.

In addition, there exists a substantial likelihood that in the near future Mr. Bova will inflict serious bodily harm to himself and others, as evidenced by recent behavior causing such harm. While Mr. Bova has not been convicted of the current charge, he is alleged to have committed a violent offense. He has also engaged in self-injurious behavior.

Furthermore, it is my opinion that with appropriate treatment at a state forensic hospital there is a substantial probability that Mr. Bova will attain competence within a period of six to nine months.

There do not appear to be any appropriate less restrictive alternatives for Mr. Bova other than involuntary hospitalization.
