
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Florida's December Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.0 percent in December 2015, down 0.1 percentage point from the revised November 2015 rate of 5.1 percent, and down 0.7 percentage point from 5.7 percent a year ago. There were 487,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 9,667,000. The U.S. unemployment rate also was 5.0 percent in December. Florida's unemployment rate has been less than or equal to the national rate for 23 of the last 37 months.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,198,800 in December 2015, an increase of 21,900 jobs (+0.3 percent) over the month. Compared to December a year ago, the number of jobs in the state was up by 233,100, an increase of 2.9 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs was up 1.9 percent over the year. Florida's annual job growth rate has exceeded the nation's rate since April 2012.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,198,800 in December 2015, up 233,100 jobs compared to a year ago. December 2015 was the 65th consecutive month with positive annual job growth after the state lost jobs for over three years. The industry gaining the most jobs was professional and business services (+51,100 jobs, +4.3 percent).
- Other industries gaining jobs included education and health services (+44,700 jobs, +3.8 percent); leisure and hospitality (+43,800 jobs, +3.9 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+39,600 jobs, +2.4 percent); construction (+28,500 jobs, +7.0 percent); financial activities (+13,300 jobs, +2.5 percent); other services (+10,900 jobs, +3.3 percent); and manufacturing (+9,200 jobs, +2.8 percent).
- The industries that lost jobs over the year were information (-1,900 jobs, -1.4 percent) and government (-5,800 jobs, -0.5 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In December 2015, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.2 percent), followed by St. Johns County (3.5 percent) and Alachua and Wakulla counties (4.0 percent each).
- Hendry County had the highest unemployment rate (7.3 percent) in Florida in December 2015, followed by Citrus County (6.6 percent); Putnam County (6.4 percent); and Highlands and Sumter counties (6.3 percent each). No county had a double-digit unemployment rate for December.

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

• Twenty-two metro areas in the state had over-the-year job gains in December 2015. The areas with the largest gains were Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+38,800 jobs, +3.1 percent), Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+38,100 jobs, +3.3 percent), and Ft. Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (+24,900 jobs, +3.1 percent).

Note: The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
