PROCEEDINGS

WHEREUPON,

1

- CAPTAIN MATTHEW P. DOUGHNEY,
- having been called as a witness
- 5 and duly sworn, testified as follows:
- 6 THE WITNESS: I do.
- 7 DIRECT EXAMINATION
- 8 BY MR. PHILLIPS:
- 9 Q Well, Lieutenant, thanks for coming
- 10 down.
- 11 A Captain.
- Q Oh, Captain. Excuse me. Get this thing
- 13 straight here.
- I'm Matt Phillips. I'm representing
- ¹⁵ Cornelius Baker in this case.
- 16 A Okay.
- 17 O With me is Tom Mott. He's representing
- Patricia Roosa. Of course, you know Mr. Foxman
- with the State Attorney.
- 20 Could you just state your name and your
- 21 agency for the record, please?
- A Matthew Patrick Doughney. I'll spell
- the last name. D-O-U-G-H-N-E-Y. And I'm a
- captain with the Daytona Beach Police Department.
- O Okay. We were just talking off the

- record. You said actually on January 7th here was
- your first day in the Criminal Investigation
- 3 Division?
- 4 A First day.
- 5 Q Where had you been assigned prior to
- 6 that?
- A I was over in District 2, which is the
- 8 part of the city that's east of the railroad
- 9 tracks. I was a district captain in patrol.
- Q Got you. Okay. Well, how were you
- called in to participate with this investigation?
- 12 A Chief Chitwood called me at the house
- and advised me that we had an armed home
- invasion/robbery at 339 Michigan. As the CID
- captain, I responded.
- Q When you got there, I guess, which
- officers were present? What type of --
- 18 A Lieutenant Adamy was there, Sergeant
- 19 Grayson, Officer Dallarosa, I believe Grover.
- 20 Q And what type of activities were taking
- 21 place?
- 22 A They had a crime scene established at
- the residence. I was being briefed by Lieutenant
- Adamy and Sergeant Grayson. Chief Chitwood was
- there.

- One of the things we had decided to do
- was start canvassing the neighborhood to see if
- anybody had seen anything.
- I went and took just a preliminary look
- 5 at the crime scene itself in through the front
- door where Tom Youngman, our crime scene tech,
- was, you know, taking pictures and that kind of
- 8 stuff.
- 9 Q So he was already involved in his
- 10 activities?
- 11 A Yeah. Youngman had -- he had just
- gotten there pretty close to the same time that I
- did, I believe.
- 14 O And when you say you took a view of the
- crime scene, did you just look in from the
- doorway?
- 17 A Just looked in from the doorway. There
- was an elderly female there. I wanted to check on
- 19 her status because she -- she was on oxygen. But
- as far as touching anything or going in and
- checking the rooms, I just took a preliminary
- 22 look.
- 23 Q So you -- did you actually enter the
- 24 residence?
- 25 A Yes, just right inside the front door.

- Q Okay. Well, I guess, where did you get
- started with your involvement with the
- investigation?
- 4 A My involvement pretty much took place up
- in Flagler. A lot of the stuff that I did took
- 6 place up there. We were informed -- Sergeant
- Grayson was informed that the victim's credit card
- 8 had been used up in Palm Coast, I believe, at a
- 9 Winn-Dixie and a SunTrust.
- 10 And then shortly after that, it was
- probably 2, a little after 2:00, that Sergeant
- Burke from Bunnell PD was involved in a pursuit
- with the victim's vehicle. At that time, myself,
- the chief and Jimmie Flynt headed up to Bunnell.
- Q So did you go right from the scene at
- 16 Michigan Avenue?
- 17 A We went right from Michigan Avenue right
- up to the crash scene where they dumped the
- vehicle, where Sergeant Burke had apprehended Ms.
- 20 Roosa.
- Okay. And who was present at the -- the
- vehicle crash scene?
- 23 A Sergeant Burke was there, myself, Chief
- 24 Chitwood, Jimmie Flynt and then some other
- personnel from Flagler County Sheriff's Office. I

- don't know their names.
- Now, had Ms. Roosa already been
- 3 transported away from that scene?
- A No, she was there. She was in the back
- seat of a -- of an SUV, Flagler County, I believe.
- Q Okay. Did you have any contact with
- 7 her?
- 8 A I walked up to talk to her and she was
- 9 not going to talk to us at all.
- Okay. Did anybody tell you whether or
- not she had already been read her Miranda warnings
- 12 at that point?
- 13 A She hadn't, but Sergeant Flynt had
- talked to her and she said -- and he advised that
- she asked for an attorney. So I just -- the only
- 16 question I asked her was where was Ms. Uptagraft,
- and she didn't say anything.
- 18 O Okay.
- 19 A And that was my involvement with
- 20 Ms. Roosa. I didn't talk to her after that. I
- 21 didn't interview her, and I wasn't present when
- she was interviewed by our detective.
- O Okay. Well, did you stay at the scene
- there of the crash, waiting for the car to get --
- 25 A I stayed there until some of my

- personnel from CID got there, Detective Detter,
- Detective Hawkins. They wound up ultimately
- interviewing Ms. Roosa. Let me think of who else.
- 4 Detective Diaz and Detective Young showed up.
- One of the things that we did was we
- 6 went over to -- Cornelius Baker's grandmother, I
- believe, had a house around the corner, looking
- for him there. He wasn't -- he was not there.
- 9 Did you actually speak to his
- 10 grandmother?
- 11 A I was there when we talked to her. And
- we went in and looked. He wasn't there.
- 13 O And did she indicate like the last time
- she had seen him, anything like that?
- 15 A I don't recall. But she said -- she
- said he wasn't in there. And, in fact, he was not
- in that house.
- 18 O Okay. Well, what did you do next after
- 19 that?
- 20 A We went back to the crash scene, waiting
- on a couple other detectives to get there. Then
- we went looking over where Sergeant Burke had
- originally spotted Ms. Uptagraft's car, which was
- 24 a little shopping plaza maybe two miles away. We
- were looking for the gun. We figured that's where

- he had first spotted the vehicle. They may have
- been in the process of dumping the gun. It's
- right along US-1, right by a canal. So we were
- 4 walking through the woods looking for a gun. We
- 5 didn't find it, though.
- 6 Q Okay.
- A After that, we returned back to the
- 8 scene and they had located Mr. Baker a couple
- g streets over. I think it's Peach (phonetic)
- 10 Street. He had been located in a house there. He
- was talked to by Sergeant Flynt and then he was
- taken back up to Palm Coast.
- 13 Q Did Sergeant Flynt relate to you what
- they had talked about?
- 15 A I didn't talk to Jimmie. All I know is
- that there was a -- he said he wasn't going to
- talk to us, but I didn't get involved in talking
- to him. To this day, I don't have any
- recollection of ever talking to him. I mean, I
- hadn't seen him until that day.
- 21 O Okay.
- 22 A One thing that was noticeable when
- 23 talking to Sergeant Burke was he knew Cornelius
- Baker. He said that when the vehicle rolled and
- 25 he got out, when he was running, Cornelius looked

- over his shoulder and looked at him. And he
- related to him as a nickname. He called him
- Football Head, which is a nickname that he was
- 4 given younger in his childhood. I said, Are you
- sure it was him? He said he was a hundred percent
- 6 sure it was Cornelius.
- 7 Q Okay.
- A After that, we went looking -- Sergeant
- 9 Burke knew that the vehicle -- looking at the
- vehicle that the dirt that was up underneath the
- back of the car was not the dirt from where the
- 12 crash had occurred.
- Do you understand what I'm saying?
- 14 Q Yeah. He explained that to me.
- 15 A The color and the texture of that dirt
- came from someplace different than Bunnell. So he
- was thinking it was someplace over closer towards
- Mondex.
- 19 So myself, Sergeant Flynt and Chief
- 20 Chitwood went with Sergeant Burke looking for the
- victim. Maybe she had been dumped somewhere.
- Then we went back to Palm Coast where
- they were conducting an interview with Mr. Baker,
- and he said he would take us to where the body
- 25 was.

- Q Okay. Any other details related to you
- from the contents of the interview with him?
- A No. Just -- I got there late, towards
- the end of the interview, and where he had said he
- 5 would take us to the body and that, you know, he
- 6 would take us there. So we loaded him up, took
- him out to a very isolated location. I think
- 8 it's -- Black Point Road is the name of it.
- 9 Q Right.
- A And we fanned out looking for the body.
- And it was found about maybe 50, 75 feet into the
- woods, into a grassy area.
- Now, were you with Mr. Baker when the
- search is taking place?
- 15 A Yeah, he was there. He was out of the
- car saying, No, it's a little further to the left.
- I wasn't walking with him. I was walking in the
- woods.
- 19 Q Okay. But you could hear him shouting
- instructions?
- A He was telling -- I don't know who he
- was with, but he was saying, No, further to the
- ²³ left.
- Q Oh, he was walking with another officer?
- 25 A He was walking with another officer. We

- were out in the woods and he said, No, it's
- further to the left. And I believe Sergeant
- Rhodes is the one that found the victim.
- Q Okay. And then did you have an
- opportunity to view where she had been discovered?
- A Yes. In the high grass off the road.
- O Okay. Did you get close enough to see
- any of the wounds suffered by her or anything like
- 9 that?
- 10 A No. I know she was laying face down.
- 11 Q Okay.
- 12 A But I didn't -- I didn't touch her,
- didn't get that close. I stayed away.
- 14 Q Okay. And so did you -- you said you
- heard Mr. Baker, you know, giving instructions
- about where to look. Did you hear anything else
- said by him while he was out in the woods?
- 18 A No.
- O Okay. Well, after Ms. Uptagraft is
- discovered, what do you do next?
- 21 A Myself, Chief Chitwood and Sergeant
- Flynt got back in the car and headed back to
- Daytona.
- O Okay. Any other investigative-related
- ²⁵ activities?
