To Flagler County Local Governments:

Each year we request, in compliance with Federal Aviation Administration requirements, authorization to fly over congested areas. As you are aware, the citizens you represent pay for mosquito control services via property taxes and a portion of the service includes aerial operations. To provide service in a timely fashion, without contacting each local government prior to each operation, we require a signed authorization that extends for one year. This matter has become a formality over the years.

For those unfamiliar with District operations, the authorizations permit the District to perform low-level flights (500 feet) over various entities for mosquito control. We <u>rarely</u> apply control materials over congested areas, but if the need arises, the authorization is necessary. The District is solely responsible for determining need, which would be based on an exceptional nuisance or an impending health threat.

The primary use for the aircraft is the control of developing mosquitoes away from congested areas, in and around wetlands.

The enclosed **Public Notice** will be published monthly beginning in April and ending in October, and serves to provide ongoing public awareness about aerial spray operations and further provides contact information. This should satisfy members of the various local governing boards desiring more notification for their constituents.

Please execute the accompanying authorization (Chairman, Mayor, etc.) and return to our office no later than April 13, 2017.

#### Public Notice Aerial Spraying

In compliance with regulations of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), public notice is hereby given that the East Flagler Mosquito Control District may apply control products by helicopter over or adjacent to congested areas of Flagler County and its municipalities. The purpose of these flights is for the suppression of mosquito populations. Flights will normally be performed at an altitude of 500 feet. Additionally, the District may perform low level flights over and adjacent to wetlands for the purpose of arresting mosquito development.

Areas outside the boundaries of the District may also be subject to aerial spraying in the event of an extraordinary nuisance or potential public health threat.

All flights will be in the public interest, and at times, maximize public safety and mosquito control effectiveness. All control products are approved for control purposes by the Florida Department of Agriculture and U.S. Environment Protection.

**BACKGROUND**: This is the last stormwater project in the city's Stormwater Master Plan that has yet to be completed. Swales in the subdivision's right-of-way, and a deepening and expansion of existing golf course ponds together will contain runoff from the 100-year storm.

BUDGETARY IMPACT: A \$200,000 Legislative grant will cover the costs of design and CEI by QLHA (128,000) with the remaining \$87,570 earmarked for construction. It is 100% reimbursable. A St. Johns River Water Management District grant, with a 75/25% cost share, not to exceed \$675,000, will be used for construction purposes only.

Issue: Consider a request to vacate an access and utility easement - John Brit.

From: Summary from and staff assigned Penny Overstreet, City Clerk.

Organization: City of Flagler Beach

**RECOMMENDATION**: Please see background information. At this point I would ask the Commission to have the applicant provide the easement to the City, if evidence is provided to the Clerk the easement is dedicated to the city then ask the Clerk be authorized to request the City Attorney draft the release. I would then have the binding lot documents signed and would record them after the easement is released.

**BACKGROUND:** The applicant approached me regarding having the easement vacated. The applicant owns parcels 55 and 66 which are contiguous. The applicant wishes to install a swimming pool behind his residence (located on Parcel 66.) After a preliminary review, I advised the applicant I would research the infrastructure to see if the easements were currently being utilized. If they were not, he could request the Commission vacate the easement, and if approved, he would have to legally bind the lots. I further advised the lots, if bound, would lose the grandfathered status (50' wide lot) and if he or a future owner would ever wish to separate them the lots would have to meet the current zoning requirement's (currently 75' X 100' minimum lot size for SFR.) I pulled the utility drawings (water and sanitary sewer lines) to ensure no infrastructure has been installed. Visually, I saw no infrastructure on our drawings, I spoke with our Transmission & Distribution Supervisor Alan Watts who verified there is no infrastructure installed in the easement running through the middle of Block 6, Atlanta Beach Subvision. The original plat for Atlanta Beach Subdivision (April 5, 1947) divided the lots into 50'X 300' properties. Mrs. Parker subdivided the lots but did not file and official re-plat, then began selling the subdivided lots now 50' X 150' hence the addition of "parcel numbers" to the lot's legal descriptions. The easements are referred to in the warranty deeds, to date I have been unable to locate the easement documents, so at this point I do not even know if the easement is dedicated to the City or a general easement implemented for future development and only included the description on the warranty deeds. I am continuing to look for a survey, in the building department to see if the easement OR record is on it. If found I will provide you with an update. **BUDGETARY IMPACT:** Applicant will pay for the recording if approved, and the binding lot fee. **LEGAL CONSIDERATIONS/SIGN-OFF:** City Attorney would draft easement release if determined City has the easement.



### **Springtime Fire Safety Tips**

As spring approaches, thoughts turn to cleaning up from winter, making repairs around the home, and continuing to enjoy the outdoors. Keeping a few safety thoughts in mind will help you make your springtime much more enjoyable.

#### In the Home:

- Check and clean your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors
- Check your fire extinguishers
- Check for overloaded or damaged extension cords
- Prepare for storm related outages (make sure your flashlights and portable radios have batteries and that other supplies, such as bottled water, are stocked and available)
- Practice exit drills with your family so everyone knows what to do in case of an emergency
- Properly store household chemicals and never mix cleaning agents

#### Outside and Around the Yard:

- Make sure your address numbers are up and visible from the street
- Clean up yard debris. Cut back dead limbs and grasses
- Maintain a clear fire zone of 10-15' around structures. Clean up leaves and debris, and consider using stone or non-combustible mulches
- Check outdoor electrical outlets and other electrical appliances
- Get your grill cleaned and serviced. Check all propane tanks and lines for leaks and damage
- Keep 100' of garden hose with an attached nozzle connected and ready for use

#### In the Garage or Shed:

- Clean up and properly store paints, pool and yard chemicals
- Check fuels containers for leaks and make sure they are properly stored
- Have all power equipment cleaned, serviced, and readied for use

In March we produced 18,430,000 gallons of drinking water. This amount was 1,876,000 gallons greater than the amount we treated in February. Rainfall for the month of March was .95 inches. We used 3,100 Gallons at the plant and used 6,889 Gallons on irrigation. The fire department used 9,000 gallons.

We have routine duties that are performed every day on each of the shifts. Samples taken every hour to make sure we keep the chemistry of the water within the parameters for DEP. We regularly perform over 200 tests on the City water and raw water daily between the three shifts. We do routine plant maintenance. We mow the plant grounds. We take well samples and draw downs for St. Johns River Water Management, also keeping daily records for the monthly reports that are required to be turned into the Department of Environmental Protection Agency every month. We also do quarterly reports for DEP on disinfection byproducts. We have the mid night shift flush the trains with high pH permeate water. We do yearly TTHM and HAA5 tests.

DEP requires us to take 5 bacteriological samples from the distribution system monthly, according to our population. All samples passed on March 14<sup>th</sup>.

I have Dennis Walker perform weekly vehicle checks. He checks all the fluids such as Brake fluid, windshield wiper fluid, transmission fluid, and all the lights.

We cleaned both Degasifiers.

We changed the bearings on degasifier #2 blower.

We pulled weeds at wells 10 and 13.

We cleaned the CL2 analyzer.

We had Sunstate Systems put in PLC at Million Gallon Tank Booster Station. They replaced the one that was damaged in Hurricane Matthew. They also installed new computers that were damaged in the hurricane.

We had the T & D department vacuum out our neutralization tank.

We had Alarm Service on site to replace our out dated security system.

We repaired well 11 generator battery charger.

We changed the bulbs in the acid room.

We got well 11 generator batteries to take a charge.

We worked with FRWA on our water audit for St Johns. They also tested our finished and raw meters for accuracy.

We fixed the generator indicator at the Million Gallon Tank Booster Station to show it running at the plant.

The well driller came by to take inventory to see what we had on hand for Well 12R.
