

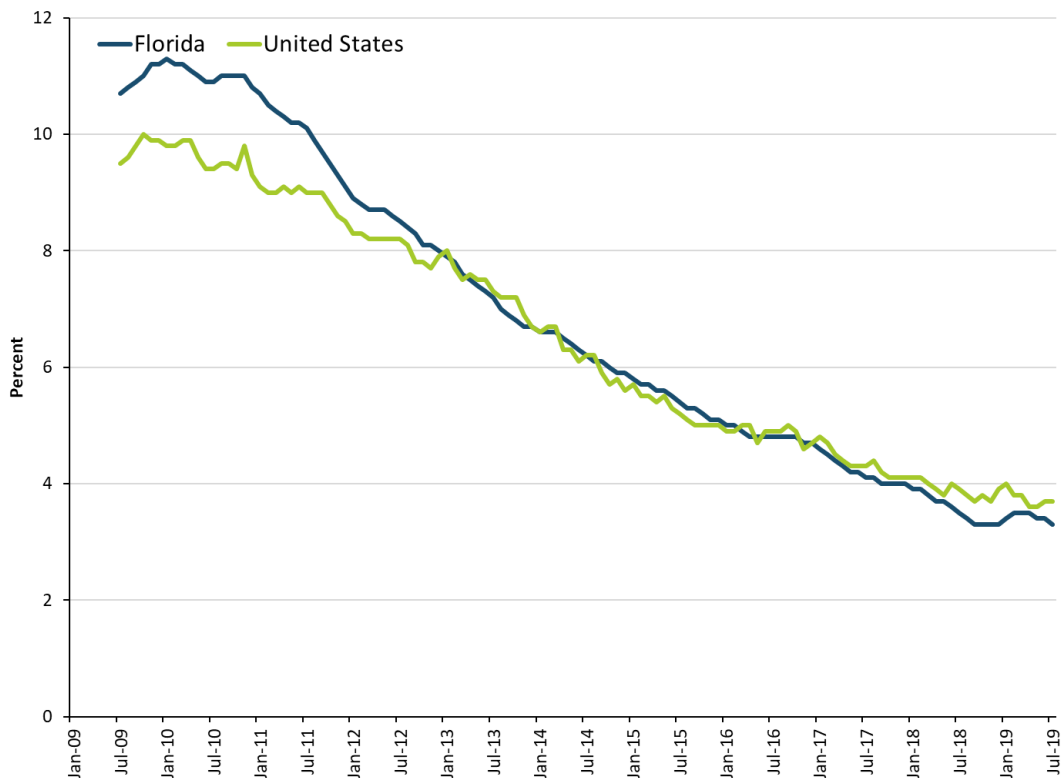

### Florida's July Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.3 percent in July 2019, down 0.1 percentage point from the June 2019 rate, and down 0.2 percentage point from a year ago. There were 344,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,354,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 3.7 percent in July.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 9,012,000 in July 2019, an increase of 22,900 jobs (+0.3 percent) over the month. This is the first time in Florida history, the seasonally adjusted employment level crossed the 9 million threshold. The state gained 227,200 jobs over the year, an increase of 2.6 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.5 percent over the year. With the exception of September 2017, Florida's over-the-year job growth rate has exceeded the nation's rate since April 2012.

## Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida was 9,012,000 in July 2019, up 227,200 jobs compared to a year ago. The industry gaining the most jobs was education and health services (+65,900 jobs, +5.1 percent).

Other industries gaining jobs over the year included professional and business services (+41,900 jobs, +3.1 percent); leisure and hospitality (+25,900 jobs, +2.1 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+23,000 jobs, +1.3 percent); construction (+21,300 jobs, +3.9 percent); financial activities (+18,200 jobs, +3.2 percent); manufacturing (+12,600 jobs, +3.4 percent); other services (+8,800 jobs, +2.5 percent); government (+8,600 jobs, +0.8 percent); and information (+500 jobs, +0.4 percent).

## Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In July 2019, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.3 percent), followed by Okaloosa County (2.8 percent), and Walton County and St. Johns County (2.9 percent each).
- Hendry County had the highest unemployment rate (8.2 percent) in Florida in July 2019, followed by Hardee County (6.7 percent), Citrus County and Highlands County (5.2 percent each), and Glades County (4.9 percent).

## Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In July 2019, 23 out of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+49,000 jobs, +3.8 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+31,700 jobs, +2.7 percent) and Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+31,500 jobs, +2.4 percent).
- One metro area in Florida experienced an over-the-year job loss in July 2019, Panama City (-2,400 jobs, -2.7 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
