

Fire units were dispatched to a smoke coming from the roof of the former Baptise church now Flagler playhouse. upon arrival battalion 62 found the structure with heavy smoke coming from the roof's eve and ridge vents found during a 360 survey. Command was established at this time and E62 was directed to the front of the building to Starte a search of the structure with R62. upon entre the crews were met with heavy smoke conditions and advanced into the structure discovering fire in the back upper story of the structure and where able to conduct a fire attack on the fire. after a few minutes it became evident that the crews where not making any headway on the fire and the order was given to evacuate the building. all crew where able to exit safely and a defensive attack was started. It was noted that the fire had progressed through the roof of the building and was venting at this time. T24 was placed on the A side of the building, L11 was placed on the B side and Q93 from Ormond placed on the D side to establish an aerial master stream.

## **Unit Narrative**

R62 arrived on scene as the first arriving rescue, and we were assigned to primary search of the "Flagler Playhouse" building. A full search was performed, and there were no notable findings during search. The search was extended to the fire building, where we searched behind the stage, up the stairs, and found the fire room. The information was relayed over the radio, and we hastily met with the attack crew at the front of the building to guide them on where to go to reach the fire. Fire was found and suppressed with attack line. R62 headed to rehab. R62 proceeded to help E62 with search of a non-involved nearby building; all clear and no notable findings. R62 then proceeded to be general manpower throughout the remainder of our time at the call. R62 was then relieved by command to rehab and return to service.

## **Unit Narrative**

Prior to arrival Tender 92 was directed to park on the Bravo side of the building. Heavy smoke and fire noted on the BC corner. Tender 92 linked up with Engine 25 crew. We made our way to the BC corner of the building with flames showing through a 2nd floor window in the attic area. Orders were given to crews to soften the building. Crews forced approximatly 4-5 doors. Engine 16 was requested to reposition to our location. Engine 16 was originally positioned on the C side of the structure. Engine 16 relocated to the B side and parked in the grass. Tender 92 supplied Engine 16 with water. Tender 92 crew assisted in deployment and placement of 400' of 1 3/4" line and placement of the master stream. Line was charged and entry was made on the Bravo side. Fire quickly traveled across the attic space and was seen through the ridge vent and gable end vents. Command was informed of findings by Tender 92 LT and Engine 16 LT. Command communicated with interior crew and asked their progress at which point they were ordered out of the building. Tender 92 LT requested Engine 16 driver initiate evacuation air horn blast. Engine 16 driver did so. Water supply to a hydrant was established by Tender 92 and Engine 16 drivers. Once out of the building all members were separated based on their unit and a PAR check was conducted - all found to be PAR. We transitioned to a defensive operation. Tender 92 LT was assigned Charlie Division by command. Charlie Division. B side and C side exposure were cooled down constantly and conditions reassessed. Ground monitor and deck gun was also utilized for fire suppression. Command was informed of findings / changes in conditions. Tender 92 crew along with FF from Rescue 92 assisted in checking for extension / overhaul on the Delta side. Tender 92 crew after overhaul assisted in repacking of LDH and handlines as the fire was going to be handled with aerial units. Tender 92 was released by command and returned to station for showers and post-fire decontamination of equipment.

#### **Unit Narrative**

E62 dispatched to a report of a structure fire. Arrived on scene and positioned by command at the alpha side of the structure. E62 crew reported having visible smoke from the eaves on the alpha, bravo, and delta side. E62 assigned R62 crew to force the doors and search the annex directly to the east of the main building. E62 forced the main doors and performed a rapid primary search. Smoke conditions on the interior were moderate to heavy with limited visibility past the vestibule. An inspection hole just inside the front door was made with a hook and heavy volume driven smoke was noted. E62 It reported to command the fire may be on the charlie side and met up with R62, R52, and PCFD L25. The crews split and assisted with advancing the charged 1 3/4 to the charlie side where what appeared to be the seat of the fire was located and extinguished. E62 It noted at this time to command that interior conditions had changed lightly after the application of water, but the smoke from the inspection hole appeared to be getting worse, leading the E62 crew to consider a fire in the void spaces closer to the Charlie/delta corner. After fire vented through the roof, command reassigned all units to the bravo side. E62 crew was assigned to take R62 and clear the two story annex to the south. After cleared, E62It was designated as Alpha division supervisor. E62 crew assisted by providing manpower salvage and overhaul, and active firefighting duties. E62 It monitored conditions on the alpha side and reported frequently directly to IC. Once the fire was deemed out, E62 crew assisted with salvage and overhaul and loading equipment. E62 crew released from the scene without incident.

## **Unit Narrative**

R51 self dispatches to the call based on hearing the call come out and knowing the location. R51 arrives on scene and is advised to bring man power to the A side of the structure. R51 crew meets E62 crew who advises they and rescue 62 are performing a search. R51 crew is met with smoke about 6ft off the ground just inside the structure. R51 places an inspection hole in the ceiling just inside the front door to check conditions. Light smoke is noted to come out of the hole. Upon entering the main entrance of the play house no visible fire is seen and even with the thermal imaging camera nothing obvious is noted. R51 crew is met by R62 crew who advise that they found the fire in the back of the structure behind the stage. R51 crew and R62 crew grab the 1 3/4 line and advance it though the seating area the what is believed to be over the stage and into the back stage area. A back up line is called to be deployed. At this time a small amount of fire is noted at the base of stairs. With more fire noted up the stairwell. Crew extinguishes first fire and advances up the stairs. At the top of the stairs there is moderate fire noted. Water is put on fire however as soon as that is done visibility drops. from that point forward a tic was used to find areas of heat. The bulk of the fire was never fully located. It appeared to be in void spaces on the second floor that we were not able to get good access to. Outside crews advise that fire had vented through the roof in our location however the hose team was never able to locate that fire. Command makes decision to pull interior crews out of the structure and go defensive. R51 crew then assists E16 and T92 with water supply and defensive operations for the rest of the event.

Responded out to structure fire per request from on duty Battalion Chief Barry. Upon arrival found structure well involved in fire. Fire coming from the roof of the structure. I could not enter the structure until 0800 am do to firefighting activities. I did work the out side of the structure. working counter clockwise starting on the Alpha side of the structure. Finding very heavy damage at the eves of the roof. Moving counter clockwise to the Bravo side of the structure finding the same thing. Heavy fire damage in the roof and eve area. Working my way to the Charlie side of the structure I find myself working around two more building two story in height with no fire involvement light smoke do to all the buildings being connected. Fire was contain to the attic space of the main building. Building is of type III ordinary construction. Fire ran through the attic until the roof collapsed into the building.

I made entry from the Alpha side of the structure. Work from less damage to most damage. Finding most damage to be in the attic that had collapsed inside the building. Working up the stairs behind the stage to the second floor. Still the damage is above the ceiling. Most of the trusses that have not falling in are consist with an attic fire charring on the top of the trusses clean on the bottom side of the trusses. Coming back down the stairs we notice part of the drywall missing from the wall in the stairwell beside a chimney. Inside this wall we find heavy charring and some missing wall studs'. While looking and this area and the depth of charring and the missing wall studs, and the lack of fire damage below this area, and the amount of fire damage coming up and out of this area. companied with the direct line to the attic space with no fire stops. we found this to be the area of origin. For the cause of it will be undetermined do to fire damage itself.
