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Florida's January Employment Figures Released

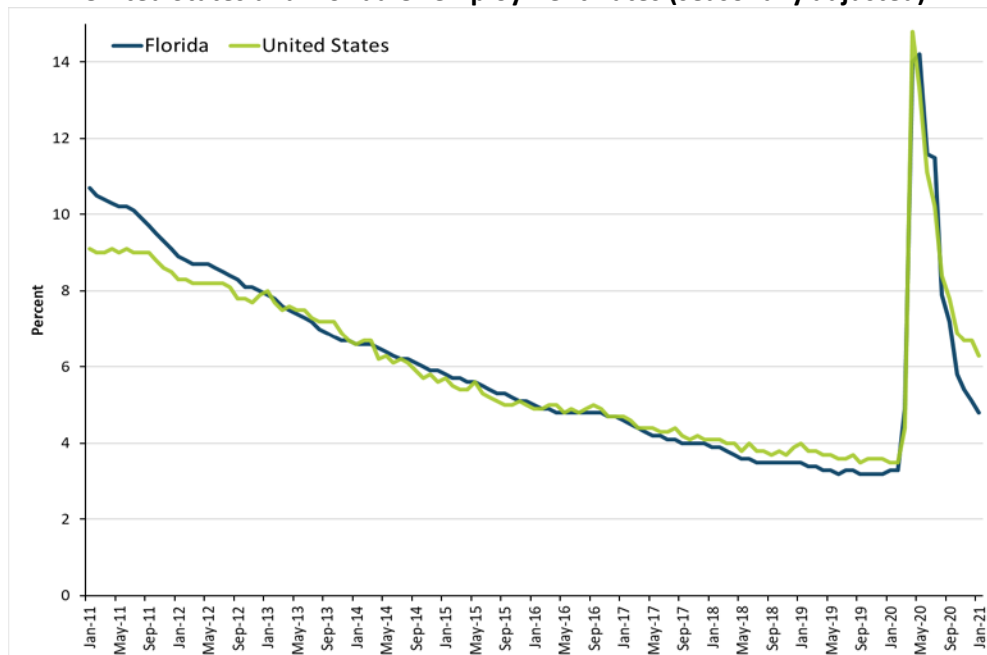
NOTE TO EDITORS: Every March, the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity release January employment and unemployment estimates as well as revised historical data. Today's report is the result of that annual process, which is known as "benchmarking." Benchmark revisions are a standard part of the estimation process and take place at this time every year in each state nationwide. Due to the unprecedented economic changes that occurred this past year, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics updated the statistical models that produce labor force, employment, unemployment, and the unemployment rate estimates. Most of the historical revisions in the labor force statistics can be attributed to this new model. Information on the changes to model-based estimation is available on the BLS website at www.bls.gov/lau/gen-5-changes-in-2021.htm. As a result of this annual benchmarking process, the release of January and February 2020 employment data is scheduled for March 15 and March 26, respectively.

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.8 percent in January 2021, down 0.3 percentage point from the revised December 2020 rate, and up 1.5 percentage points from a year ago. There were 482,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,069,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 6.3 percent in January.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,491,200 in January 2021, a decrease of 800 jobs (less than -0.1 percent) over the month. The state lost 571,800 jobs over the year, a decrease of 6.3 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs fell 6.3 percent over the year.

January labor statistics reflect the continued effects of COVID-19 and the efforts to reopen businesses and services.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,269,200 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back over half of the jobs lost (+688,300 jobs).
- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,491,200 in January 2021, down 571,800 jobs compared to a year ago. All ten major industries experienced negative over-the-year job growth in January.
- The industry losing the most jobs over the year was leisure and hospitality (-284,100 jobs, -22.3 percent).

Other industries losing jobs over the year included trade, transportation, and utilities (-74,400 jobs, -4.1 percent); education and health services (-55,500 jobs, -4.1 percent); total government (-52,600, -4.6 percent); professional and business services (-36,700 jobs, -2.6 percent); other services (-31,600 jobs, -8.9 percent); information (-11,100 jobs, -8.0 percent); manufacturing (-10,300 jobs, -2.6 percent); construction (-9,900 jobs, -1.7 percent); and financial activities (-6,900 jobs, -1.1 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In January 2021, St. Johns County and Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.5 percent each), followed by Wakulla County (3.7 percent), and Santa Rosa County, Okaloosa County and Collier County (3.9 percent each).
- Miami-Dade County had the highest unemployment rate (8.1 percent) in Florida in January 2021, followed by Osceola County (7.0 percent), Hamilton County (6.7 percent), and Putnam County (6.6 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In January 2021, 23 out of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job losses. The areas with the largest losses were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (-172,400 jobs, -12.9 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (-107,600 jobs, -8.8 percent), and Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (-62,700 jobs, -7.2 percent).
- Only one out of 24 metro areas in Florida experienced an over-the-year job gain in January 2021: Lakeland-Winter Haven (2,100 jobs, +0.9 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
