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Florida's January Employment Figures Released

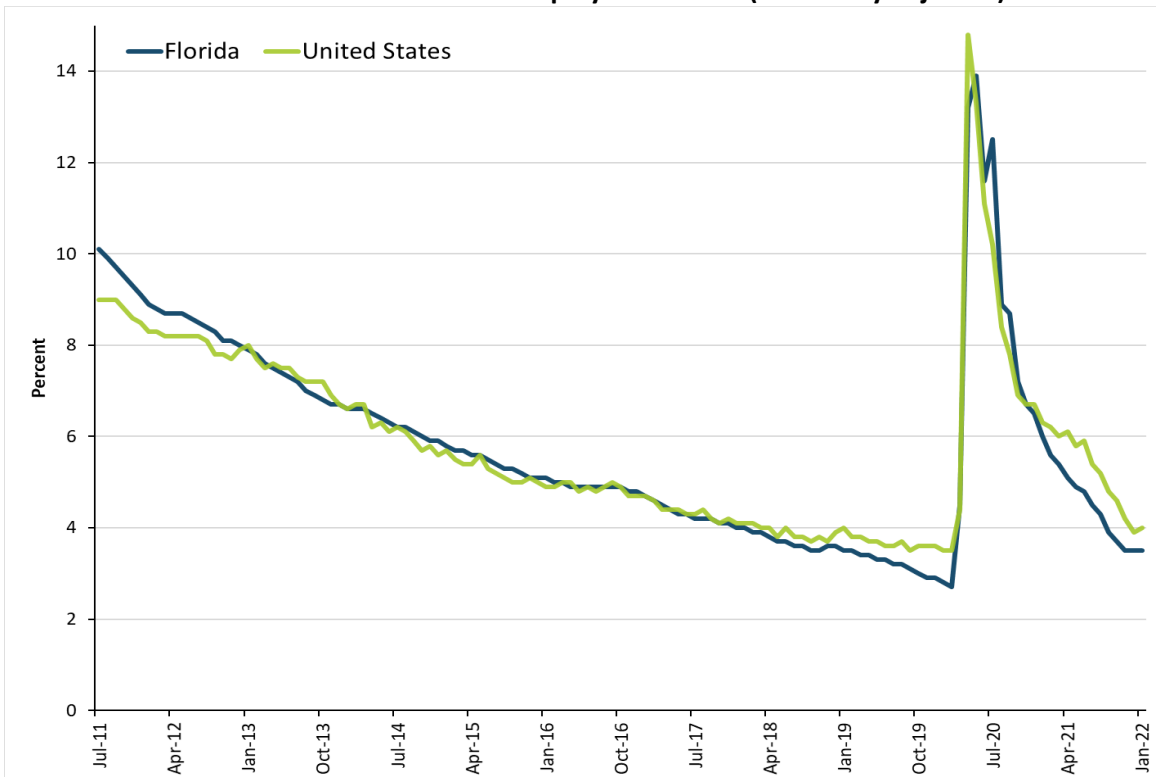
NOTE TO EDITORS: Every March, the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity release January employment and unemployment estimates as well as revised historical data. Today's report is the result of that annual process, which is known as "benchmarking." Benchmark revisions are a standard part of the estimation process and take place at this time every year in each state nationwide. As a result of this annual benchmarking process, the release of January and February 2022 employment data is scheduled for March 14 and March 25, respectively.

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.5 percent in January 2022, unchanged from the revised December 2021 rate, and down 2.5 percentage points from a year ago. There were 364,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,448,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 4.0 percent in January.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 9,163,800 in January 2022, an increase of 25,300 jobs (+0.3 percent) over the month. The state gained 504,000 jobs over the year, an increase of 5.8 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 4.7 percent over the year.

With the release of revised historical data, we now know that the state of Florida surpassed pre-pandemic total nonagricultural job growth in October 2021 and that the state's labor force exceeded the pre-pandemic level in June 2021, one month earlier than previously reported.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,282,500 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back all jobs lost (+1,370,800 jobs).
- The number of jobs in Florida reached a new record level of 9,163,800 in January 2022, up 504,000 jobs compared to a year ago. All ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in January.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+179,100 jobs, +17.4 percent); professional and business services (+100,700 jobs, +7.2 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+94,500 jobs, +5.3 percent); financial activities (+34,500 jobs, +5.7 percent); education and health services (+27,900 jobs, +2.1 percent); other services (+16,900 jobs, +5.2 percent); construction (+15,000 jobs, +2.6 percent); manufacturing (+14,900 jobs, +3.9 percent); information (+11,000 jobs, +8.3 percent); and total government (+7,300 jobs, +0.7 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In January 2022, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.3 percent), followed by St. Johns County (2.6 percent), and Wakulla County and Okaloosa County (2.8 percent each).
- Hamilton County and Putnam County had the highest unemployment rates (5.1 percent each) in Florida in January 2022, followed by Citrus County (5.0 percent), and Highlands County (4.9 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In January 2022, 23 out of all 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+110,500 jobs, +9.1 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+78,700 jobs, +6.9 percent), and Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+69,400 jobs, +5.1 percent).
- One metro area in Florida experienced an over-the-year job loss: Sebring (-100 jobs, -0.4 percent)

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
