



Florida's February Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 2.8 percent in February 2020, unchanged from January 2020, and down 0.6 percentage point from a year ago. Florida's unemployment rate tied the record low of 2.8 percent. There were 291,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,456,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 3.5 percent in February.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 9,075,900 in February 2020, an increase of 7,100 jobs (+0.1 percent) over the month. The state gained 169,800 jobs over the year, an increase of 1.9 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.6 percent over the year. With the exception of September 2017, Florida's over-the-year job growth rate has exceeded the nation's rate since April 2012.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The total nonagricultural employment in Florida was 9,075,900 in February 2020, up 169,800 jobs compared to a year ago. The industry gaining the most jobs was education and health services (+35,600 jobs, +2.7 percent).
- Other industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+28,400 jobs, +2.3 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+27,000 jobs, +1.5 percent); professional and business services (+26,200 jobs, +1.9 percent); construction (+25,000 jobs, +4.5 percent); government (+12,100 jobs, +1.1 percent); financial activities (+10,800 jobs, +1.8 percent); manufacturing (+5,100 jobs, +1.3 percent); and other services (+1,900 jobs, +0.5 percent).
- The one industry losing jobs was information (-2,000 jobs, -1.4 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In February 2020, Miami-Dade County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (1.5 percent), followed by Monroe County (2.0 percent), St. Johns County (2.5 percent) and Okaloosa County and Alachua County (2.7 percent each).
- Citrus County had the highest unemployment rate (4.8 percent) in Florida in February 2020, followed by Hendry County (4.7 percent), Sumter County (4.6 percent) and Highlands County (4.4 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In February 2020, 21 out of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+36,200 jobs, +2.6 percent), Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+31,100 jobs, +2.4 percent), and Jacksonville (+21,500 jobs, +3.0 percent).
- Three metro areas in Florida experienced an over-the-year job loss in February 2020, Homosassa Springs (-200 jobs, -0.6 percent), Naples-Immokalee-Marco Island (-200 jobs, -0.1 percent), and Panama City (-100 jobs, -0.1 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
