

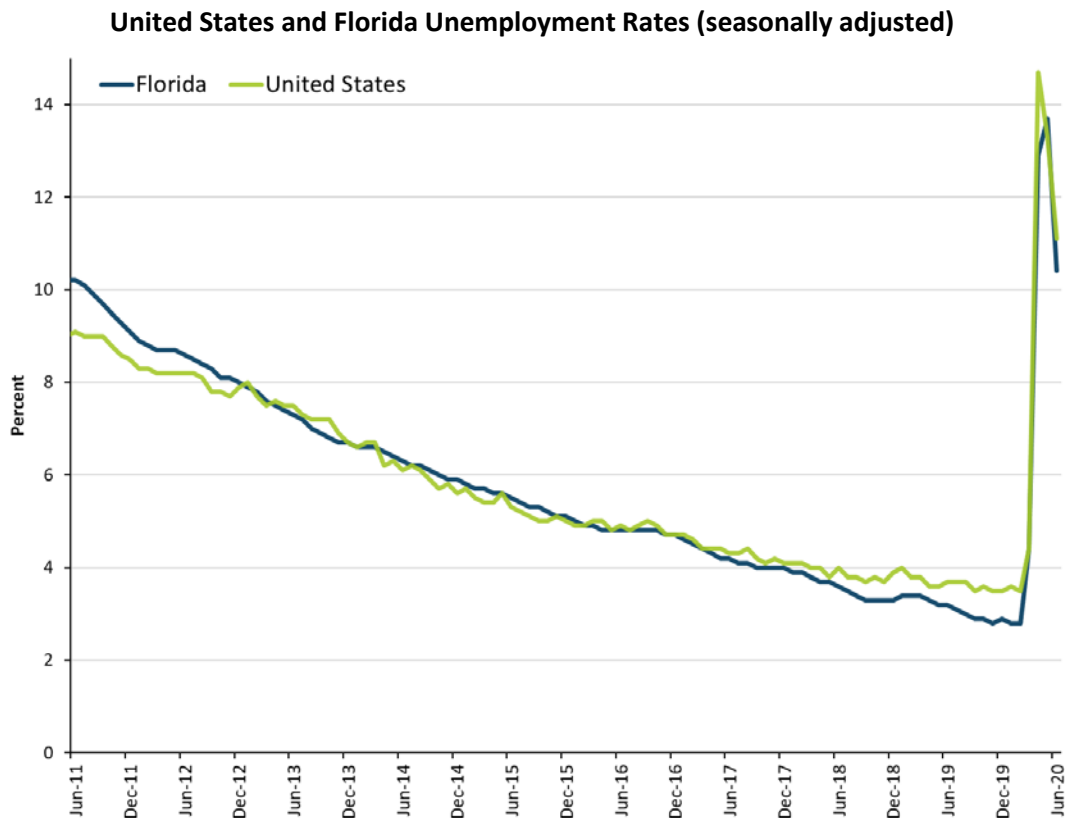

Florida's June Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 10.4 percent in June 2020, down 3.3 percentage points from the revised May 2020 rate, and up 7.2 percentage points from a year ago. There were 1,021,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 9,770,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 11.1 percent in June.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,396,900 in June 2020, an increase of 296,000 jobs (+3.7 percent) over the month. The state lost 541,800 jobs over the year, a decrease of 6.1 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs fell 8.6 percent over the year.

June labor statistics reflect the continued effects of COVID-19 and the efforts to reopen businesses and services.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,396,900 in June 2020, down 541,8000 jobs compared to a year ago. The only industry gaining jobs over the year was construction (+4,600 jobs, +0.8 percent).
- The industry losing the most jobs over the year was leisure and hospitality (-268,400 jobs, -21.5 percent).

Other industries losing jobs over the year included professional and business services (-87,500 jobs, -6.3 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (-64,700 jobs, -3.6 percent); education and health services (-41,500 jobs, -3.1 percent); other services (-34,700 jobs, -9.8 percent); government (-18,100 jobs, -1.6 percent); manufacturing (-13,100 jobs, - 3.4 percent); information (-10,500 jobs, -7.6 percent); and financial activities (-7,400 jobs, -1.3 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In June 2020, Lafayette County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (4.9 percent), followed by Union County (5.6 percent), and DeSoto County, Wakulla County and Gilchrist County (5.9 percent each).
- Osceola County had the highest unemployment rate (22.9 percent) in Florida in June 2020, followed by Orange County (17.2 percent), Lake County (14.3 percent), and Polk County (14.1 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In June 2020, 23 out of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job losses. The areas with the largest losses were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (-169,800 jobs, -12.9 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (-73,000 jobs, -6.1 percent), and Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Kendall (-69,500 jobs, -8.1 percent).
- One metro area in Florida experienced an over-the-year job gain in June 2020: The Villages (+100 jobs, +0.3 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
