


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#### Florida's November Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 2.6 percent in November 2022, down 0.1 percentage point from the October 2022 rate, and down 0.9 percentage point from a year ago. There were 280,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,756,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 3.7 percent in November.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 9,562,900 in November 2022, an increase of 28,100 jobs (+0.3 percent) over the month. The state gained 428,200 jobs over the year, an increase of 4.7 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 3.3 percent over the year.

Florida's total nonagricultural and private sector employment surpassed the February 2020 (pre-pandemic) level in October 2021 and labor force surpassed the February 2020 level in June 2021. All nine major private sector industries have surpassed pre-pandemic employment levels.

### Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,282,500 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back all jobs lost (+1,769,900 jobs).
- All ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in November.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+97,000 jobs, +8.1 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+85,400 jobs, +4.5 percent); education and health services (+76,800 jobs, +5.7 percent); professional and business services (+40,400 jobs, +2.7 percent); other services (+32,900 jobs, +9.6 percent); financial activities (+31,900 jobs, +5.0 percent); manufacturing (+26,600 jobs, +6.7 percent); construction (+22,600 jobs, +3.9 percent); total government (+7,500 jobs, +0.7 percent); and information (+7,200 jobs, +5.0 percent).

### Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In November 2022, Miami-Dade County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (1.5 percent), followed by Monroe County (1.6 percent), and Okaloosa County and St. Johns County (2.2 percent each).
- Hendry County and Highlands County had the highest unemployment rate (4.2 percent each) in Florida in November 2022, followed by Citrus County (4.1 percent), and Hamilton County (3.9 percent).

#### Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In November 2022, 23 of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+73,600 jobs, +5.1 percent), Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+61,200 jobs, +4.6 percent), and Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+58,800 jobs, +4.8 percent).
- One metro area in Florida experienced an over-the-year job loss: Sebring MSA (-600 jobs, -2.3 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
