

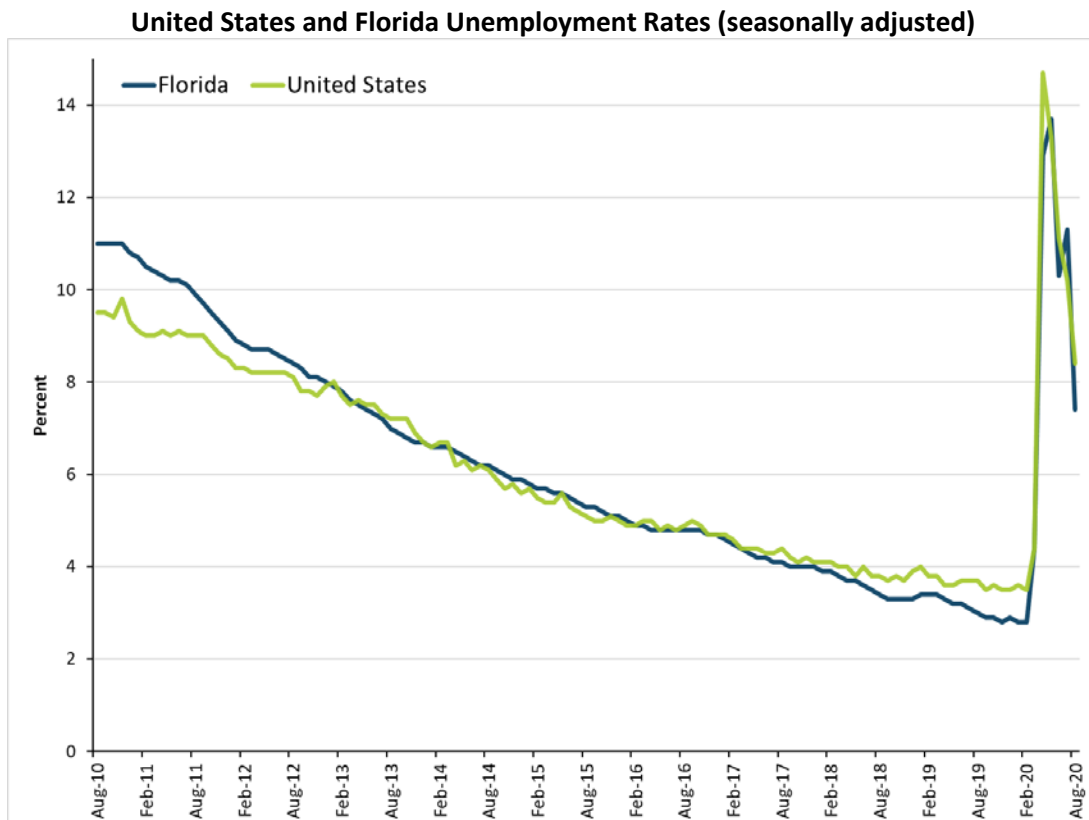

Florida's August Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 7.4 percent in August 2020, down 4.0 percentage points from the revised July 2020 rate, and up 4.4 percentage points from a year ago. There were 753,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,138,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 8.4 percent in August.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,525,100 in August 2020, an increase of 57,900 jobs (+0.7 percent) over the month. The state lost 456,100 jobs over the year, a decrease of 5.1 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs fell 6.8 percent over the year.

August labor statistics reflect the continued effects of COVID-19 and the efforts to reopen businesses and services.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,178,100 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back over half of the jobs lost (+631,600 jobs).
- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,525,100 in August 2020, down 456,100 jobs compared to a year ago. Nine of ten major industries experienced negative over-the-year job growth in August.
- The industry gaining jobs over the year was government (+1,900 jobs, +0.2 percent).
- The industry losing the most jobs over the year was leisure and hospitality (-249,400 jobs, -19.8 percent).

Other industries losing jobs over the year included professional and business services (-69,600 jobs, -5.0 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (-54,500 jobs, -3.0 percent); other services (-30,200 jobs, -8.5 percent); education and health services (-16,400 jobs, -1.2 percent); information (-12,700 jobs, -9.2 percent); manufacturing (-11,500 jobs, -3.0 percent); financial activities (-8,100 jobs, -1.4 percent); and construction (-5,500 jobs, -1.0 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In August 2020, Lafayette County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.4 percent), followed by Liberty County (4.1 percent), Wakulla County (4.2 percent), and Baker County, Gilchrist County, and Union County (4.4 percent each).
- Osceola County had the highest unemployment rate (15.1 percent) in Florida in August 2020, followed by Orange County (11.6 percent), Broward County and Polk County (9.3 percent each), and Lake County (8.8 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In August 2020, 23 out of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job losses. The areas with the largest losses were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (-120,200 jobs, -9.0 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (-75,800 jobs, -6.2 percent), and Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (-75,200 jobs, -8.7 percent).
- One metro area in Florida experienced an over-the-year job gain in August 2020: The Villages (+100 jobs, +0.3 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
