

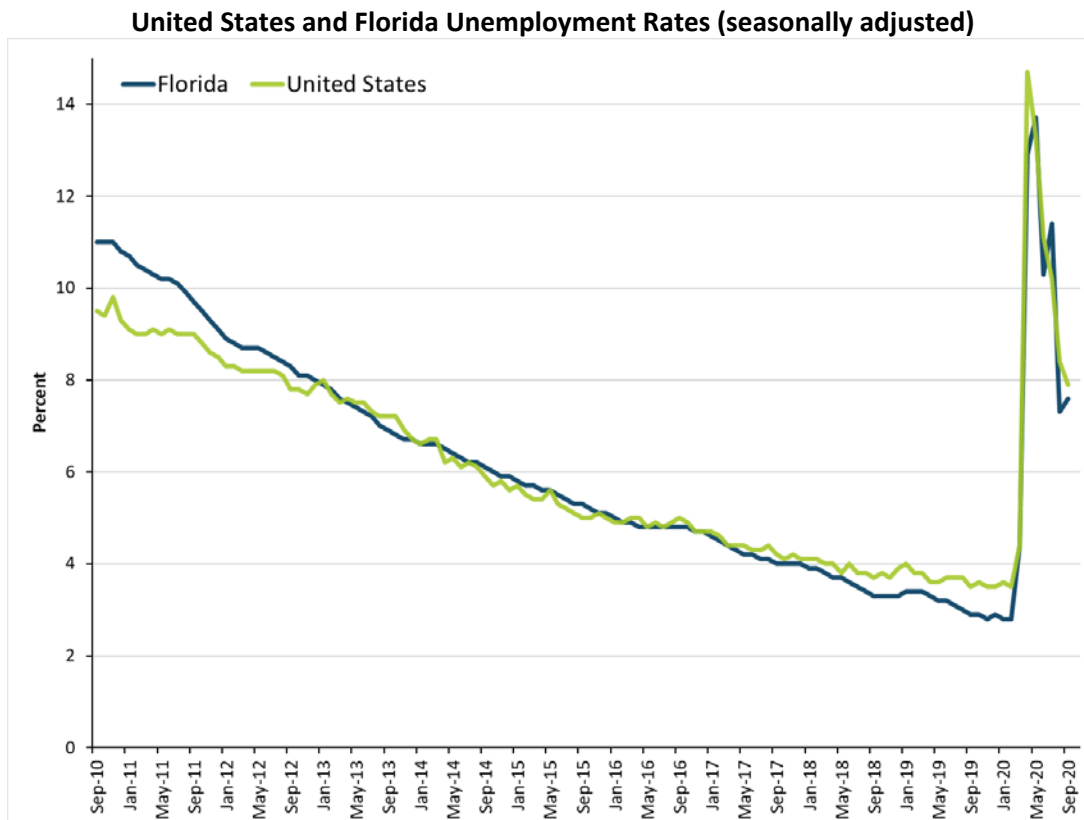
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Florida's September Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 7.6 percent in September 2020, up 0.3 percentage point from the revised August 2020 rate, and up 4.7 percentage points from a year ago. There were 770,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,143,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 7.9 percent in September.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,532,500 in September 2020, an increase of 47,300 jobs (+0.6 percent) over the month. The state lost 451,100 jobs over the year, a decrease of 5.0 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs fell 6.4 percent over the year.

September labor statistics reflect the continued effects of COVID-19 and the efforts to reopen businesses and services.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,178,100 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back over half of the jobs lost (+639,000 jobs).
- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,532,500 in September 2020, down 451,100 jobs compared to a year ago. All ten major industries experienced negative over-the-year job growth in September.
- The industry losing the most jobs over the year was leisure and hospitality (-234,900 jobs, -18.7 percent).

Other industries losing jobs over the year included professional and business services (-67,200 jobs, -4.8 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (-41,600 jobs, -2.3 percent); other services (-31,500 jobs, -8.9 percent); total government (-31,200, -2.8 percent); education and health services (-12,100 jobs, -0.9 percent); information (-10,700 jobs, -7.7 percent); construction (-9,100 jobs, -1.6 percent); manufacturing (-7,300 jobs, -1.9 percent); and financial activities (-5,400 jobs, -0.9 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In September 2020, Lafayette County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.4 percent), followed by Wakulla County (3.6 percent), Union County (3.7 percent), Santa Rosa County (3.8 percent), and Gilchrist County (3.9 percent).
- Osceola County had the highest unemployment rate (13.3 percent) in Florida in September 2020, followed by Miami-Dade County (13.0 percent), Orange County (10.4 percent), Polk County (8.4 percent), and Broward County (8.2 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In September 2020, 20 out of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job losses. The areas with the largest losses were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (-126,500 jobs, -9.5 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (-76,600 jobs, -6.3 percent), and Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (-65,900 jobs, -7.6 percent).
- Four metro areas in Florida experienced an over-the-year job gain in September 2020: Ocala (1,700 jobs, +1.6 percent), Punta Gorda (+600 jobs, +1.2 percent), Sebring (+200 jobs +0.8 percent), and The Villages (+200 jobs, +0.6 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
