

Florida's March Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.8 percent in March 2017, down 0.2 percentage point from 5.0 percent in February 2017, and down 0.1 percentage point from a year ago. There were 483,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,108,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 4.5 percent in March.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,554,000 in March 2017, an increase of 6,200 jobs (+0.1 percent) over the month. The state gained 246,100 jobs over the year, an increase of 3.0 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.5 percent over the year. Florida's over-the-year job growth rate has exceeded the nation's rate since May 2012.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,554,000 in March 2017, up 246,100 jobs compared to a year ago. March 2017 was the 80th consecutive month with positive over-the-year job growth. The industry gaining the most jobs was education and health services (+44,300 jobs, +3.6 percent).
- Other industries gaining jobs included professional and business services (+43,500 jobs, +3.4 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+40,300 jobs, +2.4 percent); construction (+36,500 jobs, +7.9 percent); leisure and hospitality (+31,200 jobs, +2.7 percent); manufacturing (+13,100 jobs, +3.7 percent); financial activities (+12,700 jobs, +2.3 percent); other services (+12,700 jobs, +3.7 percent); and government (+12,300 jobs, +1.1 percent).
- Information was the only industry losing jobs (-500 jobs, -0.4 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In March 2017, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.8 percent), followed by St. Johns County (3.3 percent); and Okaloosa and Wakulla counties (3.5 percent each).
- Hendry County had the highest unemployment rate (6.4 percent) in Florida in March 2017, followed by Sumter County (6.1 percent); and Citrus and Hardee counties (5.9 percent each).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In March 2017, 23 out of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+44,100 jobs, +3.4 percent), Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+42,800 jobs, +3.6 percent), and Ft. Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (+27,800 jobs, +3.4 percent).
- Homosassa Springs was the only metro area to lose jobs (-200 jobs, -0.6 percent)

Note: The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
