



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NARRATIVE / CONTINUATION

1 On May 22nd 2010, at approximately 0830 hrs, Inv. Seymour was contacted by Inv. Welch regarding the potentially untimely death of 43 year-old,
 2 Monique Forte. Inv. Welch advised that she was currently at Florida Hospital Deland, were the victim had been transported upon being discovered
 3 in an unresponsive state at her home. Inv. Welch advised that the victim's husband, Chad Bleuel, and other family associates were also present.
 4 Inv. Welch reported some confusion over the victim's organ donor status. Inv. Seymour advised Inv. Welch to notify the Medical Examiner's Office,
 5 and relinquish to that office their lawful jurisdiction over the body.

 7 Inv. Seymour arrived at the hospital and met with Inv. Welch, who advised that the victim had been last seen alive by the husband and a
 8 houseguest, Ellen Bladwin, during the evening prior. The victim reported having trouble breathing, "seeing stars", and vomiting at approximately
 9 2130hrs. The victim went to bed and was heard snoring by the husband until approximately 0230 hrs. The husband found the victim unresponsive
 10 at approximately 0420hrs, at which time he called 911 and began CPR. The victim was transported to Florida Hospital Deland, and pronounced
 11 dead at 0528 hrs. Inv. Welch advised that the ER staff reported the finding of the potential presence of cocaine in the victim's system.

 13 Inv. Welch advised that she had already taken recorded statements from the relative persons, thus Inv. Seymour did not repeat the process. Inv.
 14 Welch further advised that the residence where the incident occurred, at 63 Fernwood Trail in Deland, was being maintained as a crime scene with
 15 a Deputy posted.

 17 Inv. Seymour conducted a cursory inspection of the victim's body. Inv. Seymour noted the presence of the medical apparatus typically attached
 18 during resuscitation efforts. Inv. Seymour also noted incidental minor bruising scattered about the body that did not appear to be life threatening,
 19 and was possibly related to the resuscitation efforts. Inv. Seymour also noted a pattern of what appeared to be petechial style hemorrhages
 20 present along the left leg, extending into to lower, left abdomen. It should be noted that while this abnormality had the appearance of petechial
 21 hemorrhaging, it was not conclusively determined by Inv. Seymour to be so, and the term is for descriptive purposes only.
 22
 23 Inv. Seymour then opted to visit the residence at 63 Fernwood Trail. Inv. Seymour found the residence to be secure and posted by a Deputy. Inv.
 24 Seymour conducted a walk-through of the home. Inv. Seymour noted that the home was clean, well maintained, and in good order. Inv. Seymour
 25 found nothing suspicious or noteworthy towards the case. Inv. Seymour relieved the posted Deputy and turned the house key over to the neighbor
 26 at 62 Fernwood Trail.

 28 Inv. Seymour then returned to the Hospital, but found that the husband and witness had left. Inv. Seymour left the husband a voicemail regarding
 29 the location of the key, and advising to call Inv. Seymour with any questions or concerns.
 30
 31 On the same date, Inv. Seymour received a call from Central Dispatch requesting that Inv. Seymour call the husband. During the call, Inv.
 32 Seymour offered condolences, a chaplain, and any assistance the Sheriff's Office could offer. Inv. Seymour related information about the standard
 33 procedures that would follow, and provided the husband with the phone number to the Medical Examiner's Office.

 35 On Monday, May 24, 2010, at 0830 hrs, Inv. Seymour contacted Inv. Burch of the Medical Examiner's Office regarding any new findings and the
 36 scheduling of the autopsy. Inv. Seymour was advised that autopsy had taken place on the day prior. Inv. Seymour inquired about the pattern on
 37 the leg and abdomen. Inv. Burch advised that it could be related to an apparent aortal rupture that the victim had suffered. Inv. Seymour then
 38 inquired about the presence of cocaine, as alleged by the hospital staff. Inv. Burch advised that no on-scene toxicology testing was conducted.
 39 Inv. Burch advised that the case would be pending further studies and standard based on standard toxicology testing.
