The string's program mission: to provide free, quality instruction and performance opportunities in orchestral and chamber music ensembles for Flagler County students at all skill levels. Our commitment to musical excellence and cultural diversity fosters a lifelong love of music while our performances enrich the musical life of our young community and reflect its growing commitment to





- After-school program available to all children 8 years and older
- Location: Indian Trails Middle School (shared space, not dedicated)
- Seven instructors facilitating the program; five orchestras
- · Hybrid program equally focused on instruction and performance opportunities
- Scope and sequence crafted in 2012 and developed each year
- Yearly audition process for experienced players
- Two hours of instructions per week per student; 17 one-hour classes each week
- Students expected to provide own instruments, but scholarships available
- Family's cost per student for supplies to get started: \$26-\$37; instrument rentals \$17-\$50/month

Artistic Director

- Develop educational objectives and goals for the strings program; and draft, implement and revise, as needed, the scope and sequence and course description to meet these objectives and goals.
- Research, coordinate, and write teaching materials to be used throughout the program.
- Develop, implement, and revise, as needed, the evaluation rubric standards for measuring performance success of individual students of the strings program.
- Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of teaching staff in meeting overall educational mission of the strings program.
- Provide teacher development as needed in order to meet educational goals.
- Assist in the general promotion of the orchestra by being available for public appearances and various activities.
- Assist the program director with budgeting decisions, scheduling and coordinating all concerts, rehearsals, fundraisers, and special events for all orchestras for the season.
- Program pedagogically appropriate repertoire for all orchestras.



Program Director: Oversee and administrate the district's county-wide Strings Program

- Recruit students; schedule, manage and supervise all rehearsals, produce concerts and coordinate community performances.
- · Liaison with school administrators, custodial and parents.
- Volunteers: recruit, organize, train and supervise volunteers.
- · Chaperone or coordinate supervision of students at all public music performances.
- · Collaborate with artistic director to establish overall program educational goals.
- Address parent concerns or needs, consulting with the Artistic Director or teachers when necessary.
- Oversee student discipline outside of the classroom.
- Fundraise and research opportunities to meet the growing demands of the program.
- · Produce printed concert programs.
- · Manage all other non-artistic responsibilities for the betterment of the students.
- Provide support to music teachers and students by preparing all student materials.
- · Coordinate instrument repairs, restring and repair instruments when possible, consulting Artistic Director when necessary.
