I am submitting my application for the position of City Manager of Palm Coast as a twenty-two year resident of this ever changing and beautiful city. As a community, we have experienced the benefits of a master planned city integrated into spectacular Intracoastal frontage, wildlife, preserves, parks and recreational centers. I bring to this position a substantial knowledge of the history of Palm Coast from its inception, a love of what Palm Coast offers and a deep appreciation of the educational, life style and job opportunities it has brought to my family.

I believe I have the proper mixture of public and private experience necessary to be successful in this position. I have spent four years as counsel to an economic development agency responsible for attracting high paying industrial and commercial jobs to a community of two hundred thousand people. In addition, I have represented multiple city councils and planning boards on operational issues and at public meetings. As Sheriff of Flagler County, I was responsible for hiring, training and oversight of 300 employees and preparing a yearly budget. I have been a member of the Flagler County Chamber Board of Directors and a member of the Chamber Business Issues Committee.
