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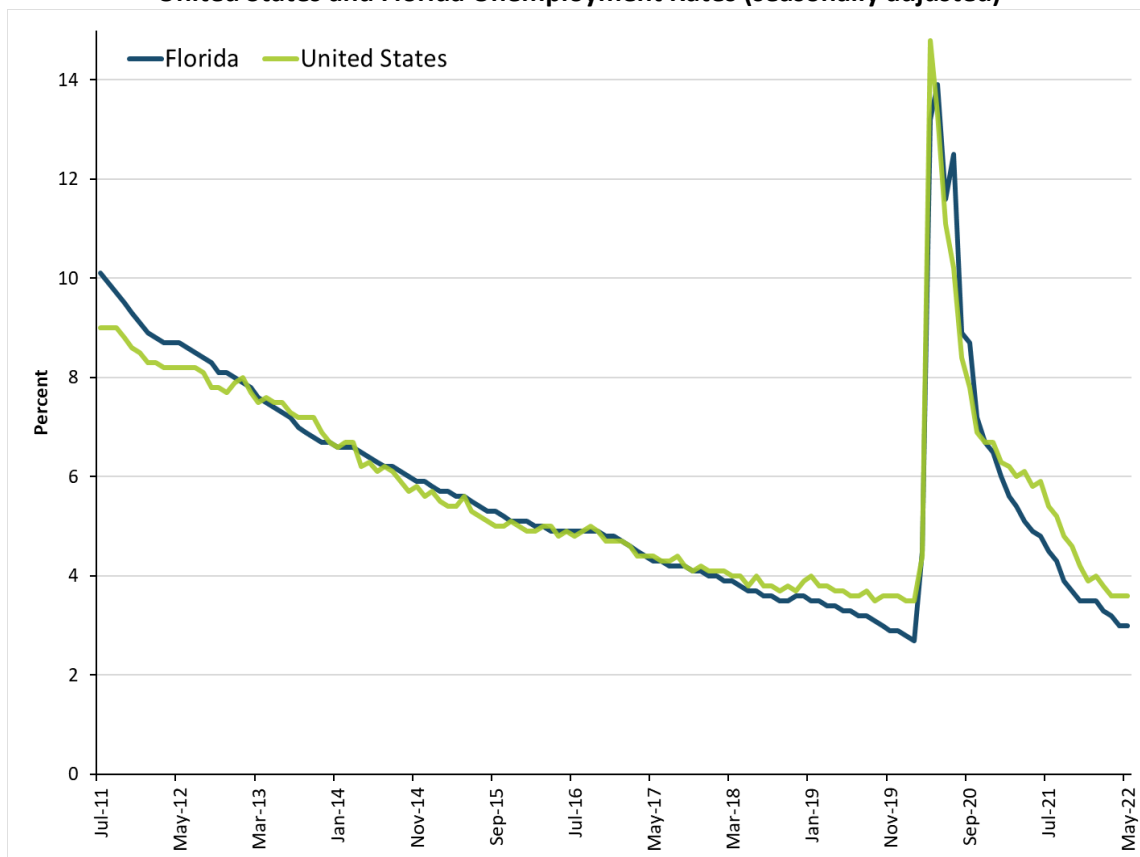
Florida's May Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.0 percent in May 2022, unchanged from the April 2022 rate, and down 1.9 percentage points from a year ago. There were 313,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,592,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 3.6 percent in May.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 9,299,100 in May 2022, an increase of 11,200 jobs (+0.1 percent) over the month. The state gained 468,100 jobs over the year, an increase of 5.3 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 4.5 percent over the year.

Florida's total nonagricultural and private sector employment surpassed the February 2020 (pre-pandemic) level in October 2021 and labor force surpassed the February 2020 level in June 2021.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,282,500 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back all jobs lost (+1,506,100 jobs).
- All ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in May.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+127,700 jobs, +11.7 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+110,000 jobs, +6.0 percent); professional and business services (+94,900 jobs, +6.6 percent); financial activities (+34,800 jobs, +5.6 percent); manufacturing (+25,300 jobs, +6.6 percent); education and health services (+23,700 jobs, +1.8 percent); other services (+21,200 jobs, +6.4 percent); construction (+13,500 jobs, +2.3 percent); information (+10,800 jobs, +7.9 percent); and total government (+8,600 jobs, +0.8 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In May 2022, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (1.5 percent), followed by St. Johns County (1.9 percent), and Gulf County, Okaloosa County, Nassau County and Wakulla County (2.0 percent each).
- Highlands County and Putnam County had the highest unemployment rate (3.6 percent each) in Florida in May 2022, followed by Citrus County and Hamilton County (3.5 percent each), and Hendry County and Sumter County (3.4 percent each).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In May 2022, 23 out of all 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+91,400 jobs, +7.3 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+75,300 jobs, +6.5 percent), and Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+68,700 jobs, +5.0 percent).
- One metro area in Florida experienced an over-the-year job loss: Sebring (-300 jobs, -1.2 percent)

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
