

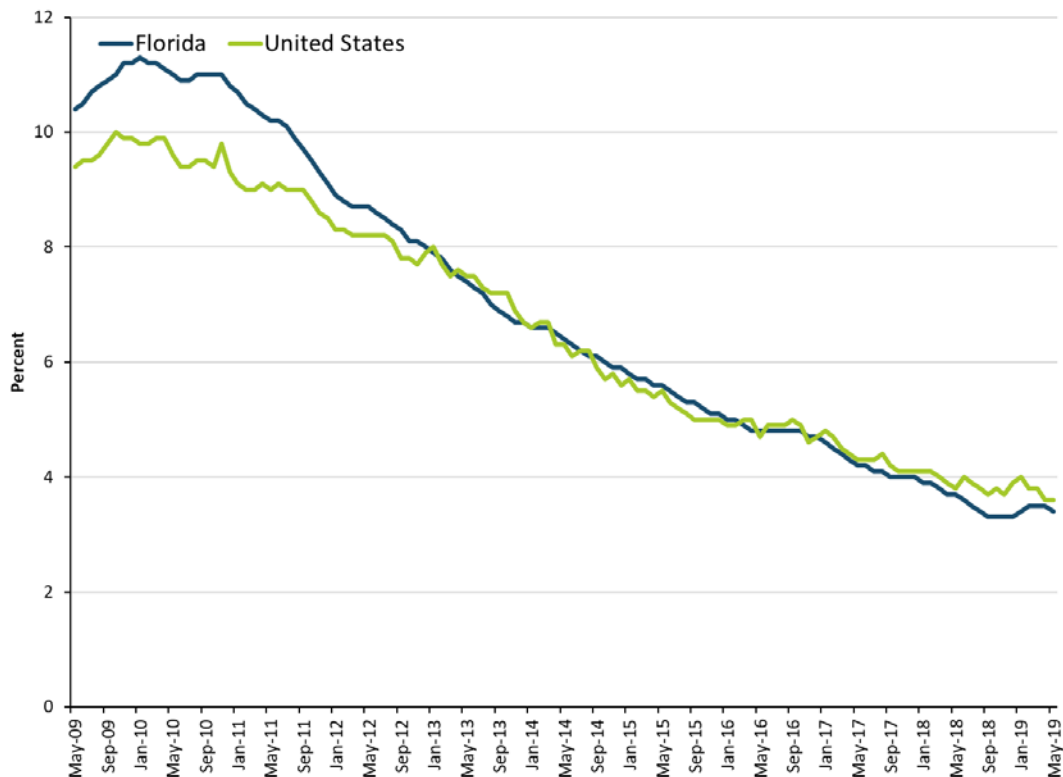
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Florida's May Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.4 percent in May 2019, down 0.1 percentage point from the revised April 2019 rate, and down 0.3 percentage point from a year ago. There were 353,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,331,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 3.6 percent in May.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,961,300 in May 2019, an increase of 17,000 jobs (+0.2 percent) over the month. The state gained 214,500 jobs over the year, an increase of 2.5 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.6 percent over the year. With the exception of September 2017, Florida's over-the-year job growth rate has exceeded the nation's rate since April 2012.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,961,300 in May 2019, up 214,500 jobs compared to a year ago. The industry gaining the most jobs was education and health services (+46,000 jobs, +3.5 percent).

Other industries gaining jobs over the year included professional and business services (+38,400 jobs, +2.8 percent); leisure and hospitality (+37,700 jobs, +3.1 percent); construction (+28,000 jobs, +5.2 percent); financial activities (+21,200 jobs, +3.7 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+19,900 jobs, +1.1 percent); manufacturing (+11,500 jobs, +3.1 percent); other services (+7,700 jobs, +2.2 percent); and government (+5,800 jobs, +0.5 percent).

- The one industry losing jobs was information (-1,600 jobs, -1.2 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In May 2019, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.1 percent), followed by St. Johns County and Okaloosa County (2.5 percent each), Walton County (2.6 percent), and Lafayette County (2.7 percent).
- Citrus County, Gulf County, Hardee County and Sumter County had the highest unemployment rate (4.6 percent) in Florida in May 2019, followed by Hendry County (4.5 percent), Highlands County (4.3 percent), and Hernando County (4.1 percent). In May 2019, Panhandle County unemployment rates reflect the continued impacts from Hurricane Michael.

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In May 2019, 23 out of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+40,600 jobs, +3.1 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+28,300 jobs, +2.4 percent), and Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+27,100 jobs, +2.0 percent).
- One metro area in Florida experienced an over-the-year job loss in May 2019, Panama City (-2,000 jobs, -2.3 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
