# High Impact Weather Threats For Thursday December 20, 2018

**Northeast Florida and Southeast Georgia** 



- River Flooding Continues, May be Extended by Next System
- Potential for Heavy Rainfall along with a line of strong storms this afternoon
  - Rainfall 1-2 inches SE GA, 2-3 inches NE FL... with locally heavier amounts.
  - May cause flooding on saturated ground, and persistent river flooding
  - Potential for a line of strong thunderstorms with strong wind gusts this afternoon across north-central Florida.
    - Tornado threat may exist, particularly from Marion Co to St. Johns Co. southeastward.
- Breezy conditions, especially Friday (gusts to 30 mph).


## River Flooding, Prolonged Flood Concerns


#### **Northeast Florida and Southeast Georgia**

- An intense storm system will affect our region through Friday.
  - Surface low will be much stronger, closer to our area.
  - Winds a few thousand feet above the ground will be 50-70 mph...leading to extreme vertical wind shear.
    - Will cause rapid storm motion.
  - Instability is the big question mark for potential severe storms.
    - All day rain minimizes threat of severe weather (like last Fri).
    - Break in rain ahead of storms greatly increases threat.

#### **Northeast Florida and Southeast Georgia**






Primary Threat Period for Our Area: 11am through 5pm.

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

Flood Watches Posted for NE Florida and Portions of SE Georgia










# Flood Watch on Thursday and Thursday Night





### **Threat Summary**

#### Northeast Florida and Southeast Georgia



- Closely monitor the latest weather conditions and forecasts on Thursday.
  - 1-2 inches of rain SE GA, 2-3 inches NE FL, with locally heavier amounts.
  - Likely to maintain river flooding concerns into next week.
- A line of strong t-storms possible in the afternoon across north-central FL.
  - Primary threat: 50-70 mph winds along bulges in the line.
  - Very strong vertical shear will make tornadoes possible, through greater threat appears to be Marion Co. to St. Johns Co. southeastward.
- Breezy conditions ahead of the line of storms this afternoon, and during the day Friday (wind gusts up to 30 mph).

Closely monitor the weather Today for potential tornado watches and severe weather warnings.
