
# Local Flooding Possible

- Elevated flooding potential continues through mid-week with the effects from Elsa.








### NE FL and SE GA Key Points

- Tropical Storm Elsa currently about 950 miles away from Jacksonville, FL and has slowed its WNW movement down to 14 mph
- Recent and forecast heavy rainfall could enhance the potential for flash, urban and river flooding for midweek with Elsa's current forecast track
- Potential risk of heavy rainfall, tropical storm force winds and storm surge across NE Florida & SE Georgia late Tuesday through Wednesday
