

NE FL & SE GA Key Points

Idalia is now forecast to intensify into a <u>major</u> <u>hurricane</u> before making landfall near the Florida Big Bend area Wednesday morning.



Local impacts will begin to deteriorate Tuesday afternoon/evening. A Hurricane Watch is in effect for areas along and just east of I-75 in Northeast Florida.

Tropical Storm Winds Likely, Hurricane Force Possible along I-75 / near I-10


Heavy Rainfall Flash Flooding lsolated Tornadoes

Idalia Heavy Rainal Totals

- Tropical Storm Idalia total rainfall estimates are 2 8 inches over northeast Florida & southeast Georgia.
- Locally higher totals possible, especially near the Suwannee River Valley & south central Georgia.
- Flash Flooding possible, especially in urban areas.
