Isolated To Scattered Strong to Severe T'Storms Today


- Ending across Se GA this morning
- Redeveloping along and East of U.S. Highway 301 this afternoon into early evening
- Hazards: Wind Gusts of 40-60 mph, Frequent Lightning Strikes, Small Hail & Heavy Downpours
- Moderate Rip Current Risk at All Area Beaches through the Weekend
- Rough Surf & High Risk of Deadly Rip Currents at All Area Beaches Next Week
