Program Statistics

- Sally's Safe Haven is open full-time, Tuesday thru Saturday each week
- Types of cases served:
 - Domestic Violence Only
- Domestic Violence and Dependency (largest number of families fall in this category)
 - Dependency Only

Program Statistics

- Currently serving 23 families with 23 25 supervised visits each week (6 families pending)
- 97 families have been served to date (1/15)
- 398 services provided to families to date (1/15)
- 121 referrals have been received primarily from Flagler Court Judges, Family Life Center, and CPC
