### Attention Voters: Florida Is A Closed Primary State

A closed Primary means you must be a registered voter in the party for which the Primary is being held. All registered voters, regardless of party affiliation, may vote the nonpartisan ballot and Universal Primary Contest. Deadline to register to vote or change your party affiliation: **July 22, 2024**

If you are registered as a **REPUBLICAN**, you will vote a Republican ballot which also includes all nonpartisan contests and the Universal Primary Contest.

If you are registered as a **DEMOCRAT**, you will vote a Democratic ballot which also includes all nonpartisan contests and the Universal Primary Contest.

**ALL REGISTERED VOTERS** regardless of political party affiliation may vote for nonpartisan contests and the Universal Primary Contest. **All voters who reside in the City of Palm Coast** may vote for the City races on this ballot.

#### Register To Vote:

Have you recently moved to Flagler County? Florida residents can use Online Voter Registration to register to vote or update their registration. You may also register to vote or update your registration by mail or in person. The registration deadline for new voters and party changes is **July 22, 2024**. #### Make A Plan To Vote:

There are three ways to vote in Florida. Any voter can choose to vote by mail, vote early, or vote on Election Day. Early voting locations and precinct changes are on the reverse side of this sample ballot. If you choose to vote on Election Day, you must vote in your assigned precinct location. Florida Law requires each voter to present both photo and signature identification at the polls. **Expired ID's and out of state ID's will not be accepted.**

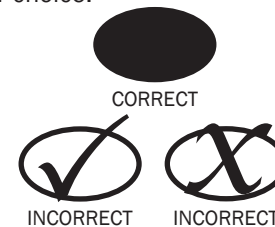

### Why are Primary Elections so important? These contests will be decided in this Primary!

There is one **Universal Primary Contest** this year which will be decided in the Primary. These candidates share the same political party affiliation and face no opposition in the General Election. All voters are eligible to vote for:

- **Board of County Commissioners, District 1**
- **School Board, District 3**
- **School Board, District 5**

County Commissioners and School Board Members are elected county-wide.

Nonpartisan contests with more than two candidates can be decided in a Primary if one candidate receives a majority of the vote (over 50%). All voters are eligible to vote for all nonpartisan contests. These are City offices for City of Palm Coast voters only.

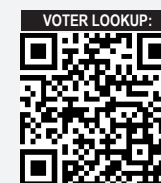

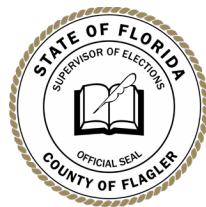
## OFFICIAL SAMPLE BALLOT

This is your Official Sample Ballot for the Primary Election to be held on August 20, 2024. This sample ballot is being provided to you in advance of the election to give you the opportunity to study the candidates. Please take this sample ballot with you when voting in person and use it as a reference.

Did you know that several local contests will be decided in this election? Your vote counts! **County Commission District 1, School Board District 3, and School Board District 5** will be decided in this Primary Election. All registered voters in the county may vote for these contests, including voters without a party affiliation and those who are registered with a minor party. Voter turnout for Primary elections in Flagler County averages less than 30%, despite the fact that **every voter may cast a ballot** in these elections. All voters, regardless of political party affiliation, are eligible to vote for nonpartisan contests, which include all City of Palm Coast offices up for election.

You may choose to vote either by mail, during early voting, or at your assigned precinct on Election Day. This sample ballot shows the ballot for the entire county, not just your precinct. Your representative districts, precinct number, and polling location are shown on your Voter Information Card. If you have moved since the last time you voted and did not update your registration, please call the Elections Office and change your address over the phone.

## Vote On Election Day

Election Day voters must vote in their assigned polling place. Polls are always open from 7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

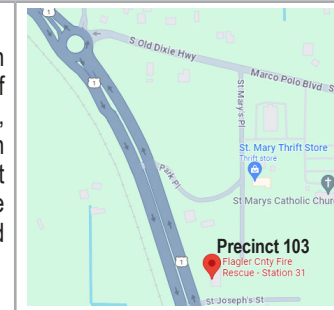
If you voted early in a previous election and now wish to vote on Election Day, the early voting site may not be your assigned precinct. Florida law states you must vote in the precinct where you live. Any voter who refuses to go to their assigned precinct on Election Day will be issued a provisional ballot. **VOTERS AFFECTED: AREAS OF UNINCORPORATED BUNNELL, PLANTATION BAY, EAGLE ROCK ESTATES, KORONA, FAVORETTA, AND RIMA RIDGE**

This change will affect voters who live in Plantation Bay, Eagle Rock Estates, areas of unincorporated Bunnell, Korona, Favoretta, and Rima Ridge in the southeastern portion of Flagler County who previously voted at Community Baptist Church on Old Dixie Highway in Bunnell. The previous location did not renew their polling location contract.

## Election Security

Voter confidence in the electoral process is a contributing factor to participation and turnout. Our physical security procedures and cybersecurity defenses protect your vote. Elections in Flagler County are fair, accurate, and secure.

Our nation's elections were designated as critical infrastructure by the Department of Homeland Security in January 2017. This important designation provides local election officials many resources, including access to the latest cybersecurity intelligence information. Your local Supervisor of Elections Office has developed a strong partnership with the DHS to improve our security protections.

Transparency is important now more than ever. You are invited to learn about our voting system equipment, network security, ballot custody controls, voter eligibility, and more.

## Vote Early

Any registered voter may choose to vote during early voting at one of four locations in the county.

## Vote-By-Mail

Any registered voter may request their ballot by mail. To request a mail ballot, scan the QR code or call the Elections Office at (386) 313-4170. All voted mail ballots must be received by the Elections Office by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

**A postmark does not extend this deadline.**

Drop boxes (secure ballot intake stations) for mail ballots will be available at all early voting sites during polling hours. Ballots can also be returned directly to the Supervisor of Elections office in Bunnell. The mail ballot request deadline is **August 8, 2024**.

### Election Security Quick Facts



The local voter registration database and vote tabulation database are hosted on separate servers. Our tabulation server is held in a closed network with no Internet access.



In order to vote by mail, a citizen must be registered to vote and provide ID at the time of registering. The signature on each returned ballot certificate must match the voter's signature on file.



Each one of the thousands of mail ballot envelope signatures are reviewed by trained Elections Office staff, a process which takes many hours. Each mail ballot signature is reviewed and verified as a match before a ballot can be counted.
